

he UK Government has rejected a call for a second referendum on European Union membership in a petition that was signed by more than 4.1 million people following the Brexit vote.

It was the most-signed Government petition since the process was introduced in 2011.

However in an official reply, the Foreign Office said 33 million people had had their say and "the decision must be respected".

"Operation Zarb-e-Azb is the most successful operation in the history of Pakistan. America has not properly helped Pakistan in this complex campaign. Rather, Pakistan army, with its own resources, has won this war against terrorists. It has destroyed arms factories and hideouts of terrorists from the soil of Pakistan. After fleeing from Pakistan, terrorists have found safe havens in Afghanistan. There are 78 border crossing points, which can be used by terrorists to enter and launch havoc in Pakistan. Pakistan has blocked most of the entry points of terrorists. In this operation 19,000 intelligence based operations have been carried out across the country and 1,200 terrorists have been eliminated in Karachi alone. Local people of terrorists hit areas have given sacrifices, which must be recognized. It is the time to resettle the IDPs to their homes." The job is not yet finished and that there is still work to be done - including improving the border management mechanism with Afghanistan.

British High Commissioner to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Thomas Drew CMG presents credentials to President Mamnoon Hussain

Britain appoints new High Commissioner

he new British High Commissioner to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Thomas Drew CMG has been appointed by British government who has presented his credentials to President Mamnoon Hussain at a ceremony at the Presidential Palace in Islamabad. Mr. Drew arrived in Pakistan in February this year, succeeding Mr. Philip Barton CMG OBE.

Speaking after the ceremony, Thomas Drew CMG, the British High Commissioner to Pakistan, said, "It is a huge privilege to be working here in Pakistan and to be leading one of Britain's largest diplomatic missions. Nearly ten years ago, I moved to Pakistan for the first time, to be the Political Counselor in the British High Commission. I became a great friend of the country and its people. I feel a great sense of energy at coming back here. I am energised at seeing old friends, by the prospect of discovering more of the beautiful country and, most of all, by the prospect of doing work which is so important for both our countries."

"Pakistan matters to the UK and, I like to think, the UK matters to Pakistan, for each other's security, for regional stability and for each other's prosperity. Central to that are the 1.5 million British people of Pakistani origin who have made the UK their home," he further stated.



Theresa May, the new premier who has taken charge at one of the most turbulent times in UK's recent political history has been the Member of Parliament for Maidenhead since 1997. She has a very strong political history. Theresa Mary May worked for the Bank of England from 1977 until 1983 and from 1985 until 1997 at the Association for Payment Clearing Services. She also served as a councilor for the London Borough of Merton's Durnsford Ward. Failing to be elected to the House of Commons in 1992 and 1994, she was elected MP for Maidenhead in the 1997 general election. Having entered Parliament, May became a member of William Hague's frontbench Opposition team, as Shadow Spokesman for Schools, Disabled People and Women during the time span of 1998 to June 1999. May served in a number of roles in the Shadow Cabinets of William Hague, Jain Duncan Smith, Michael Howard, and David Cameron, including Shadow Leader of the House of Commons and Shadow Work and Pensions Secretary. She was also the Chairman of the Conservative Party from 2002 until 2003. In June 2004 she was moved to become Shadow Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sports. David Cameron appointed her Shadow Leader of the House of Commons in December 2005 after his accession to the leadership. In January 2009 May was made Shadow Secretary of State for Work and Pensions. After the formation of the Coalition Government following the 2010 general elections in UK, May was chosen Home Secretary and Minister for Women and Equalities, giving up the later role in 2012. She was reappointed after the Conservative victory in the 2015 general election and went on to become the longest-serving Home Secretary. As Home Secretary, May was also the member of the National Security Council.

The major breakthrough Brexit was confirmed after UK votes to leave EU, though later on a petition was signed by around 4.1 million people calling for another EU vote which was rejected by the Government saying that it was time for UK to leave EU and ensure the best outcome for its citizens.

A referendum, in which every individual of voting age took part - was held on Thursday 23 June, to decide whether the UK should leave or remain in the European Union. The voting turned out to be the highest in the UK's history with a turnout of 71.8% and 30 million people voting. 52% people voted in favor of UK leaving the EU, while 48% people voted against it. Soon after the results were announced, President Cameroon announced his resignation after spending six years in office saying that "The will of the British people is an instruction that must be delivered."

The former prime minister campaigned firmly in the divisive referendum on Britain's relationship with the EU, appearing at hundreds of public events and gatherings up and down the country to argue that Brexit would be an act of "economic self-harm". "But the British people made a different decision to follow a different path. UK has now to negotiate the terms of Britain's exit from EU and Cameron left it for the new prime minister to negotiate the terms of Britain's exit from and to trigger article 50 of the Lisbon treaty, which begins the formal process of withdrawal. David Cameron will continue on as a Member of Parliament.

Following the resignation of David Cameron on 24 June 2016 after EU referendum, May announced her candidacy for the leadership of the Conservative Party and quickly emerged as the front-runner. She won the first ballot of Conservative MPs on 5 July by a significant margin, and two days later won the votes



of 199 MPs, going forward to face a vote of Conservative Party members in a contest with Andrea Leadsom. Leadsom's withdrawal from the election on 11 July led to May's appointment as leader the same day. She was appointed Prime Minister two days later.

May identifies as a One-Nation Conservative and is characterized as a liberal conservative. She made her first speech as British Prime minister on July 13th, outside 10 Downing Street. The new prime minister made a centrist appeal for unity in the face of the divisions that came to the foreground after Britain's vote to leave the European Union. She pledged to stand up against the privileged few and fight the burning injustice. She mentioned that Cameroon's true legacy is not about the economy, but about social justice. From the introduction of same-sex marriage, to taking people on low wages out of income tax

altogether. She admired his leadership saying that his government stabilized the economy, reduced the budget deficit, and helped more people into work than ever before. David Cameron has led a One Nation government and it is in that spirit that I also plan to lead. She specifically mentioned that the full title of my party is the Conservative and Unionist Party and that word unionist is very important to me as she wouldn't be folding for a second referendum for Scottish Independence.

Referring to Brexit, Prime Minister May added that we are living through an important moment in our country's history. Following the referendum, we face a time of great national change. And I know because we're Great Britain we will rise to the challenge. As we leave the European Union we will forge a bold new positive role for ourselves in the world and we will make Britain a country that works not for a privileged few but for every one of us. That will be the mission of the Government I lead and together we will build a better Britain.

Though it is a time of great national challenge for Great Britain, it seems obvious that the new enthusiastic premier is willing to take the challenge up-front and lead the nation towards greater prosperity following the footsteps of David Cameroon with her leadership.





Government rejects second EU referendum petition signed by 4.1 million

'We must now prepare for the process to exit the EU,' the Government says

he Government has rejected a call for a second referendum on European Union membership in a petition that was signed by more than 4.1 million people following the Brexit vote.

It was the most-signed Government petition since the process was introduced in 2011.

However in an official reply, the Foreign Office said 33 million people had had their say and "the decision must be respected".

"We must now prepare for the process to exit the EU," it said.

The petition, which was set up by a Brexit



supporter before the referendum was held, had called for the Government to annul the results if the Remain or Leave vote won by less than 60 per cent on a turnout of less than 75 per cent.

Government petitions which reach over 100,000 signatures must be considered for debate in parliament.

The Foreign Office said: "The EU Referendum Act received Royal Assent in December 2015. The Act was scrutinised and debated in Parliament during its passage and agreed by both the House of Commons and the House of Lords. The Act set out the terms under which the referendum would take place, including provisions for setting the date, franchise and the question that would appear on the ballot paper. The Act did not set a threshold for the result or for minimum turnout.

"As the Prime Minister made clear in his statement to the House of Commons on 27 June, the referendum was one of the biggest democratic exercises in British history with over 33 million people having their say.

"The Prime Minister and Government have been clear that this was a once-in-a-generation vote and, as the Prime Minister has said, the decision must be respected. We must now prepare for the process to exit the EU and the Government is committed to ensuring the best possible outcome for the British people in the negotiations."

In the wake of the Brexit vote, the petition was shared widely on social media by Remain supporters. As the number of signatories soared, the petition's original author, Leave activist William Oliver Healey, disowned it, saying his opinions on the need for a high turnout and high level of support for one side had been "hijacked" by EU supporters.

The Government's decision will come as a blow to those who hoped to find a parliamentary means of stopping Britain's withdrawal from the bloc.

However, calls for a second referendum on the terms of Britain's departure from the EU are gathering pace. Four out of 10 people would like to see a second referendum before Britain leaves the EU, according to an opinion poll for The Independent.

The survey of 2,000 people by ORB found that 40 per cent agree that there should be a referendum on the exit deal that the Government negotiates, and that the UK should seek to Remain in the EU if the public rejects the terms.

Such a course was supported by 12 per cent of people who voted Leave last month. A second vote was backed by 68 per cent of people who supported Remain last month.

Jeremy Hunt, the Health Secretary, is among a number of MPs backing a referendum on the exit terms. Lawyers have also said MPs must vote to repeal the 1972 European Communities Act, under which the UK joined the EU.









Who is Sadiq Khan =

he new mayor did not have a privileged start in life. He was one of eight children born to Pakistani immigrants, a bus driver and a seamstress, on a south London housing

From an early age, he showed a firm resolves to defy the odds in order to win success for himself and the causes important to him.

That resolve has won him the biggest personal mandate in the UK, a job with wide-ranging powers over London and with enormous emotional significance for him.

Some question whether he has the experience or record of good judgement necessary for the







role.

He insists he is there to represent all Londoners and to tackle inequality in the capital, and now he has the chance to prove it.

Sadiq Aman Khan born on 8 October 1970 and is a British Labour Party politician and now the Mayor-elect of London since May 2016. He is also a Member of Parliament (MP) for Tooting. Ideologically, he is situated on the moderate social democratic wing of the party.

Born in London to a working-class British Pakistani family, Khan gained a degree in law at the University of North London. He subsequently began work as a solicitor specialising in human rights. Khan was a councillor in the London Borough of Wands worth from 1994 to 2006.

In 2008 he was appointed Minister of State for Communities by Prime Minister Gordon Brown, becoming the second British Pakistani to serve in government. Khan later served as Minister of State for Transport. He joined the Shadow Cabinet of Ed Miliband as Shadow Secretary of State for Justice and Shadow Lord Chancellor in 2010. On 16 January 2013 he was also appointed Shadow Minister for London; on 11 May 2015 he resigned from the shadow cabinet to seek nomination as the Labour Party's mayoral candidate and won the candidacy on 11 September 2015.

Khan was born at St George's Hospital in Tooting, South London, and the fifth of eight children (seven sons and a daughter) in family of Pakistani immigrants.

His grandparents migrated from India to Pakistan following the partition of India in 1947, and his parents migrated to England from Pakistan shortly before Khan was born. His late father, Amanullah Khan, worked as a bus driver for over 25 years; his mother, Sehrun, was a seamstress

From his earliest years, Khan worked, "I was surrounded by my mum and dad working all the time, and so as soon as I could get a job, I got a job. I got a paper round, a Saturday job - some summers I laboured on a building



site." The family continues to send money to relatives in Pakistan, "because we're blessed being in this country."

Khan and his siblings grew up in a threebedroom council flat on the Henry Prince Estate in Earl's field. He attended Fircroft Primary School and Ernest Bevin College, a



local comprehensive. Khan studied science and mathematics at A-level, in the hope of eventually qualifying as a dentist. A teacher recommended that he read law, as he had an argumentative personality. The teacher's suggestion, along with the television programme LA Law, inspired Khan to do so.

He entered the University of North London to study law.

He was a visiting lecturer at the University of North London, and a Governor of South Thames FE College. Vice-Chairman of the Legal Action Group (LAG), Khan also served as Chairman of the civil liberties pressure group Liberty (NCCL) for three years.

Khan married Saadiva Ahmed, a fellow solicitor, in 1994 and has two daughters, Anisah (born 1999) and Ammarah (born 2001). A keen follower of sport, he supports Liverpool F.C. in football and Surrey County Cricket Club in cricket.


He serves as a Governor of Fircroft School and of Gatton School, both in Tooting.

Khan also served as Chairman of the Fabian Society, remaining on its Executive Committee. In 2009 he won the Jenny Jeger Award (Best Fabian Pamphlet) for his writing "Fairness not Favours: How to re-connect with British Muslims". He also edited the Fabian Essay Collection Our London: the Capital beyond 2015. In January 2013 and 2015, Khan was nominated for the Politician of the Year award at the British Muslim Awards. He later won the award in February 2016.

he British Labour party's Sadiq Khan has been elected as London mayor by comfortably outrunning of his nearest rival.

The Labour party's leader Jeremy Corbyn congratulated Khan on his victory on evening. Khan picked up 44 percent of first preference votes to Conservative Zac Goldsmith's 35 percent. The Labour candidate then picked up enough second preference votes to cross the 50 percent threshold.

Mr Khan is the city's first Muslim mayor, after beating Tory Zac Goldsmith by 1, 310,143 votes to 994,614.

The result bolsters leader Jeremy Corbyn after Labour were beaten into third in Scotland by the Tories and lost some English councillors.

In Scotland, the SNP said it would form a minority government after winning its third election in a row.

First Minister Nicola Sturgeon is celebrating what she said was an "emphatic" victory, her first as party leader, after the SNP emerged as the largest party at Holyrood with 63 seats, ahead of the Conservatives on 31 and Labour on 24.

But she played down talk of another independence referendum after falling short by two seats of an overall majority.

In Wales, Labour remains as the largest party,

with 29 out of 60 seats, but was denied a majority as Plaid Cymru and UKIP both made notable gains. Counting is continuing in Northern Ireland.

Mr Khan's victory ends eight years of

Conservative control of City Hall. The former Labour MP and minister, 45, becomes London's third mayor after Ken Livingstone and Boris Johnson.

In his victory speech, Mr Khan referred to his humble origins on a council estate and said he had never imagined that "someone like me could be elected as mayor of London," promising to be a mayor "for all Londoners". He said the campaign had not been without controversy, but added: "I am so proud that

London has today chosen hope over fear".

Mr Khan took 1,310,143 votes after second preferences were taken into account, beating Conservative Zac Goldsmith into second place on 994,614, a margin of victory of 13.6%. His tally gave him the largest personal mandate of any politician in UK history.

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn led congratulations on Twitter using the hashtag YesWeKhan and telling the new mayor: "Can't wait to work with you to create a London that is fair for all".

Mr Khan distanced himself from Mr Corbyn during the campaign, pledging to freeze fares on the capital's transport network and build more affordable housing, but also promising to champion business and cut taxes on enterprise. Mr Goldsmith's sister Jemima has criticised how his campaign was run, while former Conservative Cabinet minister Baroness Warsi called it an "appalling dog whistle campaign".

Ms Goldsmith tweeted: "Sad that Zac's campaign did not reflect who I know him to be - an eco-friendly, independent-minded politician with integrity."

She also congratulated Mr Khan, calling him a "great example to young Muslims".

David Cameron's former director of strategy Steve Hilton described the Goldsmith campaign as "really weird," claiming it had brought back the "nasty party label to the Conservative Party".

World leaders pledge to tackle corruption

nternational politicians and diplomats vowed to open up corporate records, quash money laundering and end bribery in a bid to stamp out what Prime Minister David Cameron called the global "cancer" of corruption.

But concrete results of a London anticorruption summit on Thursday were mixed, with many countries failing to commit to the toughest actions sought by Cameron.

Heads of state, ministers and diplomats from some 40 countries said they would "uncover corruption wherever it exists, and to pursue and punish those who perpetrate, facilitate or are complicit in it."

The governments made a plethora of promises: to fight bribery in public contracting and the oil and gas sector, to return stolen assets to their owners and to clean up international sports.

Firm commitments, however, varied widely. Just six countries, including Britain, Nigeria and

Afghanistan, agreed to publish registers of who really owns companies in their territories — a key goal of anti-corruption groups. Six more said they would "explore doing so."

The United States did not make that commitment, although Secretary of State John Kerry told the conference that a "pandemic" of corruption "is as much of an enemy, because it destroys nation states, as some of





the extremists we're fighting." Mr Kerry said this month President Obama's administration had announced a set of financial regulations designed to force companies to disclose more information about their owners.

Meeting at London's elegant Lancaster House drew politicians from around the world, including the presidents of Afghanistan, Nigeria and Colombia, as well as representatives of financial institutions and civil-society organizations.

Buhari said he wasn't seeking an apology from Cameron over the remarks, but wanted something "tangible" — the return of plundered Nigerian assets held in British banks. He told the meeting that "corruption is one of the greatest enemies of our time."

Ghani said corruption was fueling his country's political violence, and the fight against wrongdoing "should not be a fashion that is discarded with the next set of elections."

There were some notable omissions on the



conference guest list. Delegates discussed corruption in sport, but soccer governing body FIFA, wracked by a vast bribery scandal, is not at the meeting.

British-linked tax havens including Bermuda and the Cayman Islands were represented at the summit — but others, such as the British Virgin Islands, were not.

Cameron has said that Britain's Crown dependencies and overseas territories have agreed to draw up beneficial ownership registers and share the information with U.K. law-enforcement bodies. Jersey, the Cayman Islands, Bermuda, Anguilla and the Isle of Man agreed to join a group of several dozen nations that share such information with one another. Cameron said Britain's overseas tax havens were now "ahead of many developed states" in openness.

But charities and opposition politicians say Britain must go farther and insist that the territories' ownership registers are made public.

Allan Bell, chief minister of the Isle of Man — a British Crown dependency in the Irish Sea — said there wouldn't be real progress unless the United States made its own tax havens, such as Delaware, more open.

Robert Palmer of anti-corruption group Global Witness said the results of the meeting were mixed, but positive.

"The tide is definitely moving toward transparency, and the tax havens and the U.S. are being left behind," he said.

The Global Forum for Asset Recovery will bring together governments and law enforcement agencies to discuss returning assets to Nigeria, Ukraine, Sri Lanka and Tunisia.

The meeting will be held in the US next year,

co-hosted with the UK, and supported by the UN and the World Bank.

David Cameron made the announcement at a global anti-corruption summit in London.

It was being hailed as the first of its kind, bringing together governments, business and other organizations.

Organizations such as the World Bank, OECD and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) also attended the summit.

Tax havens with UK links, including Bermuda and the Cayman Islands were represented, but the British Virgin Islands was not at the summit. Neither was FIFA, football's governing body, which is at the centre of a large bribery scandal.

The British Virgin Islands has not yet signed up to the automatic sharing of it register, but the Prime Minister defended Britain's overseas territories saying they had come a long way.

Jersey, the Cayman Islands, Bermuda, Anguilla and the Isle of Man have agreed to join a group of several dozen nations that share their registers with one another.

Alan Bell, the chief minister of the Isle of Man, which is a Crown dependency, said progress could not be made unless the US did more and tackled its own tax havens such as the state of Delaware.

Mr Cameron said they were looking for greater transparency and were introducing a code of conduct for professionals such as accountants, solicitors and estate agents who enabled corruption, either knowingly or unknowingly.

He wanted to see how assets could be recovered, with legislation being introduced in 21 additional countries.

But critics say the UK's overseas territories and Crown dependencies also need to be more transparent.

adame Tussauds is a wax museum in London with branches in a number of major cities. It was founded by wax sculptor Marie Tussaud. It used to be known as "Madame Tussaud's"; the apostrophe is no longer used. Madame Tussauds is a major tourist attraction in London, displaying famous waxworks.

Madame Tussaud's wax museum has now grown to become a major tourist attraction in London, incorporating (until 2010) the London Planetarium in its west wing. Today's wax figures at Tussauds include historical and royal figures, film stars, sports stars and famous murderers. Known as "Madame Tussauds" museums (no apostrophe), they



are owned by a leisure company called Merlin Entertainments, following the acquisition of The Tussauds Group in May 2007. In an era of virtual reality, interactive Wiis and 3D TVs, it is difficult to imagine a more anachronistic attraction than a crowded dark room peopled with static wax models. But Madame Tussauds is more popular than ever. Almost every month, a new celebrity is added to the waxen lineup. Last year it reported visitor numbers up by 10% across its attractions with a 16% jump in profits to £239m.

Born in Strasbourg in 1761, Marie Tussaud model-making under Dr Philippe Curtius, a doctor who became highly skilled at making anatomical models from wax. They moved to Paris and she created figures for a waxwork exhibition, narrowly escaped guillotine in the French Revolution, and ended up making death masks of guillotine victims. Tussaud inherited Curtius's models and her travelling exhibition of waxworks became the touring newspaper of the day, providing vivid impressions of contemporary events, particularly the revolution, in a time before photographs. When she settled in Britain and opened a museum in Baker Street in 1835, her most popular exhibit was the "chamber of horrors"

Number of UK landlords rises to 1.75 million



HMRC data shows 7% rise in 2013-14 but figure likely to be higher after recent buy-to-let lending surge

The rapid pace of growth in buy-to-let investments has been illustrated by new figures showing the number of landlords rising by 7% in 2013-14 to reach 1.75 million. Figures from estate agent ludlowthompson based on data from HM Revenue & Customs showed 1.75 million people declared income from property during the year, up from 1.63

million in 2012-13, as they chased returns on their cash that outstripped other investments. Landlords banked a combined £14.2bn in net income from their rental properties during the year, up from £13.1bn the year before.

The HMRC figures are the latest data on landlord numbers, which are likely to have increased significantly since. Buy-to-let lending has boomed as cheap mortgages and rising rents, combined with low savings rates,

have made property attractive to investors. Ludlowthompson said that over the past year the price of property in London had risen by 13.9% — a period when the FTSE 100 fell by 8.8%.

Changes to stamp duty introduced on 1 April increased the upfront cost of buying property, adding a 3% surcharge on second homes. From 2017, the ongoing cost will start to rise for landlords who pay the higher rate of tax as relief on mortgage repayments starts to be withdrawn.

The firm said the surge in borrowing by landlords ahead of the stamp duty change suggested property remained popular: figures from mortgage lenders showed a 226.1% year-on-year rise in the number of purchase loans taken out by landlords in March. The chairman of ludlowthompson, Stephen Ludlow, said: "Investors continue to be drawn to the buy-to-let market as the returns routinely outperform those of other investments.

"Buy-to-let investments are a highly popular alternative to the volatility investors often risk when investing in the stock market."

The National Landlords Association has suggested that investors will make some changes to mitigate the new rules. It said last week that the profits of six in 10 landlords would fall after the removal of some tax relief. In order to recover costs, one in five landlords could stop renting to higher-risk tenants, such as those on housing benefit.

It said the removal of mortgage interest relief, combined with the government's benefits freeze and the fall in social housing, would "create a perfect storm whereby some tenants will struggle to find any sort of housing at all". Courtesy to the guardian

ever ever before has Indian Kashmir reacted so violently to the death of a person as it has to the killing of Burhan Muzaffar Wani by security forces on July 8. This 22-year-old Hizbul Mujahedeen commander had become an iconic figure in the Valley. Reportedly, a decision to kill him was taken two months ago at the highest level. Soon after Burhan Wani was killed, violent incidents initiated in the Indian held Kashmir and almost 39 people were killed and more then 3000 people were injured. These injuries include children less then six years of age. More then 200 people have been reported to lost their eye sight due to the firing of a very specific pellet bullet. Burhan Wani's funeral was attended by thousands of people, and despite restrictions, the funeral venue was so crowded there was no space to conduct funeral prayers.

Wani, who was a 22 year young boy, is largely attributed with reviving and legitimizing the image of militancy in Muslim-majority Indianadministered Kashmir. He was born to a highly-educated upper-class Kashmiri family. It is believed that he was driven to militancy

at the age of 15, after his brother and he were beaten up by police for no reason. The issue of Kashmir has not been resolved by India and Pakistan since their independence and after 69 years of struggle, now Kashmiri youth has stood up for its rights. They have been joining the extremist organizations to

fight against the Indian brutality and speak up for their rights. Wani's video messages, which would often go viral in Kashmir, were on the topics of Indian injustice and the need for young people to stand up to oppression. In his last video he had warned local police of the consequences if they continued to resist the







movement. India considered Wani a terrorist, but for many locals he represented the spirit and political aspirations of a new Kashmiri generation which was very satisfying for their movement. Indian officials have admitted that he was instrumental in persuading local boys to take up arms in the state. He was known for posting videos on social media which found some appeal in the younger Muslim population of Kashmir. In one of his videos he appealed youth to join Hizbul Mujahedeen and is considered to have recruited at least 30 young boys from South Kashmir. In a video released in June 2016, he assured the Amaranth pilgrims that they won't be attacked by the militants. In addition, he also threatened to attack Sainik colonies because of his belief that it was an attempt to change the demography of the valley. He also opposed separate colonies for Kashmiri Pundits saying that they can come live on their own land but an "Israel-like" situation won't be allowed in Kashmir.

Adviser to the Prime Minister on Foreign Affairs, Mr. Sartai Aziz, has addressed letters to the UN Secretary-General, the President of the UN Security Council, the Secretary-General of the OIC, and the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights to express Pakistan's serious concern on the alarming situation in the Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IOK) drawing attention to the brutal killings of innocent civilians and grave violations of the fundamental human rights of the Kashmiris by the occupying Indian security forces. The Adviser noted that in these times of democracy and accountability, the international community, led by the United Nations, cannot remain passive to the callous behaviour and grave violations of human rights by India in the Occupied Jammu and Kashmir over the last many decades. The letters recalled that the United Nations has a special and permanent responsibility with regard to the Jammu and Kashmir dispute, which remains on the agenda of the UN Security Council and is yet to be resolved in accordance with its relevant resolutions. The current situation in Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir is in fact the result of the continued denial by India of the right to self-determination of the Kashmiri people through a free and fair plebiscite under the UN auspices that was assured by the United Nations in its multiple resolutions.

On the other hand, Indian foreign ministry expressed its dismay over what it called the continued attempts by Pakistan to interfere in its internal matter. It is a matter of grief concern that the international community and world leaders are not initiating any serious steps towards the resolution of Kashmir issue. United Nations has not been very active regarding its role, despite the passed resolutions since many decades, no serious practical steps have been taken and neither has the world community asked Indian to put an stop to their brutal activities across the occupied area. It has been decades that Kashmiris have continued to lose their lives in the struggle of freedom and right for self determination. It is very sad on part of Pakistan as well, that Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman who has been the chairman of Kashmir issue could not make any significant progress or lobby for the Kashimir issue in the international

community. Pakistan needs to pay very serious attention towards this issue as now it cannot continue to further intensify its relations with India over the Kashmir issue after a continued struggle against terrorism inside the country and on its borders. Kashmir is an integral part of Pakistan and its movement of freedom will be continued to support by the Pakistanis.

International media and pressure groups also needs to highlight and focus on the brutality of Indian forces in the Indian occupied Kashmir and raise their voice in their group of sphere, the International community, United Nations and Organization of Islamic countries. 

Alvarez surprised **eVeryone**

Amir Khan knocked out by Canelo Álvarez

anelo Alvarez defended his World Boxing Council middleweight belt by knocking out Amir Khan with a vicious right hand late in the sixth round of their Las Vegas title fight.

The 25-year-old hard-hitting Mexican dropped Khan with a straight right over a passive left jab that sent the Briton crumpling to the canvas with just 23 seconds left in the round.

The back of Khan's head bounced off the deck, prompting his corner to rush to his aid as he lay motionless for a couple of minutes. Khan eventually got up and went to his corner.

"Many people talk about my power but I have many more qualities in the ring and people saw that," Alvarez said. "I like to surprise everyone." The savage end to what was supposed to be the biggest fight of Khan's career will undoubtedly strengthen the notion that he has a soft chin. It was a shocking end to what had been a close fight up to that point.

The 29-year-old Khan, who moved up two weight classes to face the bigger champ, started strong and even won the first couple of rounds before Alvarez worked his way into the fight at the brand new T-Mobile Arena.

"He's very fast. So I knew it would be complicated at the beginning," Alvarez said.

"But I knew the time would come to my favor and you saw that."

Alvarez is now mandated by the WBC to fight unbeaten two-belt champ Gennady Golovkin, who was ringside.

At Friday's weigh-in, both boxers scaled 155 pounds, bang on the catch-weight limit.



Many Mexicans were in Las Vegas to celebrate the Cinco de Mayo festival weekend, meaning the majority of the crowd was on Alvarez's side. There was also a vocal contingent of Khan's fans, who made the trip from Britain for the title fight. Also in attendance at ringside were boxing legends Evander Holyfield, Roberto Duran and Roy Jones as well as fight promoter Oscar de la Hoya.
