

akistan is not US' hired gun anymore said by Prime Minister Imran Khan in his first foreign interview to the Washington Post. "I would never want to have a relationship where Pakistan is treated like a hired gun — given money to fight someone else's war. We should never put ourselves in this position again. It not only cost us human lives, devastation of our tribal areas, but it also cost us our dignity. We would like a proper relationship with the U.S.". In a wide-ranging interview with the top US newspaper, the premier said he wanted a 'proper relationship' with Washington.

Trump, in a letter to PM Khan couple of days ago, had sought Islamabad's help in ending Afghan conflict and bringing Taliban leadership to the negotiating table.

Defending ties with Beijing, the PM said our relationship with China is not one-dimensional. It's a trade relationship between two countries and we wanted a similar relationship with

opted for the US bloc. Being member of SEATO and CENTO Pakistan extended full support to the US. But the ongoing Afghan campaign and the price that Pakistani people and armed forces are paying for siding with USA cannot be easily dismissed. No doubt the US is a great country but Pakistan in its own right is an important country that may not be taken lightly. Cooperative rather than adversarial relationship is likely to produce win win situation for US, Pakistan, region and the world.

Great expectations were pinned with the opening of Kartarpur Corridor – the step which was also seen with great interest the world over. The initiative taken by Prime Minister Imran Khan was dubbed as the one which will serve the purpose of promoting people-topeople contacts and reducing tension between Pakistan and India. However, within a few days, both the Indian media and its leaders have started creating uncertainty and doubts about the prospects of this initiative. This has once again exposed the Indian anti-Pakistan posture. Pakistan has always shown positivity to improve relations with India and as pointed out by Prime Minister Imran Khan in his recent interaction with the Indian media, the other side will have also to reciprocate to move forward to address longstanding issues.

The discussion covered a wide range of bilateral, regional and international issues of mutual interests.

Prime Minister Imran Khan congratulated Prime Minister Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad on his electoral victory and commended the smooth and peaceful transition of power from Dr. Mahathir Mohamad also congratulated the previous government. Prime Minister Tun Prime Minister Imran Khan on his recent





resounding election as the new Prime Minister of Pakistan and wished Pakistan greater progress in its national development under the new government.

Both leaders acknowledged the long history of close cooperation between both countries since Malaysia's independence. both leaders welcomed continued efforts to intensify cooperation between Malaysia and Pakistan. They underpinned their shared desire to strengthen bilateral economic ties, expand trade and investment, create favourable conditions for commerce and business in both countries, particularly in palm oil, agri products, food retail, halal products, automotive parts, energy, science and technology, and telecommunication. 
Reaffirming the Malaysia-Pakistan Closer Economic Partnership Agreement (MPCEPA) signed on 8 November 2007 in Kuala Lumpur which entered into force on 1 January 2008, Malaysia and Pakistan recognised the importance of regular discussions to strengthen the trade relationship in key sectors and addressing bilateral trade imbalance. Both leaders welcomed continuing efforts to further enhance bilateral economic relations and underscored importance of these efforts in advancing cooperation between Malaysia and Pakistan. Memorandum of Understanding on Defence Cooperation and looked forward to the 13th Joint Committee on Defence Cooperation (JCDC) which will be convened in 2019 in Kuala Lumpur. Malaysia invited Pakistan to participate in the upcoming Langkawi International Maritime and Aerospace Exhibition (LIMA) in 2019. Pakistan also welcomed Malaysia's participation in the upcoming Defence Expo IDEAS- 2018.

Malaysian side took note of the massive counter terrorism efforts that Paksitan has successfully undertaken in an effort to eliminate terrorism The two leaders agreed on the need to enhance educational ties between Malaysia and Pakistan and agreed that close cooperation on education and training are critical elements of the next phase of the relationship.

Both sides acknowledged the importance of the tourism industry and youth exchanges in promoting greater people-to-people contacts, sustainable socio- economic growth, and in fostering mutual understanding between the two countries. Both sides also reaffirmed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on the Recruitment of Pakistan Workers signed in Islamabad, Pakistan on 20th October 2003.

Noting the momentum building up worldwide for better quality products and services as consumers gain confidence in the halal process, Prime Minister Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad conveyed Malaysia's readiness to share its experience and expertise in the halal industry. Both leaders agreed to share information and best practices in this endeavour.

Recognising Malaysia's earnest efforts in eliminating corruption, Prime Minister Imran Khan expressed Pakistan's keen interest in learning from Malaysia's experience and accomplishments in this field.

As two peace-loving Islamic nations, the two leaders agreed to increase their collaborative efforts to uphold the true values of Islam in international fora while strengthening the solidarity of the Muslim Ummah. Prime Minister Imran Khan briefed Prime Minister Tun Mahathir on the grave human rights situation in Kashmir and in this regard referred to the Reports of UNOHCHR, Amnesty International, International People's Tribunal and All Parties Parliamentary Kashmir Group, UK. He also discussed the role of OIC Contact Group on Kashmir to highlight the issue.

In a joint statement, both sides reiterated that the friendship between Pakistan and China has withstood the test of time, notwithstanding the changes in domestic, regional and international environments.

political relations and strategic communication, both sides stressed that they will continue to view China-Pakistan relations from a strategic and long-term perspective. The Chinese side reiterated that China's relationship with Pakistan is always a matter of highest priority in its foreign policy. China appreciated the consistent and strong support by Pakistan to China's issues of core interest, and reaffirmed its support and solidarity with Pakistan in safeguarding its sovereignty,

independence, territorial integrity and security. The Pakistani side stressed that Pakistan-China relationship is the cornerstone of its foreign policy, and friendship with China represents national consensus and the common desire of all Pakistani people. Pakistan unequivocally upholds the one-China policy and supports all efforts made by the Chinese government to realize national reunification.

Both sides agreed to maintain frequent exchange of visits and meetings at the leadership level and continue to hold bilateral meetings between their leaders on the sidelines of major multilateral conferences and events. The two sides agreed to further strengthen links between their legislative bodies. China welcomed the establishment of China-Pakistan Friendship Groups in Pakistani Parliament. Both sides agreed to establish the mechanism of China-Pakistan Foreign Ministers' Strategic Dialogue and rename the former Strategic Dialogue at Vice Foreign Minister-level to Political Consultations. They also agreed to

continue exchange programmes pertaining to training of diplomats. On China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, the two sides reiterated that BRI represents a win-win model of international cooperation and provides new opportunities for economic rejuvenation and prosperity of all countries. As a signature project of BRI, the fast development of CPEC has played a significant role in the Belt and Road cooperation.

Both sides reviewed the early harvest phase of CPEC and expressed satisfaction that rapid progress has been made in all areas, especially in the energy sector. The two sides reaffirmed their complete consensus on the future trajectory of the CPEC, timely completion of its on-going projects and joint efforts for realization of its full potential with a focus on socio-economic development, job creation and livelihoods and accelerating cooperation in industrial development, industrial parks and agriculture.

Both sides agreed to task the CPEC Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC) to explore new



areas of cooperation. In this regard, it was decided that the eighth session of the JCC will be held in Beijing before the end of the year. To further expand cooperation under CPEC, the two sides announced the setting up of a working group on socio-economic development, to assist with livelihood projects in Pakistan.

Both sides reaffirmed their commitment to CPEC and agreed that it was a win-win enterprise for entire region and would bring regional prosperity and development through enhanced connectivity.

Recognizing the significance of Gwadar as an important node in cross-regional connectivity and the central pillar of CPEC, both sides agreed to speed up progress on the Port and its auxiliary projects.

Theydismissedthegrowingnegativepropaganda against CPEC and expressed determination to safeguard the CPEC projects from all threats. Pakistan recognized the immense contribution of the Chinese personnel working on various economic projects in Pakistan. The Chinese side expressed its appreciation for the measures taken for the security of Chinese personnel and projects in Pakistan. On trade, investment and financial cooperation, the two sides agreed to further consolidate and expand bilateral





economic relations as a matter of high priority and to strengthen multi-faceted pragmatic cooperation in trade and investment. They agreed to boost Pakistan's industrial capacity including through joint ventures in priority areas, relocation of labor-intensive industry and SMEs collaboration.

The two sides noted the growing volume of bilateral trade and agreed to take concrete measures to address trade imbalance. The two sides agreed to conclude the second phase of the China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement as early as possible, and continue discussions on the Pakistan-China Agreement on Trade in Services. They agreed to hold the next round of the Joint Economic Commission early next year. The two sides attached importance to friendly cooperation between the People's Bank of China and the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP). They expressed satisfaction at the operationalization of the currency-swap agreement and reaffirmed the need to further strengthen cooperative ties of financial and banking sectors between the two countries. Both sides agreed to strengthen cooperation on tourism promotion. On marine, science and technology, space, environmental and agricultural cooperation, both sides agreed to further strengthen policy

dialogue and strategic communication on maritime issues and expressed satisfaction on the Pakistan-China Maritime Cooperation Dialogue. They agreed to continue their close cooperation on navigation security, marine economy, exploration and utilization of marine resources, marine scientific research and marine environmental protection.

Both sides agreed to further expand and deepen their collaboration including in the areas of new and emerging technologies, nanotechnology, biotechnology, ICT, which can contribute to improved living standards through their applications in the fields of health, agriculture, water, energy and food security.

Expressing satisfaction on the launch of Pakistan Remote Sensing Satellite earlier this year, both sides agreed to further strengthen bilateral cooperation in space technology applications. The two sides agreed to strengthen cooperation in the field of manned space, and the China Manned Space Engineering Office and SUPARCO will sign a framework agreement on cooperation.

Both sides agreed to enhance their cooperation in the areas of climate change, desertification control, desalination, water management, afforestation and ecological restoration,











wetland protection and restoration, wildlife protection, forestry industry development, disaster management and risk reduction, and other areas of mutual interest. Both sides agreed to build on existing cooperation in the area of agriculture and explore new areas of joint collaboration. On social sector cooperation, Pakistan expressed a desire to learn from the Chinese poverty alleviation model, which has lifted over 700 million people out of poverty over the last forty years. China is willing to strengthen policy dialogue, experience sharing and capacity building in the field of poverty reduction with Pakistan, and support Pakistan to establish poverty alleviation demonstration projects. The Chinese assistance will also be directed towards agriculture, education, health, poverty alleviation, safe drinking water, and vocational training.

Pakistan side recognized China's unremitting efforts to combat corruption and its great achievements, and evinced interest in learning from the Chinese experience and accomplishments in the field of anti-corruption. On people-to-people and cultural linkages, both sides reiterated the importance of peopleto-people contacts and cultural exchanges and agreed to encourage mutual visits of nationals of the two countries. Both sides agreed to improve visa facilitation for mutual visits.

Both sides decided to celebrate Pakistan-China Year of Friendship/Sister Cities next year and to establish friendship city relationships between corresponding Chinese and Pakistani cities and provinces. The two sides agreed to further enhance cooperation between neighboring regions of the two countries, particularly in the areas of economy, trade, transportation, energy, industry, tourism, education, peopleto-people contacts and livelihoods.

They expressed satisfaction at the growing cooperation in the field of education and agreed to intensify educational linkages especially between higher education institutions.

They agreed to encourage respective universities to develop bilateral linkages including through joint degree and exchange programmes. They further agreed to promote

teaching of Pakistan Studies and Urdu language at Chinese Universities and Sinology and Chinese language at Pakistani Universities. Both sides agreed to negotiate agreements on mutual recognition of higher education degrees, diplomas and certificates, as early as possible.

The Chinese side agreed to continue supporting Pakistan in technical and vocational training to develop a skilled manpower for employment in CEPC projects. They agreed to further promote exchanges between the think tanks including through conferences, seminars and fellowships. Both sides would encourage cooperation between their media houses and exchange visits and training programmes for journalists/media personnel. Both sides agreed to further enhance cooperation in culture, arts, broadcasting, films, publication and sports under the Executive Programme of the Cultural Agreement between the two countries. The two sides shall discuss the possibility to organize an Ancient Pakistan and Gandhara Artifacts Exhibition in Beijing. They also agreed











to strengthen cooperation in the field of sports. The respective sports authorities will discuss further details. The two sides will actively encourage and support their publishing houses to translate and print literary classics so that the people of the two countries can appreciate each other's rich culture.

They also agreed to establish China-Pakistan Youth Communication Committee, which will coordinate the exchange of youth and cooperation on youth affairs. On defence, security and counter-terrorism cooperation, both sides agreed to further enhance defence cooperation, maintain high-level visits and exchanges at various levels between relevant departments of the two armed forces, make full use of the China-Pakistan Defence and Security Consultation mechanism, deepen cooperation in areas such as military exercises, training cooperation, personnel exchanges, and equipment and technology cooperation.



Both sides agreed to further enhance cooperation against "Three Evils" of extremism, terrorism and separatism. Both sides will continue to regularly utilize their existing mechanisms of Strategic Dialogue and Counterterrorism and Security Consultations to further promote communication and cooperation in relevant fields.

The Chinese side conveyed its support to Pakistan's commitment and efforts to counter terrorism, assured Pakistan of its support in implementing its counter-terrorism strategy, and commended the tremendous sacrifices made by the Pakistani nation in fight against terrorism and for Pakistan's immense contribution to regional and international



peace and security through its achievements and successes. The Chinese side recognized Pakistan's efforts in actively strengthening financial regulations to combat terrorism financing, and called on all relevant parties to view Pakistan's counter-terrorism efforts in an objective and fair manner.

> The Pakistani side reaffirmed its support to the Chinese side safeguarding in sovereignty its security, and combating separatism, terrorism and extremism including East Turkistan Islamic Movement. international and regional issues, both sides reaffirmed their

commitment to the purposes and principles of the UN Charter, promoting international peace and security, and safeguarding the contemporary world order and the UN-centric international system. They agreed to jointly promote multilateralism, free trade and winwin cooperation. The two sides support a consensus-based reform of the United Nations so that it responds to the interests and concerns of all Member States. Being major contributors to the UN Peacekeeping Operations over the years, the two sides agreed to enhance policy coordination, capacity building and sharing of good practices on peacekeeping.


Both sides believe that peace, development, cooperation and win-win are shared aspirations

of the peoples in the region. All nations should promote cooperative and sustainable security, refrain from developing relations targeting any third country, contribute more to the mutual trust between regional countries, and respect sovereign decisions of countries in determining their development paths and respective foreign policies, so as to jointly safeguard the peace and stability of the region.

Both sides believe that a peaceful, stable, cooperative and prosperous South Asia is in the common interest of all parties. Both sides emphasized the importance of pursuit of dialogue and resolution of all outstanding disputes to promote regional cooperation and advance the goals of lasting peace, stability and shared prosperity. China appreciates Pakistan's quest for peace through dialogue, cooperation and negotiation, on the basis of mutual respect and equality, and supports Pakistan's efforts for improvement of Pakistan-India relations and for settlement of outstanding disputes between the two countries. Pakistan supported active participation of China at the platform of the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation.

They agreed to strengthen cooperation on the Afghan issue and support the 'Afghan-owned and Afghan-led' peace and reconciliation process. China appreciates that Pakistan and Afghanistan are coordinating closely through the Afghanistan-Pakistan Action Plan for Peace and Solidarity (APAPPS) to enhance cooperation between the two countries in all areas. Both sides agreed on the importance of China-Afghanistan-Pakistan consultations at the Foreign Ministers level aimed at deepening









trilateral cooperation for shared progress, development and security and for strengthening peace and stability in Afghanistan. Both sides supported Afghanistan to host the second tripartite foreign ministers dialogue within this year.

The two sides underlined the importance of peaceful settlement of all disputes in the Middle East on the basis of mutual respect and in accordance to the precepts of international law.

They reaffirmed their commitment to multilateral, non-discriminatory arms control and non-proliferation endeavours. China appreciates and supports steps taken by Pakistan for strengthening the global nonproliferation regime. In this context, China supports Pakistan's engagement with the Nuclear Suppliers Group and welcomes its adherence of NSG Guidelines.

Recalling the commitments of all states for implementation of General Assembly and Security Council resolutions relating to international terrorism, both sides underscored the need for all States to avoid politicization of the UN Sanctions regime and the work of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF). Both sides also reiterated the need to evolve the text of Comprehensive Convention on International Terrorism on the basis of consensus. Both sides agreed to strengthen coordination and cooperation on international and regional issues of common interest; and maintain close communication and coordination within international and regional organizations and mechanisms. China welcomed Pakistan's membership of SCO and appreciated its active participation in the SCO Summit in Qingdao in June 2018.

During the visit, the two sides also signed fifteen agreements/MoUs on a range of bilateral issues.



TAPI GAS PIPELINE:

FROM CONCEPT TO REALITY

An interview with Muhammetmyrad Amanov the representative of the State Concern "Turkmengas" on the Board of Directors of "TAPI Pipeline Company Limited"

As it is well known, an important aspect of Turkmenistan's energy strategy is the expansion of the geography of export routes for the supply of Turkmen energy to world markets, including through the creation of a multivariate transport infrastructure. In this area, large investment projects are being implemented; among them the construction of the Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India gas pipeline (TAPI) occupies a special place.

Q1: We asked the representative how this important international project is going through with it.

- Let me remind you that in 2010 the TAPI project got in the active phase by signing in Ashgabat a four-party intergovernmental agreement on this project. Then, from 2012 to 2016, the legal framework of the project was coherently refilled by the Agreements for the purchase and sale of natural gas with all buyers, joint-stock and investment agreements.

In 2013, the Governments of Turkmenistan, Afghanistan, Pakistan and India designated their state-owned gas companies to promote and invest in the TAPI project.

The project includes comprehensive works on the design, procurement, construction, operation and maintenance of the 1840 km pipeline from Turkmenistan to Afghanistan, Pakistan and India. It is envisaged that after full commissioning of TAPI, that within 30 years up to 33 billion cubic meters of natural gas per year will be exported.

This project can clearly be reckoned among a small number of international projects. It will have a stimulating effect on the sustainable development, social and economic growth of the countries of the region and will ensure their energy security. These factors, in turn, are the "pillars" on which the modern architecture of the energy space is held.

In a relatively short period of time, significant progress has been achieved in the implementation of the TAPI project, in particular, on key agreements such as the Agreement with Host Governments and the Agreement on the Transport of Natural Gas. A great impulse for the promotion of the project was given by the establishment of the consortium "TAPI Pipeline Company Limited" and subsequently the election of the State Concern "Turkmengas" as the leader of this consortium.

Let me remind you that the start of construction of TAPI was given in December 2015 in Mary region. Presidents of Turkmenistan and Afghanistan, high-ranking representatives of India and Pakistan took part in the solemn ceremony on the occasion of the welding of the first joint symbolic "golden link" of the new gas transportation artery. The laying of the 214-kilometer section of the gas pipeline in the territory of our country is carried out by the State Concern "Turkmengas", and it is planned to complete all works at the end of 2018.

In October 2016, to finance the construction of the Turkmen part of the TAPI gas pipeline the Agreement of the Government of Turkmenistan with the Islamic Development Bank was signed. The document provides for the allocation of a credit in the amount of 700 million US dollars. In November this year, in Riyadh, the regular meeting of the Intergovernmental Turkmen-Saudi Commission on Trade and Economic Cooperation with the participation of industry and energy leaders, as well as large companies of Saudi Arabia was held. During the meeting. issues of trade, economic and investment cooperation, including in the fuel and energy sector, were discussed, specific in several areas agreements were reached. In particular, the State Concern "Turkmengas" has signed an agreement with the Global Pipe Company for the delivery in 2018 of a large batch of pipe products intended for the construction of TAPI. As you know, the resource base of TAPI at the initial stage will be the super huge gas field "Galkynysh". As part of the development of this field, the State Concern "Turkmengas" together with its foreign partners is doing a great job, aimed to provide "blue fuel" for TAPI at a high level.

I want to note other achievements. So, at the negotiation stage there are agreements on the project, which will be concluded with governments and state counterparts. Among them, the most important is the Agreement with the Governments of the host countries.

We have completed the tender process for the selection of contractors for detailed road surveys on the pipeline route. Key surveys, such as environmental and social impact assessment, and the development of a land allocation plan are already under implementation in the Afghan and Pakistani areas.

Preliminary design for the gas pipeline and all stations, which is better known as Front-End Engineering & Design, has been completed. The tender process of selection suppliers of equipment for long-term production - as a main pipe and large valves, as well as contractors for the construction of a linear part and stations for various purposes has been started.

Draft contracts, which will be concluded as a result of tenders, have been prepared. We do not expect long negotiations in view of the fact that the proposed contract scheme has been repeatedly accepted by the market and demonstrated its effectiveness and balance of interests of the parties. And last but not least, this is the fact that a team of advisers from the companies - world leaders in their field has been assembled.

In general, this entire means that the project is progressing in accordance with the schedule, in 2019 it is planned to start gas deliveries to TAPI.

Q2: What support is provided for the

construction of TAPI at the state level?

- Initially, it should be noted that Turkmenistan is the locomotive of the promotion of this project. Thanks to the initiative and personal guidance of the President of Turkmenistan, Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov, the project has reached the current stage of development, namely, over the past few years it has been transformed from the concept into reality. Already in the near future, construction work is expected to begin in the territories of Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Undoubtedly, the governments of the participating countries fully support the TAPI gas pipeline project. There is a full-scale assistance to the activities of the consortium "TAPI Pipeline Company Limited" both at the level of shareholders, which in turn are state-owned gas companies, and at the level of state departments of the respective iurisdictions.

Representatives of the governments of Turkmenistan, Afghanistan, Pakistan and India work very closely and effectively. And this is confirmed by the fact that the TAPI project is extremely important for the development of the region's economy, primarily for the industrial sector, large and small businesses. Thus, local contractors will be involved in the delivery and construction work. The participating countries will receive a cheaper, more economical and environmentally friendly source of energy, as well as additional incomes from gas transit.

As President Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov emphasized, in addition to the economic development of the region and the solution of vital social issues, the implementation of the TAPI project would help to strengthen peace and stability there. From this point of view the project is considered both by the participating countries, and by the world community.

In continuation of the topic, it is necessary to mention one more important and long-term partner of the project - the Asian Development Bank. ADB participates in the project from the very beginning and continues to provide all-round support to TAPI, including through the provision of soft loans. Thus, an agreement was reached between the Government of Afghanistan and ADB on financing the Afghan share capital in "TAPI Pipeline Company Limited".

Q3: What are the criteria for selecting consultants and contractors for project?

- First of all, this is the solid experience in the field of pipeline design, construction and operation, the introduction of the best world practices and standards into the project. Particular attention is paid to the environmental aspect. Choosing the route, we were guided by the principle of minimum impact on the environment. By technical complexity, the TAPI project can be put on a par with other international gas pipeline projects. In this regard, it is necessary to note the successful work of our consultants - the German company ILF and the British Allen & Overy.

Q4: How the financing issues of the project are solved?

- The State Bank for Foreign Economic Affairs of Turkmenistan and the SC "Turkmengas" have extensive experience in attracting investments in major international projects and, accordingly, working with various credit agencies and financial institutions. Among them - the Asian Development Bank and the Islamic Development Bank, export credit agencies and sovereign funds of various countries, as well as international commercial banks.

Taking into account the fact that the lion's share of the necessary capital investments is taken by the supply of goods and equipment of long-term production, export credit agencies can potentially play an important role in financing the project. In addition, the project parties unanimously confirm their commitment to the project and the obligation to provide their own capital in accordance with the shares of participation and agreements.



TAPI will be a game changer for this region:





Accordingly, the UAE has achieved qualitative growth across all areas. This reflected directly and clearly though several indicators, according to the World Economic Forum's Global Competitiveness Report, which covers numerous key areas such as quality of life, infrastructure, technology, and the adoption of business-friendly government policies. This comes to confirm that the country perseveres in its endeavors in accordance with the longterm approach of Sheikh Zayed to achieve stability and prosperity in the country, in the region and in the world at large.

For the fifth consecutive year, the UAE ranked first as the largest international donor of Official Development Aid (ODA) relative to gross national income (GNI). The country spent 1.31% of its GNI on foreign developmental aid in 2017, which is nearly twice the global target of 0.7% set by the United Nations as a global standard to measure the efforts of donor countries.

Donations made in 2017 amounted to a total ODA contribution of Dh19.32 billion (US \$ 5.26 billion), a year-on-year growth rate of 18.1% from 2016. Over 54 percent of the ODA was in the form of non-refundable grants to 147 countries (including 40 of the least developed countries) across the world,

The UAE continues to hold a leading position on the list of Official Development Aid (ODA) donors as a share of the Gross National Income (GNI), one of its many achievement on the international level and across various fields.

Empowering women nationwide and around the world

he United Arab Emirates has adopted a powerful stance in empowering women, setting new standards based on a unique model drawn from the vision of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, founding father of the UAE. This approach perpetuates in the current leadership's vision for the future, whereby women stand as active partners and contributors in the country's development process and play a vital role in raising future generations.

The country's constitution supports the participation of Emirati women in decisionmaking, a core component of economic empowerment. In December 2014, the UAE Cabinet adopted a decision imposing the appointment of women on the boards of directors of all institutions and government agencies, setting the proportion of female representation at 15% in government institutions. Nine women sit on the Federal National Council for the 16th legislature, representing 22.5% of 40 members. Furthermore, women make up 27% of the new Cabinet formed in 2016 which includes nine women ministers, one of whom is the youngest minister appointed to Cabinet (23 years).

The UAE Gender Balance Council was established in 2015 as a federal agency dedicated to scaling up the UAE's efforts to achieve gender balance across all sectors nationwide, and in decisionmaking positions. Women are actively involved in the judiciary sector with several women judges and prosecutors, as well as a significant female presence in the police and the military. In the diplomatic field, women currently hold 30% of positions in the diplomatic corps at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, which comprised 234 women employees in 2017, including women ambassadors and diplomats representing the



The UAE Constitution guarantees equal rights for women and men. The country is leading the way in a number of regional and global indexes on gender equality and women's achievements, education and literacy, women's employment, and respect for women among several social

UAE abroad.

Moreover, the UAE has made remarkable progress in reducing gender disparities in girls' education in schools and higher education, with more than 70 percent girls graduating from universities. In the economic field









and in the business world, women have set themselves as partners, making up 46.6% of the total workforce, holding 66% of the jobs of the public sector, 30% of which are decisionmaking positions. Furthermore, 23,000 businesswomen manage projects worth about USD15 billion in the UAE.

At the international level, more than 14 per cent of total international aid contributed by the United Arab Emirates in 2016 was devoted to empowering women and girls around the world. After deducting bilateral support to government budgets, which accounts for more than half of the value of foreign aid contributed by the UAE in 2016, the proportion of aid allotted to the promotion gender equality and women's empowerment accounts for nearly one-third of total aid.

UAE Passport Ranked 1st in 2018 The Most Powerful in the World

In 2018, it ranked 1st in the world according to the World Passport Index, reaching 167 countries visa-free. he hot topic in the UK for the last 2 years has been its decision to leave the European Union. As expected, there has been a lot of debate and difference of opinion on the matter. All has become further complicated from the intense difference of opinion by each of the different states, leaving Teresa May and her cabinet the difficult job of convincing the entire country that Brexit is a good idea. However, as much as the Government has tried and continues to do so to hold on to the support they once had, much of their reasoning as proven to be not only wrong, but also false. This has left the country questioning if they have made the right decision by voting for Brexit and have those voters lost their faith in the Government for lying to them, making the supporters of Brexit vote to leave.

There are mixed feelings in Scotland about leaving the EU, firstly because the Scottish National Party came into power during the Referendum vote in 2007 by a small margin. This shows that there is a large divide in the country with almost half of Scotland not supporting the Scottish Government, thus not having their voices heard. Scotland then poses the question that is Scotland strong enough to survive as a nation? With the Scottish government also seeking a chance to have another Referendum to separate from the UK, they will be even more vulnerable and not have their voice heard. 62% of Scotland voted to stay in the EU and this proves that the people believe leaving will

become detrimental to the survival of their jobs, businesses and industries which rely on trade with the EU.

As of yet no deal has been put in place between the UK and the EU, meaning the future of those same jobs and industries still hangs in the balance. There is no promise or sign of surety for those who will suffer due to this. So much so, that even the Government is now working on a series of guidelines for those industries about how to deal with Brexit when it will implemented in March next year. With all the negativity, it is also possible the Scottish Government may move towards asking for another Referendum to leave the UK to safeguard Scotland's position in the EU.

Such changes are likely to have an adverse effect on the Scottish Asian community as well, in particular for those who have their own businesses. The signs of distress are already visible with the increasing stringency of tax laws and the ever-increasing cost of goods, transport, utilities just to name a few. Naturally consumers have now created a habit of bulk buying from supermarkets that are helping to keep the consumer's costs down by the volume they are able to purchase direct from suppliers. The smaller business owner is just not able to compete and when the UK says its final goodbye to Europe, the same supplies' costs are anticipated to increase – and that is without taking into account the restrictions or issues which may have to be faced by all the small to medium business owners in order to continue to trade with the EU. This adverse effect on those businesses is one of the main reasons why a lot of the Scottish Pakistani community seems to be very opposed to Brexit since a lot of the community own small businesses.

Foreign policy however has not been on the high end of Scotland's agenda due to it being a state and not a country and not even National Government. This means that Scotland is not able to influence or make fundamental decisions, thus having the future of the country in the hands of the National Government.

Scotland however has been extremely vocal on its stance about various policies and issues around the world in which the UK has played a role in. Scotland has always supported and been vocal about coming to a 2-state solution for Palestine as well as the welcoming a higher number of refugees into the country. It has always lobbied for peace in the Middle East and because foreign policy is controlled by the UK Government, Scotland has minimum influence, therefore cannot put its voice on the discussion table. Leaving the EU means Scotland will be further distanced from those issues and will slowly lose its opinion and identity. Further, when Brexit happens in March next year, Scotland will not be able to voice its opinion on the issues it strongly believes in as well as opposing the National Government.

China has stood by its strategic relationship with Pakistan, reiterating its strong ties with the South Asian nation after armed militants stormed the Chinese consulate in Karachi. The bilateral alliance is "higher than (the) mountains and deeper than (the) sea," Lijian Zhao, deputy chief of mission at the Chinese Embassy in Islamabad, said on Twitter days after the terror attack. "The friendship has never been empty talks, but deeply imprinted in hearts of Chinese and Pakistani people," Zhao said.

The spokesperson said during a press briefing that according to the investigations by Pakistan, the attack on the Chinese Consulate in Karachi on November 23 was a terrorist attack, which killed two Pakistani police officers and injured one security guard. Two civilians were also killed and all three militants were shot dead, he said.

The Prime Minister, Imran Khan, condemned the attack, describing it as part of a conspiracy against Pakistan and China's economic and strategic cooperation. Khan lauded the Karachi police and paramilitary rangers, saying they showed exceptional courage in defending the consulate and the "nation salutes the martyrs". He ordered an investigation and vowed that such incidents would never be able to undermine relations with China, which are "mightier than the Himalayas and deeper than the Arabian Sea".

Wang Yu told that citizens of China are collecting donations to raise money to help the families of the two policemen. Sindh Inspector General Kaleem Imam thanked the Chinese authorities for their compassion.

Realization of this end necessitates well-equipped, welltrained and well-adaptive maritime force. Adaptation to a fluid security milieu requires a military force to be responsive, dependable and highly resilient. Achieving these markers of combat potential can only be done through simulations, exercises and war games. Besides numerous paper and computer-based military simulations, Pakistan Navy conducts the Ex Seaspark every two years. Principal objective of the exercise is to evaluate the Navy's readiness for war across the spectrum of conflict against conventional and unconventional adversaries. It is also meant to validate operational concepts and test emergent changes in the Navy's tactical doctrine.

Pakistan Navy, being a potent and combat ready multi-dimensional force, assesses, refines and demonstrates its war preparedness through the conduct of maritime exercises in North Arabian Sea and along Pakistan Coast from Jiwani to Sir Creek. The ongoing Seaspark is a manifestation of Pakistan Navy as force of choice for Pakistan to protect its maritime interests. The exercise involves participation of PN ships, submarines and aircraft alongwith Special Forces and Marines. Additionally, Pakistan Maritime Security Agency, Pakistan Air Force and Pak Army Air Defence elements are also participating as joint forces to achieve the chief purpose of safeguarding the country's maritime interests. The exercise also affords valuable opportunity to sharpen fighting skills of Pakistan Navy's combat units to meet the estimated maritime security threats. The proceedings of exercise spanning over two months include deployment of forces, simulating hostilities and followed by threadbare analysis of the procedures, concepts and tactics validated during the exercise.

This Seaspark saw Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral Z M Abbasi undertake whirlwind tours of our Coastal and Creek areas to see firsthand level of readiness of Pakistan Navy. These visits covered areas from Gwadar, Turbat, Ormara

along the coast of Makran in Baluchistan to Sir Creek in Sindh. At these places, the Naval Chief received operational briefings by onscene commanders. The Naval Chief was unequivocal in expressing his resolve to ensure protection of Gwadar deep sea port against all kinds of conventional and unconventional threats. He reiterated that providing a safe and secure environment both, on land and at sea, is essential for smooth functioning of Gwadar port as well as to accrue desired socio-economic advantages of CPEC. While at sea during the exercise, Chief of the Naval Staff witnessed the operational view of the fleet units engaged in Seaspark.

Pakistan Navy has come of age from merely being a coastal navy to a Navy with an ability to radiate its influence region-wide with global outlook. It has emerged as a reckonable force with wide international recognition. Pakistan Navy, today, is regarded as a dependable military service for security and stability in the Indian Ocean. Pakistan Navy is braced up to thwart misadventure or overambitious designs of nefarious elements in the region. The exercise Seaspark would provide impetus to Pakistan's resolve of maintaining peace, security and stability in the region.

The president highlighted that Pakistan's strategic location with respect to regional trade was enhanced due to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor.








