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
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

RIME Minister Imran Khan delivered an emphatic address to the United Nations General Assembly on Sept 27 that made the world sit up and think. The focus of his speech was on Islamophobia and the occupation of Kashmir and he spoke with such conviction that the audience applauded him a number of times during his speech. All the talk about radical Islam in the Western world was brilliantly shot down by PM Imran, saying that there was only one true Islam. President Dr. Arif Alvi, while talking to the Chairman of Majles A'Shura of the Sultanate of Oman and Head of Delegation Mr. Sheikh Khalid bin Hilal Al Maawali, who called on him at the Aiwan-e-Sadr, Islamabad said Indian fascist regime, previously involved in the Gujarat Massacre, had now endangered the regional and international peace because of its access to the nuclear button. Speaker National Assembly Asad Qaiser was also present on the occasion. The President highlighted that Pakistan strongly rejected the illegal Indian actions of August 5, whereby it unilaterally



tried to alter the disputed status of the IOJ&K, which was a breach of the Resolutions of the UNSC. He emphasized that India's assertion of Jammu and Kashmir being an internal matter was not true, as testified by the recent meeting of the UNSC. Every Muslim must feel the pain of the innocent Kashmiris, who were subjected to blatant human rights violation by Indian Forces through ghastly clampdown, involving a month long curfew and suspension of basic amenities of life to the people, he added. The President said that Pakistan sought support of Oman along with the international community to urge India to respect the UNSC Resolutions, which give an inalienable right of self-determination to the people of Kashmir. As a member of the OIC, Oman must make efforts to solidify OIC's support for the people of Indian Occupied Jammu & Kashmir, he added. Highlighting the close interaction between the two parliaments and formation of Friendship groups in the upper houses of both countries, the President said that Pakistan attached great importance to its relations with Oman and was keen to further enhance these brotherly relations in all spheres. In this regard, the creation of Pak-Oman Friendship group in Mailis A' Shura of Oman would further connect the two countries. He emphasized that regular high-level interactions through established mechanisms of Bilateral Political Consultations and Joint Commission would promote and expand bilateral ties in diverse fields. He underscored that the current level of bilateral trade was not commensurate with excellent political ties and highlighted the need to diversify bilateral trade by taking advantage of geographical proximity, the investment-friendly policies of Pakistan, and Pakistan's potential of exporting food items, construction materials, leather and surgical goods to Oman. Furthermore, he said that Pakistani community had been making valuable contribution to the development of Oman and pointed out the need to increase the opportunities in employment of Pakistani workers in banking, health, education, petroleum and food sectors.

Pakistan was a peaceful nation and desired peace in the region, said the President. He underlined that peace in Afghanistan was pivotal for sustainable regional peace and Pakistan was dedicated to the ongoing reconciliation process in Afghanistan. Mr. Sheikh Khalid bin Hilal Al Maawali appreciated the excellent bilateral relations, and said that the formation of Friendship groups in the upper houses of both countries would go a long way in further bolstering the bilateral relations. He said that Pakistani Diaspora in Oman was playing an invaluable role in the progress and prosperity of Oman. He agreed that the trade relations between the two countries needed further boost. In the end, the President extended invitation to the Sultan of Oman to visit Pakistan

Pakistan PM Imran Khan addresses United Nations General Assembly

The premier began his wide-ranging, at times apparently extemporaneous speech by saying he feels honoured to represent Pakistan at the world forum. He said he would not have come to the UN if he did not feel that some "urgent issues" needed to be addressed.

Kashmir oppression

The issue which the prime minister talked in most detail about was the oppression of the people of occupied Kashmir. "When we came to power, we swore that we would try to bring peace.

"We went to fight the war on terror and we faced losses of [thousands of people].I opposed the war because in the 1980s we joined the struggle against the Soviets funded by western countries.

"The mujahideen were trained by the Pakistan Army and they waged the freedom struggle. The Soviets called them terrorists and we called them freedom fighters. In 1989 soviets retreated; the Americans packed up and left. Here we had indoctrinated them in jihad against foreign occupation and now that the US had taken over, we were supposed to tell them it's no longer jihad.

"And so the US turned against us and it was a nightmare. Taliban were in Afghanistan, Al Qaeda was there; what did Pakistan have to do with it? When we came to power we decided we would dismantle what was left. I know India keeps alleging that these groups are there. I welcome UN observers, see for yourself. We now have a relationship with Afghanistan, Russia and then we wanted to mend fences with India. I have friends in India and I love going to India. So when my party came to power, we reached out to India and (said) let's resolve differences through trade. "(Indian Prime Minister Narendra) Modi said there were terrorist attacks from Pakistan. We said well we have attacks in Balochistan from your end. Unfortunately we didn't make any headway. Our foreign minister was at the UNGA but they cancelled the meeting. Meanwhile a 20-year-old Kashmiri

boy blew himself up at the Indian convoy. And India blamed us. I spoke to the Indian public on television. I said if you give us any iota of proof, we will immediately take action, because we have clamped down on these groups. They bombed us (instead), and we retaliated. We immediately returned the [captured Indian] pilot, saying that we do not want an escalation. Rather than taking that as a peace gesture, [Modi claimed that] he had taught Pakistan a lesson; that their jets had killed 350 terrorists. Complete lies. They just killed 10 trees of ours which was quite painful given that we are growing all these trees."

The prime minister pointed out that Modi's entire election campaign revolved around an anti-Pakistan narrative. In his election campaign, Mr Modi used words like 'This is just a trailer. The movie is about to start' and 'I went into Pakistan and taught them a lesson'."

He said that at the time, Pakistan chalked it up to just "politicians making statements" and that they would get back to the normal relationship with India post-elections. The premier said that India did not respond to Pakistan's overtures following Modi's reelection as prime minister and soon it was discovered that India was trying to push Pakistan into the blacklist of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) to bankrupt the country.

"That's when we realized that there was an agenda and that agenda became obvious on the 5th of August when India went against 11 United Nations Security Council resolutions which say that Kashmir is a disputed territory and the people of Kashmir have the right of self-determination," he said. "They went against the Simla Accord - which is about sorting out our differences through bilateral means."They actually went against the Indian Constitution. Illegally, they revoked Article 370 which gave Kashmir the special status and [stationed] an extra 180,000 troops there," said Prime Minister Imran, providing the backdrop to India's actions in Kashmir. He said that the total number of security forces in Kashmir are 900,000 and they put eight million people of occupied Kashmir under curfew.

He said that the answer to how anyone can do something like this lies in the RSS ideology followed by Modi. "Now I must explain what RSS is. Modi is a life member (of RSS). "It is an organisation inspired by Hitler and Mussolini. They believe in racial purity and superiority. They believe they are an Aryan race. "They believe in the ethnic cleansing of Muslims. They believe a golden age of Hindu rule was stopped by Muslims and then the British occupation. "What kind of people bring in 900,000 troops for eight million people? These are human beings," said Prime Minister Imran to applause from the audience. "What comes with Aryan superiority is arrogance and it makes people commit mistakes and do stupid, cruel things like what Modi has done. "It is arrogance that has blinded Modi. Has he thought about what will happen after the curfew in Kashmir is lifted?

"What will he do? Does he think the people of Kashmir will quietly accept the status quo?" "(Nearly) 100,000 Kashmiris have died in the past 30 years because they were denied their right of self-determination. Eleven thousand women were raped.

"The world hasn't done anything. "What is going to happen will be a blood bath. The people will come out. "Has he thought it through what happens then? Has anyone thought what happens when there is a bloodbath? "What do you think they (Kashmiris) will think of the way they have been boxed in?" He noted that even pro-India local leaders were taken out of Kashmir as part of the crackdown and 13,000 boys were picked up and taken to unknown locations. "What will the people do then? [They will] take to the streets. The soldiers will then shoot them. They have already used pellet guns. "And so Kashmiris will be further radicalised. There will be another Pulwama. And they (India) will blame us. "They are already blaming us. They said we have 500 terrorists lined up to go in. "Why would we send 500 terrorists when there are 900,000 troops? "There will only be further cruelty on Kashmiris. It will give them the excuse to chant on the mantra of Islamic terrorism. "The whole world then turns away. "How do we (Pakistan) benefit from further increasing cruelty on the people of Kashmir?" Prime Minister Imran said there is no other narrative left for India. "Whatever happens we will be blamed. "What does Modi think the 180 million Muslims of India are thinking? Aren't they watching these Kashmiris stuck in?

"Don't you think they too will be radicalised? Then there will be blame on us again. "What about the 1.3bn Muslims watching this who know this is only happening because they are Muslims? What do you think they would think? "What would the Jews of Europe think if 8,000 Jews were stuck. Are we children of a lesser God? "Among the 1.3bn (Muslims) someone will pick up arms," he said, citing the analogy of a Hollywood film.

"Muslims will become radicals because of this, not because of Islam. Because they see no justice. "I have pictured myself locked up for 55 days. There are rapes, soldiers going into rooms. "Would I want to let this humiliation continue? I would pick up a gun." "You are forcing people into radicalisation," he said, addressing the Indian leadership. "This is one of the most critical times. There will be a reaction to this and Pakistan will be blamed. "Two nuclear countries will come face to face. "Before we head there the UN has a responsibility; this is why the UN came into being in 1945. You were supposed to stop this from happening. "I feel like we are back in 1939 [when] Czechoslovakia was annexed." Is the international community going to appease or stand up for justice or humanity. "If a conventional war starts between the two countries, supposing a country seven times smaller is faced with a choice to surrender or fight to the end. "When a nuclear country fights till the end it has consequences far beyond the borders. "This is a test of the UN. You are the one who guaranteed the Kashmiris the right (of self-determination). "This is the time not to appease but to take action."

He said the very first action that India needs to take is to lift the curfew in occupied Kashmir and then release all detained prisoners. "And then the world community must give the



Kashmiris the right of self-determination," the prime minister stressed.

'Humans facing huge catastrophe 'The first issue addressed by Prime Minister Imran in his speech was climate change. "So many leaders spoke about climate change but I feel there is a lack of seriousness (to tackle the issue). "Perhaps some of the leaders who can do a lot do not realise the seriousness of the situation. There are a lot of ideas but they are nothing without funding," said the premier. He noted that Pakistan is in the top ten list of countries who are most affected by climate change. "We depend on our rivers and 80 per cent of our water comes from glaciers. The glaciers are also in India in the Himalayas, Karakorum and the Hindu Kush. "If nothing is done, we are scared humans are facing a huge catastrophe. "In my country where I

came into power in KP we planted one billion trees and plan to plant 10bn to counter global warming effects. "One country cannot do anything; it has to be a combined effort of the world." He said the countries contributing to greenhouse gas emissions must be pushed and the UN must take initiative. Money laundering 'devastating developing world' Prime Minister Imran said the second issue he was speaking about is even more critical that of illicit financial flows. "Every year billions of dollars leave the poorer countries and go towards rich countries, siphoned off by the ruling elites of the western world. "This is devastating the developing world. It is impoverishing them. The rich-poor gap is growing because of them." He regretted that the seriousness with which money from drugs or terror financing is treated is not accorded to money laundered from poor countries. "In my country, when I took charge of our government a year back, our total debt went up four times in the ten years preceding that. "As a result, the total revenue we collected in one year, half of it went into debt servicing. How are we going to spend money on our human beings — 200 million people — if half the money is going into debt servicing? "Our country was plundered by the ruling elite. And they could easily get their money out. And when we locate properties in western capitals bought by this money through corruption and money laundering by these corrupt leaders, we find it so difficult to retrieve it."

He said that if the money was retrieved it could be spent on human development.

"But it is so difficult [owing to] the laws protecting these criminals. We do not have the sort of money to have expensive lawyers and spend millions and millions of dollars. We need help from the rich countries. "It is critical. The rich countries must show political will. They cannot allow this to happen. "How can the poor countries spend money on human development when this money can easily leave our countries?"Unless the rich countries intend to build walls to stop economic refugees [from] coming as we see right now, they must take action. They must take action now. "Corrupt elites must not be allowed to park their money (abroad). Why do we have these tax havens? "Why shouldn't rich people pay taxes? Why are they legal, these secret accounts? "Sooner or later there will be a crisis if the rich keep getting richer and the poor poorer. "I hope the UN takes a lead on this. The IMF and ADB must find a way."

'Islamophobia is creating divisions'

Addressing the prevalence of Islamophobia, Prime Minister Imran said it has grown at an alarming pace.

"Islamophobia is creating divisions, hijab is becoming a weapon; a woman can take off clothes but she can't put on more clothes. "It started after 9/11 and it started because certain western leaders equated Islam with terrorism. He questioned the use of the term 'radical Islamic terrorism' saying: "There is only one Islam. "What message does this (the term) send? How is a person in New York going to distinguish between moderate Muslims and radical Muslims? "This radical Islamic terrorism used by leaders has caused Islamophobia and has caused pain for Muslims."In European countries it is marginalising Muslims, and this leads to radicalisation. "Some of the terrorists were from marginalised Muslim communities. We Muslim leaders have not addressed this issue. "The basis of all religions is compassion and justice which differentiates us from the animal kingdom." He said religion was viewed differently in the west, which was why the reaction in the Muslim world to content maligning Islamic personalities was not understood. "I hear such strange things that Islam is against women and minorities. "In the first state of Islam, Madina, the state took responsibility of the weak, taxed the rich, spent money on the poor [and] announced that all human beings come from Adam hence they were equal.

"The Prophet (Muhammad PBUH) lives in our hearts. The holozcaust is treated with sensitivity because it gives them (Jews) pain. "That's all we ask. Don't use freedom of speech to cause us pain," he concluded.



Prime Minister Imran Khan Meetings with State Premiers during UNGA 74th Session

rime Minister Imran Khan met President Donald Trump on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York on 24th September 2019. The two leaders reaffirmed their resolve to build a broadbased and mutually-beneficial partnership between Pakistan and the United States. Prime Minister Khan appreciated President Trump's continued offers of assistance in mediating the Jammu and Kashmir dispute. Describing India's draconian lockdown in Occupied Jammu and Kashmir as a dire humanitarian crisis with implications for regional security, the Prime Minister highlighted the importance of immediate lifting of the curfew and other restrictions and resolving the Kashmir dispute for durable peace and stability in South Asia. The two leaders also reviewed the evolving regional peace and security scenario. They reiterated their shared interest in a peaceful and stable Afghanistan. Prime Minister Khan hoped for an early resumption of the Afghan peace and reconciliation process while underlining that there was no military solution to the Afghan conflict. Building on the Prime Minister's successful visit to Washington in July 2019, the two leaders expressed the resolve to expedite progress in the mutually prioritized areas of trade, investment and energy cooperation.

Prime Minister Imran Khan met President Recep Tayyip Erdogan on the sidelines of 74th session of the UN General Assembly in New York on 23rd September 2019. Recalling his visit to Turkey in January 2019, the Prime Minister expressed satisfaction that Pakistan-Turkey bilateral relations had transformed into a mutually beneficial strategic partnership. Prime Minister Imran Khan thanked President Erdogan for Turkey's consistent support to Pakistan on issues of core national interest, and reaffirmed Pakistan's steadfast support to Turkey on issues of its national interest. The Prime Minister emphasized the importance of

further strengthening the bilateral economic partnership and expressed the hope that the recently finalized Strategic Economic Framework (SEF) would play an instrumental role in this regard. The Prime Minister added that he looked forward to President Erdogan's visit to Pakistan for the next round of Pakistan-Turkey High Level Strategic Cooperation Council (HLSSC). The Prime Minister briefed the Turkish President on the latest situation since India's illegal and unilateral actions of 5th August to alter the disputed status of Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir. He stated that India's efforts to change IOJ&K's demographic structure contravened numerous UNSC resolutions, international law as well as India's own prior commitments. The Prime Minister emphasized that the dire human rights and humanitarian situation in IOJ&K posed grave risks for peace and security in the region. In this context, he called for the immediate

lifting of curfew and other restrictions in IOJ&K; end to gross violations of human rights; and allowing the Kashmiris their inalienable right to self-determination as enshrined in the relevant UN Security Council resolutions. During the meeting the leaders recalled the historic fraternal ties between the two nations and reiterated their strong resolve to continue standing by each other in the face of all challenges

Prime Minister Imran Khan met Prime Minister of the United Kingdom Boris Johnson on the sidelines of 74th Session of the UN General Assembly in New York. The two leaders discussed a wide range of bilateral, regional and multilateral issues of mutual interest. Prime Minister Imran Khan apprised Prime Minister Boris Johnson of the latest situation in IOJ&K and underlined the need for the international community to play its role in helping address the dire human rights and humanitarian situation and its attendant consequences. Specifically, the Prime Minister underscored the importance for urgent lifting of the curfew and other restrictions, averting any dangers to peace and security, and facilitating peaceful resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute. Prime Minister Boris Johnson conveyed that the UK remained cognisant of the situation and would continue to be engaged. The leaders agreed to remain in close contact. The two Prime Ministers exchanged views on other regional developments including Afghan peace and reconciliation process. On bilateral relations, both Prime Ministers agreed to enhance cooperation in diverse areas, including political, trade and economic fields.

Vice President of Indonesia Muhammad Jusuf Kalla met with Prime Minister Imran Khan on the sidelines of 74th session of the UNGA in New York. Recalling Indonesian President Joko Widodo's visit to Pakistan last year, Prime Minister Imran Khan expressed satisfaction over the growth of fraternal ties and substantive collaboration between the two countries in diverse fields. Recalling the UNSC meeting on the situation in IOJ &K last month, the Prime Minister appreciated the decision of members of the Security Council, including Indonesia as a non-permanent member, to prioritize Kashmir on UNSC agenda in view of Indian illegal and unilateral actions. The Prime Minister and the Vice President also exchanged views on matters related to peace and reconciliation in Afghanistan and underlined the importance of successful culmination of the process. The two sides also agreed to further strengthen bilateral trade ties and take steps to deepen mutual economic engagement.

Prime Minister Imran Khan met Prime Minister of Malaysia Tun Dr. Mahathir Bin Mohamad on the sidelines of 74th Session of UN General Assembly in New York. Recalling Prime Minister Mahatir Muhammad's visit to Pakistan in March 2019, Prime Minister Imran Khan expressed the desire to deepen bilateral ties through

It may be recalled that Prime Minister Mahathir had issued a statement supporting a just and durable solution of the Kashmir dispute through relevant UNSC resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir

sidelines of 74th Session of the UN General Assembly in New York. The two leaders discussed a wide range of bilateral, regional and multilateral issues of mutual interest. Prime Minister Imran Khan briefed the Norwegian Prime Minister on the current situation in the Indian occupied Jammu and Kashmir entailing grave risks for peace and security. The Prime Minister also highlighted belligerent statements by Indian political and military figure as well as their allegations of "terrorists" seeking to cross over and stressed that these were meant to stage some false flag operation and further escalate the tensions. The Prime Minister underscored the need for urgent steps by the international community to help alleviate

September 23, 2019. the sufferings of the Kashmiri people subjected to inhuman lockdown for 7 weeks. The Prime Minister stressed the importance attached in Pakistan's foreign policy to a qualitatively new relationship with the Russian Federation. He expressed satisfaction at the steady growth of bilateral cooperation in diverse areas including political, trade, energy, investment, security and defence fields. The Prime Minister recalled his interaction with President Putin on the sidelines of SCO Council of Heads of State in Bishkek on 13 June 2019 and extensive exchange of views on bilateral as well as regional and international issues. He reiterated his invitation for President Putin to visit Pakistan. The Prime Minister noted that Pakistan and Russia had maintained close contact following the unilateral and illegal Indian actions of 5 August in Occupied Jammu & Kashmir. He emphasized that the stalled peace process must be resumed at the earliest to advance the objectives of peaceful, stable and prosperous Afghanistan. The Prime Minister underscored the importance of both sides consulting each other on all issues of common interest Prime Minister Imran Khan met Prime Minister of New Zealand, Rt Hon Jacinda

Ardern, on the sidelines of 74th Session of the UN General Assembly in New York. relations.

Noting that the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights had comprehensively documented the previous gross human rights violations by India in Kashmir, the Prime Minister underlined that India's recent actions represented a new chapter of intensified human rights abuses. The Prime Minister highlighted the risks to regional peace and security that arose from India's illegal and irresponsible actions, underscoring the responsibility of the UN and international community to take urgent steps to save lives and help resolve the long-standing Jammu & Kashmir dispute. The Secretary General reiterated his deep concern over the human rights and humanitarian situation in Indian occupied Jammu & Kashmir, reaffirmed that he would remain engaged on the issue and conveyed that his offer to help facilitate a peaceful solution continued to stand.

Statement by H.E. Mr. Mahmoud Abbas President of the State of Palestine AT United Nations General Assembly 74th Session

n the name of God, the most Merciful and Beneficent

Excellency, Mr. Tijjani Muhammad-Bande, President of the United Nations General Assembly, Excellency, Mr. Antonio Guterres, Secretary-General of the United Nations, Ladies and Gentlemen, Heads and Members of Distinguished Delegations Peace, Mercy and Blessings of God be upon you.

A week before the recent Israeli elections, Israel's Prime Minister, Netanyahu, came out to arrogantly announce that should he prevail in the election, he would annex and apply Israeli sovereignty to the Jordan Valley, northern Dead Sea, and Israel's colonial settlements despite the fact that all these areas are occupied Palestinian territory. We reject entirely and completely this illegal plan. Our response, if any Israeli Government is to proceed with this plan, all signed agreements with the government of the occupation and any obligations therein will be terminated, in line with the previous decisions we have taken in this regard. And, it is our right to defend our rights by all possible means, regardless of consequences, while remaining committed to international law and combating terrorism, and our hands will remain extended for peace.

In this regard, I thank all leaders, countries, and international organizations that condemned and rejected this declaration and Israel's illegal settlement activities as a whole, which constitute serious violations of UN resolutions and grave breaches of international law. Moreover, all have reaffirmed that the Palestine question remains a central question for the international community.

I ask you, ladies and gentlemen: what would you do if someone tried take the land of your country and tried to erase your presence in it? It is time for the international community to uphold its responsibilities to bring an end to this Israeli aggression and arrogance.

I had hoped to come to you this year to proclaim together the end of this occupation, the Israeli occupation of my homeland, Palestine. But, regrettably, I stand before you today bearing the same miseries and pain that has been endured for so long by my people, who, despite all that they have suffered of injustice, oppression and occupation - still hold on to the hope of achieving their freedom and independence, as all other nations of the world.

I ask you once again: hasn't the time come for the emancipation of the Palestinian people and their freedom from this injustice, oppression and occupation?

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your august Assembly granted the State of Palestine observer State status in the United Nations in 2012. We are grateful for this legal and moral stance, and we thank you for your principled position in support of our collective, just demands to end the Israeli occupation of the land of the State of Palestine and to actualize its full and complete independence on the 4 June 1967 borders, along with a just and lasting solution to the question of the Palestine refugees, whose plight has been tragically prolonged, in conformity with the relevant UN resolutions and the Arab Peace Initiative, which affirmed the two-State solution: the State of Palestine and the State of Israel.

We also convey our deep appreciation to all countries and peoples that continue to provide support and solidarity to our people and our country, politically and economically, aimed at ending the occupation and

building our national institutions, in addition to their continued support to the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA), pending a just and comprehensive solution to the plight our refugees in line with international law.

We are proud that the State of Palestine, despite the obstacles and policies imposed by the Israeli occupation and those behind it, has become a full member in, and a State party to, over 110 international instruments and organizations. It has received the recognition of 140 States from around the world, and is chairing the Group of 77 and China this year. It continues to competently assume its responsibilities at the regional and international levels, as a resilient and constructive member of the international family, and deserves to be a full member of the United Nations and all of its bodies and agencies.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We accepted international legitimacy and international law as the framework and judgement to resolve our cause, and we have strived for and continue to seek a just and comprehensive peace. But, the international law that we have accepted and held firm to and the peace that we strive for are now severely endangered as a result of the policies and practices of Israel in our occupied land and its reneging on signed agreements since the Oslo accords in 1993 to the present. The responsibility for defending and preserving international law and peace is incumbent upon you.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

In East Jerusalem, the occupying Power is waging a reckless, racist war against everything Palestinian, from the confiscation and demolition of homes, to assaults on clergy, to the eviction of our citizens from their homes, to attempts to violate the sanctity of the holy Al-Aqsa Mosque and Church of the Holy Sepulchre, to the legislation of racist laws, to the denial of access by worshippers to the holy places.

I caution against these policies and reckless measures, which will lead to dangerous consequences with unfathomable implications. Who can accept the continuation of such daily aggressions against our people or accept the continuation of such grave violations of international law?

We are confident that the international community will not accept Israel's arbitrary decision to withhold our revenues, and to confiscate a part of it, which is deepening the suffering of our people and preventing us from fulfilling our financial obligations towards them and also exacerbate the economic crisis our country is enduring due to a lack of resources and the decision by some parties and countries to suspend their commitments towards us.

Yet, the Palestinian people will not surrender to the Israeli occupation regardless of the circumstances, and no matter the pain, and will remain steadfast on their land, resisting occupation by all available means, foremost peaceful popular resistance. This is our legitimate right and our national and moral obligation. Let everyone know that occupation cannot bring peace or security or stability for anyone.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

What is unfortunate and shocking is that the US administration – a permanent member of the Security Council that is responsible for the maintenance of international peace and security and uphold UN resolutions – is supporting the Israeli aggression against us, reneging on its international political, legal and moral obligations. The US administration has undertaken extremely aggressive and unlawful measures, declaring Jerusalem as the so-called "capital of Israel" and moving its embassy there, and in blatant provocation to the sensitivities of hundreds of millions of Muslims and Christians, for whom Jerusalem is a central part of their religious faith.

Jerusalem will remain the eternal capital of Palestine regardless of any such schemes or

actions.

The US administration did not stop there, but also decided to close the representation of the Palestine Liberation Organization in Washington, and some its officials have claimed that the Israeli settlements on our occupied territory are "legitimate". Moreover, it immorally and inhumanely terminated all of its contributions to UNRWA.

Then, it somehow speaks of the so-called "Deal of the century", and peddles deceptive and illusive economic "solutions", after it destroyed by its policies and measures all possibilities to achieve peace.

This US policy has emboldened the government of the Israeli occupation to renege all signed agreements with us and its commitments towards peace, depriving the peace process of any credibility, pushing large segments of the Palestinian people to lose hope in the possibility of long-awaited peace, and jeopardizing the two-State solution.

This has led many to seriously question: if the two-State solution has become impossible because of Israel's policies, then why don't we pursue a one-state solution where all citizens can be fairly treated and are equal in rights and duties?

Here, I must ask you: How can I answer these questions raised by the people? How can one fulfill reciprocal commitments that the other side is not abiding by? And despite all of this, I remain committed to the two-State solution.

From our side, we have never missed an opportunity to hold serious negotiations with the Israeli side. We have constructively engaged with all initiatives proposed and based on UN resolutions and international law. However, regrettably, we have not found an Israeli partner, and found instead obstacles and challenges imposed by the Israeli government that continues to refuse to come to the negotiating table.

Despite all this, ladies and gentlemen, I renew the call for the convening of an international peace conference in line with the initiative I presented before the Security Council in February 2018. This peace conference should include permanent members of the Security Council, the members of the Quartet as well as relevant Arab and international stakeholders, to adopt a plan based on the international consensus, UN resolutions and the Arab Peace Initiative, within a defined timeframe, to end the occupation, achieve the independence of our State and end the conflict. We cannot accept that the shepherding of peace be monopolized by one country.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

From the outset, we have believed in democracy as a foundation for the building of our State and society. We have enshrined this in our constitution and exercised this on the ground. We conducted general elections in 1996, 2005 and 2006, in addition to regular local elections. However, this democratic process was paralyzed by the coup by Hamas in 2007, which is an unbearable situation. Therefore, I have decided, upon my return from this international gathering, to announce a date for the holding of general elections in Palestine in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem and the Gaza Strip. I call on the UN and the relevant international organizations to monitor these elections, and I will attribute full responsibility to those who may attempt to prevent it from happening on the date determined.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We once again reaffirm our condemnation of terrorism in its all forms and sources. In this context, we strongly condemn the terror attacks against the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and other Arab States, particularly the recent attacks against oil facilities in the Kingdom. We reaffirm our unwavering support to our brothers.

In conclusion, I salute all our Palestinian people in Palestine, in the refugee camps and diaspora and across the world and express our pride in them. I tell them: we are confident that this occupation, like all occupation that preceded it, will inevitably end; that the dawn of freedom and independence is coming; and that the oppression and aggression they have endured for so long will not last. A right is never lost as long as someone strives to claim it.

We salute our honorable martyrs, courageous prisoners and wounded heroes, and salute their resilient families who we will not give up on their rights. We salute to those remaining steadfast in our beloved homeland. The date of our freedom and the independence of State with its eternal capital Al-Quds is soon approaching.

Pakistan Keen to diversify ties with Czech Republic

Pakistan-Saudi ties reaffirmed; Prime Minister lays strong emphasis on Kashmir solution

Prime Minister Imran Khan, during his visit to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, held wideranging talks with the Saudi leadership. The Prime Minister held separate meetings with His Royal Highness Crown Prince, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defence Mohamed Bin Salman and the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques His Majesty King Salman bin Abdul Aziz Al-Saud. The Prime Minister was accompanied by a high-level delegation including Foreign Minister Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi, Adviser to the Prime Minister on Finance Dr. Abdul Hafeez Sheikh, Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on Overseas Pakistanis Sayed Zulfiqar Abbas Bukhari and other senior officials.

Extending a warm welcome to the Prime Minister, the Saudi leadership underscored that the relationship between Saudi Arabia and Pakistan is based on "real brotherhood". The two sides underlined the deep and multi-faceted quality of the relationship and reaffirmed the resolve to enrich it further in myriad dimensions.

The Prime Minister reiterated Pakistan's strong condemnation of the recent attacks on oil installations in Abgaig and Khurais and reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to Saudi Arabia against any threat to its security and territorial integrity. Prime Minister Imran Khan underscored, in detail, the dire human rights and humanitarian situation in the Indian Occupied Jammu & Kashmir and the grave risks posed to peace and security in the aftermath of India's illegal and unilateral actions of 5 August and its irresponsible and belligerent rhetoric and actions. Noting that the indefensible lockdown of over 8 million Kashmiris had continued for 46 days, the Prime Minister stressed the imperative of urgent lifting of the curfew and restrictions, respect for the rights and freedoms of the Kashmiris, and resolution of the Kashmir dispute in accordance with the UN Security Council Resolutions. The Prime Minister also highlighted the pivotal role that OIC's consistent support for the Kashmir cause has played.

The Saudi leadership expressed concern over the situation and reiterated its steadfast support and solidarity for the Kashmir cause. It was agreed to continue to work together for peace, security and a peaceful resolution.

On the bilateral plane, the Prime Minister recalled the historic visit of His Royal Highness Crown Prince Mohamed bin Salman to Pakistan in February 2019 and noted that it had imparted a strong momentum to the growth trajectory of the relationship. The two sides reiterated the resolve to further intensify bilateral trade, energy, investment and people-to-people contacts. The Prime Minister conveyed sincere gratitude for Pakistan's inclusion in the Road-To-Makkah Project and hoped for its extension to other major cities in Pakistan.

This is Prime Minister Imran Khan's fourth visit to Saudi Arabia since assuming office in August 2018. His last visit was in May 2019 to attend the 14th Session of the OIC Islamic Summit in Makkah.

The long-standing Pakistan-Saudi fraternal ties are marked by trust, understanding, mutual support and standing by each other. Saudi Arabia hosts the largest number of Pakistani diaspora anywhere in the world. Saudi Arabia is among the founding members of the OIC Contact Group on Jammu & Kashmir. The two countries have established the Saudi-Pak Supreme Coordination Council (SPSCC), co-chaired by the Prime Minister and the Crown Prince. Its next session is due to be held in February 2020.



Saudi National Day and kingdom's 'giant renaissance' celebrated in grand ceremony

The diplomatic mission headed by the Saudi envoy to Pakistan hosted a grand ceremony at a luxury hotel in the capital, Islamabad, to commemorate Saudi national day on Tuesday evening, and called it a celebration of Saudi Arabia's "giant renaissance" under the guidance of the kingdom's leadership.

Natively called Youm Al-Watani, the national day is celebrated annually on September 23 to commemorate the establishment of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in 1932 by its founder, King Abdulaziz bin Saud. A large number of foreign diplomats, Pakistani officials, dignitaries, parliamentarians, journalists, and senior military officials were in attendance.

Saudi envoy Nawaf Saeed Al-Malkiy, said the relationship between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia had been further strengthened in the last year, and that the visit of Saudi crown prince Mohammed bin Salman to Pakistan in February, had "enhanced the strength of the relationship between the two brotherly countries.

n view of the recent developments in New York wherein the international community almost ignored the Kashmir Issue and despite all efforts Pakistan could not file a request to table a resolution in United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) on Kashmir. Similarly Pakistan has not yet moved any resolution to UN for time line for plebiscite.

Now having lost chance to go to UNHRC because of the lacking of required 16 votes despite the fact that we failed to win support of 15 members of Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) who are the permanent members of the IHRC. It seems that effective diplomatic home work was not strategized to formulate the multiple diplomatic options to pursue the Kashmir issue in United Nations prior to the visit of Prime Minister Imran Khan to the USA for attending the 74th Session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA).

Pakistan not only lost the chance to table Kashmir Issue in UNGA but also failed to convince UNO to implement its own passed resolutions on Kashmir for self-determination or to even announce any deadline for plebiscite.

Pakistan should have convinced the member states to manage the required number of votes for tabling the Resolution in UNHRC and the United Nations to refer the matter to ICJ against Indian government for the crimes against humanity being committed by Indian Army troops under direct command of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

It is unfortunate to note that the time when Pakistan is supposed to exercise all options available to ensure that [the] HRC takes meaningful actions on the ground situation in Kashmir," we just failed to submit a draft resolution over Kashmir issue at the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) before the scheduled deadline which was due on Sept 19th. In order to bewail our incompetency, I have written an open letter to the Prime Minister Imran Khan asking him to deal with the situation tactfully as only the frenzy emotions or aggressive postures are not going to help here. The human Butcher namely Modi needs to be dragged directly into the International Criminal Court under Rome Statute where war criminals like him are tried without impunity.

I feel that as a last resort, this option is still left with Pakistan to drag PM Modi in International Criminal Court under Rome Convention and in this regard I have written this open letter to Prime Minister Imran Khan with the Request to avail the third and the only option left with Pakistan, which is reproduced here for the information of a common man.

Dear Prime Minister Imran Khan,

I would like to point out that it is widely known

that country is passing through the testing times after the 5th August, 20019 when Indian Government illegally and contrary to International Laws and UN resolutions revoked Article 370 and 35A setting aside the United Nations Security Councils resolutions and simultaneously curfew was imposed in Indian Occupied Kashmir which is continued till the date and it is the 54th of caging the oppressed Kashmiri and the voice of Kashmiri is still unheard as rightly started by the PM Imran Khan in one of his pressers.

The special status of Kashmir has already been scraped by India which has empowered India to make demographic changes through ethnic cleansing.

There is no doubt that the conspiracy engineered by India through blame game ultimately resulted in placement of Pakistan in FATF's grey list that is one of the component of hybrid war being backed by India. The placement of Pakistan in FATF grey list has affected the inflow of foreign Investment in Pakistan and the International Financial Institutions like International Monitory Fund (IMF), World Bank, Asian Bank etc. have made the terms and conditions more complicated to avoid Loans to Pakistan.

Without going into the blame game, I would like to state that over the last few decades Pakistan has been pushed into isolation by well-planned Indian lobbying at diplomatic front. That is why Pakistan could not secure even 16 votes by member states to file a request for a resolution on Kashmiris at the United Nations Human Rights Counsel Geneva. Evidently we missed the opportunity to drag India and expose the brutalities of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Kashmir through IHRC.

Mr. Prime Minister! You have expressed in one of your pressers at New York that "To be absolutely frank, I am a bit disappointed by the international community. There is no pressure on Narendra Modi to lift the siege".

This statement of yours is enough to prove the intentional silence of International Community over the sufferings of oppressed Kashmiris in Indian Occupied Kashmir.

Mr. Prime Minster, Your speech today in United Nations without having a resolution either for the demand for a specific date of plebiscite or to table the resolution in UNHRC will not yield any specific relief for Kashmiris. I propose you to please appeal to the entire International community to force PM Modi to give commitment here to lift the curfew within 48 hours now that the second chance to bring India in ICJ has been lost and Modi managed his way out as a Chief of RSS.

Now I would like to invite your attention to the only option left for Pakistan and Kashmir to move the matter to the International Criminal Court under the Rome Statute where in the oppressed Kashmiri victims through the representatives in Azad Kashmir and other parts of the world would come forward to file this petition in ICC to drag PM Modi as War criminal and you have very rightly stated that PM Modi is a war criminal. I have already advocated my point of view in Senate Standing Committee for foreign Affairs in the presence of our Foreign Minister and meeting with Foreign Secretary Foreign Affairs.

I had even handed over the procedure of filing petition to him in the presence of prominent

Kashmiri leaders. The procedure for referring the case to the ICC under Rome statute is as under:-

"Preliminary examinations

Any individual, group or State can send information to the OTP regarding alleged crimes falling under the jurisdiction of the Court. To date, the OTP has received more that 12,000 of such communications, which can form the initial basis of the Office's preliminary examinations.

The OTP conducts a preliminary examination to decide whether there is a reasonable basis to initiate an investigation". (Extracted from the "Office of the Prosecutor" ICC)

In view of above, I as Former Interior Minister and as a responsible citizen of Pakistan recommend your good office to immediately direct the Law Ministry to make the necessary legal formalities and move the matter in support of a petition from Kashmiris to International Criminal Court immediately.

Mr. Prime Minister we have lost already two opportunities for his unprecedented brutalities against the Innocent Kashmiris in terms of mass murders, mass blinding, enforced disappearances, torture, rape, political repression and suppression of freedom of speech and long sieged of the whole valley making it the world largest cage since August 5, 2019. We need to drag PM Modi as war criminal and for that I am at the disposal of the Law Ministry, MOFA and Kashmir Committee to assist in getting the petition materialized in shortest possible time. The charge sheet is already available in the form of International Human rights report 2018 on IHK

I am writing this letter purely in the national interest and to pullout the Kashmiri Brothers and Sisters from the cage in Kashmir where PM Modi is doing ethnic cleansing and demographic changes without any fear through Indian Army and inhabiting the terrorists of RSS and fanatics of Hindutva. Let's bring Prime Minster Narendra Modi to justice before he changes the demography of Kashmir through RSS, RAW and Indian Army.

I offer my assistance to the Law ministry in the task of completing the formalities and provide the requisite substantive evidence against PM Modi.

I hope and wish that the international community answers your call positively in favor of oppressed Kashmiri women and children under curfew suffering without medical care & food.



Speakers at an event here said Pakistan and China would stand shoulder to shoulder during every internal and external challenge. They praised the role of China over the issue of Kashmir and thanked it for the continuous support to the people of Kashmir who have been facing atrocities in the hands of Indian forces. Speaking on the occasion, Chinese Ambassador Yao Jing said China was also celebrating the seven decades of friendship with Pakistan. He said China would continue supporting Pakistan for getting justice for the people of Kashmir. "Pakistan is most sustained friend of China and it supported us over every issue. Head of Pak China Institute Mushahid Hussain Sved said both the countries had very close relations and always supported each other. "We are not only neighbours but our hearts also beat together. I suggest that there should be continuity of policies because that is how China has progressed," he said.



China's National Day parade, as it happened

he People's Republic of China celebrated its 70th anniversary with a massive military parade in Tiananmen Square. In all, 15,000 troops, more than 160 aircraft and 580 active weapon systems will be on show in an event designed to showcase the country's cutting-edge defence technology. But the parade will be about more than projecting China's military might - it will promote an image of national unity and President Xi Jinping's achievements in modernising the People's Liberation Army. The event is expected to begin with Xi delivering a speech to the nation before inspecting the troops. The last parade float features a flower basket emblazoned with the words "Long live the motherland". On the float are the members of the World Cup-winning Chinese women's volleyball team. Hundreds of pigeons and balloons are released, bringing the parade to an end.

Congratulating China on its anniversary, North





Korean leader Kim Jong-un said his country would "stand by" its neighbour.

"Our party, government and people fully support the Chinese [Communist] Party, government and people in their struggle to defend the stability and the core interests of the country and achieve sustained development," Kim was quoted by state-run Korean Central News Agency as saying. "We will always stand by them on the path of defending and glorifying socialism." This year also marks the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between the two neighbours. Leaders from Vietnam, including President Nguyen Phú Trong, have congratulated China on its 70th anniversary, adding that they hope the two countries will resolve their tensions.

Vietnam said it hoped the two countries would "control and satisfactorily settle existing issues on the basis of respect for each other's legitimate interests and in line with international law". A series of colourful parade floats feature each of China's provinces and regions, beginning with the capital Beijing. Northern province Hebei prominently featured Xiongan New Area, which was established by Xi to help integrate Beijing, Tianjin, and Hebei. The float for Liaoning, in China's northeast, was particularly eye-catching with a winged metallic robot at its helm.

Sichuan, in the country's southwestern region, naturally featured giant pandas.

The "one country, two systems" contingent is also appearing for the first time in a National








Day parade.

Marchers carried placards forming the words: "Hong Kong's tomorrow will be better".

Parade pays tribute to the late revolutionaries of the Communist Party. It includes one contingent with a giant portrait of Mao Zedong followed by another with a portrait of Deng Xiaoping.Independent political scientist Chen Daoyin says Xi's speech this morning was concise and comprehensive. The tone was less confrontational, especially compared to his speech in early September where he emphasised the need for "struggle". Chen says this is mainly because the parade is considered an event for celebration and Xi is trying to send a message of unity. The J-20A also featured in the military fly-past. This is the PLA Air Force's first stealth fighter jet to rival the United States' F-22. Military insiders say China's aircraft engineers have been developing






a shorter version of the J-20 for use on aircraft carriers, replacing the J-15. The military parade - the biggest since the founding of the People's Republic - has just ended after about 80 minutes. It will be followed by a 100,000-strong civilian parade, featuring 70 floats.

The procession will be divided into three parts representing three eras in the history of the People's Republic: the nation's founding under late chairman Mao Zedong, the reform and opening up under late paramount leader Deng Xiaoping, and the "great rejuvenation" under Xi Jinping. China's heavyweight H-6 bombers make their fly-past, with the H-6K, H-6N and the HU-6 refuelling aircraft all on show. The H-6 was designed as a medium-range bomber, but in the latest incarnation - the H-6K - the bomb bay was removed to allow for greater fuel storage and a longer range. Instead, the bomber carries cruise missiles, each with a range of more than 2,000km, under its wings. The parade is the first time the public has seen various DF series missiles, including the DF-17, DF-100 and DF-41.

The DF-17 missiles have the capacity to strike the US mainland. Defence ministry spokesman Senior Colonel Wu Qian said ahead of the parade that the grand show of military troops and weaponry was not intended as a show of muscle.







The 70th Anniversary of the Founding Republic of China

remarks, spoke high of Sino-Pak friendship spanned over the last seven decades and said Pakistan was the first country which established diplomatic relations with China.


He said with Pakistan being a best friend of China, the two countries stood together in economic development, promotion of peace and stability in the region and the eradication of poverty.

n March 19, 2019, State Councilor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi and Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi of Pakistan held the first China-Pakistan Foreign Ministers' Strategic Dialogue and jointly met the press in Beijing.

The two countries have strengthened strategic communication, deepened mutually beneficial cooperation, and forged a closer China-Pakistan community with a shared future in the new era, which not only conforms to the common interests of the two countries and the two peoples, but is also conducive to regional peace, stability and prosperity.

We agreed that the two sides should continue firmly sticking to mutual support on issues concerning each other's core interests and major concerns. No matter how the international and regional situation might evolve, the Chinese side will unswervingly support the Pakistani side in safeguarding its national sovereignty and national dignity, steadfastly support the Pakistani side in independently choosing a development path that is suitable to its national conditions, firmly support the Pakistani side in achieving its national stability, development and prosperity, and sturdily support the Pakistani side in playing a more constructive role in regional and international affairs.

We agreed to maintain the momentum of high-level exchanges. The Chinese side warmly welcomes Prime Minister Imran Khan to attend the second Belt and Road Forum for International Cooperation and the International Horticultural Exhibition in China. The two sides will well plan other high-level exchanges to provide sustained impetus for the development of bilateral relations.

We agreed to actively advance the construction of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). The two sides will jointly ensure the sustainable operation of the established projects of the CPEC to provide strong support for the economic take-off of Pakistan. Both sides will well plan and implement industrial parks and new projects in social livelihood to create a new engine for the sustainable development of Pakistan. The two sides will take forceful measures to well safeguard the safe environment for the construction of the CPEC.

We agreed to enhance counter-terrorism and security cooperation. The Chinese side appreciates the strong counter-terrorism measures Pakistan has recently taken within the country, and fully supports the Pakistani side in following through on its commitment to counter-terrorism actions. The international community should treat Pakistan's longterm commitment to and effort in combating terrorism in an impartial manner.

We agreed that a peaceful and stable South Asia conforms to the common interests of all regional countries, and is also the common expectation of the international community. The Chinese side appreciates the constructive efforts made by the Pakistani side to ease the situation, and calls upon Pakistan and India to exercise restraint and resolve differences through dialogue and peaceful means. The Charter of the United Nations and the norms of international law should be earnestly observed. We agreed to support the inclusive reconciliation process of "Afghan-owned and Afghan-led", and encourage the Afghan Taliban to join Afghanistan's peace and reconciliation negotiation at an early date. The Chinese side appreciates the important role played by the Pakistani side in this regard. The Chinese side and the Pakistani side will strengthen the China-Afghanistan-Pakistan Foreign Ministers' Dialogue mechanism, further give play to the potential of this mechanism, and carry out more communication and cooperation with the Afghan side.

Shah Mahmood Qureshi totally agreed with Wang Yi, and congratulated on the 70th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China. He believed that China will make greater development achievements in the future. Shah Mahmood Qureshi expressed that Pakistan and China are all-weather strategic cooperative partners. All Pakistani people are committed to promoting the construction of the CPEC, and expanding bilateral cooperation in various fields. Prime Minister Imran Khan looks forward to attending the second Belt and Road Forum for International Cooperation in China to push Pakistan-China relations for more positive outcomes.

CPEC Shelved?

Publish in THe News

The \$50 billion worth China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects launched amidst lot of fan fare by the PML-N government and they soon became so expedient that practically all political parties lined to take its credit.

Some analysts laid credit of the CPEC projects with the former dictator Gen (retd) Pervaiz Musharraf and the military leadership. It became so sacrosanct afterwards that mere objecting to the project would invite the label of treachery against the country. But then the pendulum swung the other way. After the inauguration of the PTI's government into the office, the projects first came under scathing criticism of Minister for Trade Razzag Daud and then Minister for Communication Murad Saeed who accused PML-N's Ahsan Igbal of involvement in misappropriations in some CPEC projects and then all of them came to a seemingly grinding halt.

Now it has become a forgone conclusion that the CPEC projects have been shelved

for all practical purposes. The former spokesman of Balochistan government's Jan Muhammad Buledi told Deutsche Welle the incumbent government does not accord any priority to CPEC. Buledi said no progress was witnessed on the CPEC projects for Balochistan in the last one year adding the projects have seemingly been frozen. No development has been undertaken on the land acquired for Gwadar Airport, he said and added same goes with the 300MW electricity generation plant in Gwadar that was to be built by China for which land was also acquired but the development work is yet to start. Gwadar Port remains similarly frozen.

Various circles feel the Chinese leadership is upset with the corruption allegations of the incumbent government. One of the government officials on condition of anonymity told Deutsche Welle (DW) the Chinese have practically stopped funding for the project, especially after Ministers Razak Dawood and Murad Saeed leveled charges of corruption. He said previously the Chinese used to release loans first and later would ask for procurements, but now they first demand procurement and there is no certainty if any funding would be released for it. And how could the government undertake procurement when they do not have funds. This shows that the CPEC projects are practically over and if at all there is any forward movement worth the name it will be extremely slow.

Some politicians believe that while the allegations of corruption did frustrate the Chinese but some of them believe that certain external powers want the CPEC projects to be slowed or altogether scrapped. PPP's leader and Deputy Chairman Senate Saleem Mandviwala said when the PPP started these projects they faced immense international pressure against launching them but it did not abandon them. Mandviwala said the former president Asif Ali Zardari visited China on 13 occasions and developed trust and confidence with the leadership. He said the incumbent government is trying to keep both US and China happy which

is impossible. The incompetency of the PTI government has given China more reason to be dismayed and in this situation the remaining projects would continue to remain on the back burner.

Many analysts also similarly believe the external pressures are playing a major role in Pakistan back pedaling over the CPEC projects. Suhail Chaudhry, a columnist from Lahore, thinks the CPEC projects would miss deadlines primarily due to to stern conditionalities of the IMF, World Bank and the US. America and the other western powers do not want Pakistan to complete the CPEC projects. Pakistan's plight is compounded by the financial crunch and the IMF package. If Islamabad is unable to achieve the revenue targets the IMF would not release its next tranche sending Pakistan to desperately seek the US help for the IMF funding. At this stage Washington would invoke the CPEC conditions forcing Pakistan with no other option but to slow down the projects, but Pakistan cannot afford to scrap these projects, he said.

An source in the Ministry of Communications confided to DW that several important projects have been put on hold. Development work has stopped on the Karachi-Sukkur motorway. Similarly the Dera Ismail Khan to Balochistan Wester Route has also been abandoned. Work on several critical motorway projects including the Orange Lines and Green Lines project has also been stopped, causing Pakistan to miss its chance of major development, China in the situation is not overly hurt, he said.

Another prevailing popular perception is that the PTI has sacrificed CPEC at the altar of the US regional policies to cultivate Washington on its side. Senior PTI leader Ishaq Khakwani rejected the perception and cited the example of Malaysia. He said negotiations do take place following change of governments on the format of payments and other relevant areas but it is unthinkable that the PTI government would drop the CPEC projects altogether.

CPEC projects picking up pace: Ministry

ISLAMABAD: Apropos news item titled "CPEC Shelved?" published in The News in its edition of September 19, 2019 wherein it has been erroneously reported that the work on China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project is being scrapped or frozen. Rather than being shelved, the pace of the flagship project between the two friendly countries has picked up after the incumbent government came into power.

The Ministry of Planning, Development & Reform in a statement clarified that:- CPEC was planned to be completed in three phases. The first phase of CPEC was to remove key economic bottlenecks namely energy and infrastructure. The current phase is about industrialization, socioeconomic and agricultural cooperation and promoting business and consolidating developments.

In the first stage substantial work has been done. For instance, in the road category, a total of 1544 km have been constructed and 1456 km are under construction. In the energy sector, 5320MW of electricity has been added to the national grid while work on 7 projects with 4170MW power projects is nearing completion. Additional projects of 2844MW are planned. Also, cross border optical fiber project which stretches over 820 km linking Khunjrab to Rawalpindi has already been completed.

Regarding development in Gwadar, 10 projects in infrastructure and social sector development have either been completed or under construction. Among the completed projects, Gwadar port is functional. Most importantly, the Gwadar Smart Port City Master Plan for the integrated development of the city has been approved on 23 August, 2019 and ready for implementation. Moreover, tax concessions and investment incentives issue which was lingering since 2016 has been resolved which will enhance economic activity in Gwadar. The country's largest airport, the New Gwadar International Airport groundbreaking was held on March 29, 2019 by the Prime Minister.

Currently the focus is on industrialization, socio-economic development, agriculture modernization, blue economy and tourism promotion. Framework Agreements on Industrial cooperation, Agriculture and socio-economic development have been signed in November 2018. Development of three special SEZs is on the priority namely; Rashakai, M3 Faisalabad and Dhabeji Thatta. Concession Agreement with CRBC for the Rashakai SEZ was signed in April 2019 and its groundbreaking of the zone is expected in early October. As the major obstacle in the establishment of these SEZs was to provide utilities to the Zone, the current government has agreed to provide the utilities at zero point through its own resources.

In the social sector development, 27 projects in the area of education, health, agriculture, poverty alleviation, agriculture and water supply have been identified of which 17 are on priority list and will be completed in this phase. For the MLI project, financing committee has been constituted to expedite work on the ML1 Project. Negotiations for petro chemical plant, refinery and gas pipeline are also ongoing.

It is evident that CPEC is on track and enjoying the full backing of the two countries. The roll back or slowing down of this flagship initiative is mere propaganda which is not based on ground reality and facts.

Therefore, the news item is not based on facts and lacks veracity. Further, such baseless news also carries the risk of creating ambiguities and confusion regarding this all important framework between the two friendly countries

Heritage Buildings

A walk along the Tianhe promenade — a pedestrian area just north of the Pearl River in the Central Business District — connects you with many of the city's contemporary architectural highlights.

Head to Huacheng Square to take in the Zaha Hadid Architects-designed Guangzhou Library, the funky Guangdong Museum, the towering International Finance Centre and, across the river, the twisting Canton Tower — home to the world's third-highest observation center and tallest Ferris wheel. It's a little bit touristy, but the transparent cabins tracing the roof's periphery provide soaring views over the city.

Buzzing Markets

You can't go to Guangzhou without checking out the thriving shopping scene. From dried foods (used in traditional Chinese medicine) in the Qingping Medicine Market to fashionable finds at Liuhua wholesale market, Guangzhou is a shopper's paradise.

To get a taste of the local style, explore a main retail district like Shangxiajiu Pedestrian Street or Beijing Road Pedestrian Street in the evening, where you'll encounter street food hawkers, fast fashion and outposts from big-name international brands like Nike.

The Huangsha seafood market is also worth a visit — either to ogle the exotic abalone, geoduck, horn snails, cockles, cuttlefish and jumbo prawns, or sit down for a no-frills meal. There are several restaurants here where you can choose your dinner, then watch it cooked up fresh. Just be sure to come prepared with a few key Mandarin phrases, if you don't speak the language.





ASHMR and Power Politics

Ashmir has been under Indian military siege for the last one month and so called western civilized world is still silent. Police or military barriers abound in both urban and rural areas, and intimidation is a rather common occurrence at these checkpoints in occupied Kashmir. The occupied Kashmir seethes with a repressed anger generated by the humiliating brutality inflicted by Indian troops. The conscious policy of the Prime Minister Modi and his cohort to revoke autonomy, downgrade the State and democratic institutions in J & K has further alienated the people of Kashmir.

Humanity is badly suffering and Kashmiris are dying because of hunger, thirst and medicine too. It has been constant denial of even basic necessities of life to common people. Curfew is still there to add miseries of common people.

Means of communications have not yet been restored and Kashmiris are still at the mercy of Indian brutal military and paramilitary power and propaganda too. Unfortunately, Kashmir, the heaven on earth has been easy prey of regional and global power politics. The elite global movers & shakers have now decided to transform Kashmir into profitable real estate project and hub of tourism. Era of proxies is over and Kashmir has been entered into a profitable proposition for the international investors especially from the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) and Arab world. Moreover, revoking of special status (Article of 370 & 35(A) of occupied Kashmir has some serious international political repercussions. It has jolted even regional power equation. China has severely rejected division of occupied Kashmir into parts especially Ladakh.

Thousands of security forces patrol the streets at checkpoints, and many high-profile political leaders in Kashmir continue to remain in detention. The Indian government has said that things remain calm in Kashmir. But videos, as well as media and eyewitness reports, dispute that claims.

Pakistan has been raising the issue on several international platforms, including approaching the UN and OIC. Prime Minister Imran Khan has also spoken to multiple world leaders and briefed them on the situation in Kashmir. While speaking to Islamic Society South America, he showcased the real face of the RSS and termed it a potential danger to South Asia. RSS inspired from the fascist regime of German Nazis which should be taken seriously by the world powers, he added. He feared that RSS doctrine may start a potential nuclear war in the region.

The government of Pakistan is now striving hard to get vital support from the so called

Islamic world especially from the Arab world but unfortunately, goals for diplomatic support have not yet been secured due to many complicated and complex regional socioeconomic, geo-political and geo-strategic emerging trends wherein, economics acts like a decisive variable/parameter.

The most recent visit of foreign ministers of the UAE and Saudi Arabia to Islamabad astonishingly demoralized diplomatic efforts of Pakistan by saying that Kashmir is not the issue of Muslim World. It is irony of international politics that human pains, prosecutions and perpetual denial of basic human rights do not have any sway and only profits, befitting propositions and vested interest dominate. Genocide of Bosnia in the heart of so called civilized Europe, Nagorno-Karabakh in the heart of South Caucasus, and Northern Republic of Turkish Cyprus in the heart of Mediterranean Basin speaks itself that in the wild chase of dirty power politics, religion, ethnicity, faith, caste, color and culture are secondary commodities. And now somehow, Kashmir has become a prime example of invisible regional hegemonic bargaining and international power politics. Kashmir the heaven on earth has become a "bleeding paradise" unfortunately.

Even OIC did not stand with the stance of Pakistan on Kashmir. Is it now a "reality check" on Kashmir? Does it an operationalized failure to foreign ministry of Pakistan? Only time will tell/determine. Notwithstanding it a wakeup call for the government of Pakistan and of course the establishment.

But still there is a light of hope in the end of tunnel. The European Parliament's Committee on Foreign Affairs (AFET) demanded the Indian government to immediately lift the curfew in occupied Kashmir that has created humanitarian crisis in the valley. It expressed serious concern over the continued lockdown, suspension of all communication means and media blackout in the occupied Kashmir. It strongly criticised India and condemned the Modi led government for its brutal action that has brought life to standstill in the valley.

Members of the European Parliament's Committee on Foreign Affairs raised their voice for the oppressed Kashmiris, and demanded India to begin dialogue with Pakistan, adding that the European Union (EU) and the European Parliament should issue a reactionary statement on the situation in occupied Kashmir as soon as possible. The EU meeting took place despite Indian efforts to get it canceled. The European Parliament has passed resolutions in support of the Kashmiris. It also sent a delegation to the IOK, which gave an eye opening report. The delegates termed the IOK as "the most beautiful prison of the world".

Indian External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar visited Brussels and met with High Representative of the EU for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Federica Mogherini. According to reports, the Indian minister tried to scuttle efforts to raise the issue of Kashmir in the European Parliament but failed.

Moreover, the US Congress' Foreign Relations Committee House Subcommittee on Asia met and discussed human rights violations in Kashmir. Both committees discussed the ongoing curfew in Indian held Kashmir and situation in the valley. Reports coming out of the valley accuse the Indian government of mass imprisonments and human rights violations. India, however, claims everything is returning to normal.

The human rights violations perpetrated by the Indian security forces in the Indian occupied Kashmir (IOK) have evoked a worldwide condemnation. World leaders, governments, organizations, intellectuals, civil society have condemned this state terrorism in the IOK. Most recently, the Amnesty International India has launched a global campaign "Let Kashmir Speak" to highlight the draconian communication blackout in Indian Held Kashmir, terming it an "outrageous protracted assault on the civil liberties of the people".

The blackout has now been a month old and cannot be prolonged any further by the Indian Government as it has grossly impacted the daily lives of Kashmiri people, their emotional and mental well-being, medical care and access to emergency services," said Aakar Patel, head of Amnesty International India in a statement.

The Amnesty International's head said depriving a population of eight million of its right to freedom of expression, opinion and movement for an indefinite period is akin to taking the region back to the dark ages. The country is yet to hear from Kashmir after a month of being repeatedly been told by the Indian government that all is normal.

He said the current shutdown was against the Article 19 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, to which India was a party. He mentioned that sketchy reports coming out of the region had highlighted unattended medical emergencies, mass arrests and detentions, children and youth being picked up in the middle of the night, torture of civilians, indiscriminate use of tear gas, rubber bullets and pellet guns at protesters.

The government's attempts to create a public opinion of 'normalcy' in Kashmir while curbing the freedom of independent press have

usurped the voice of the people.

Kashmir Campaign Global has launched "Free Kashmir" campaign on a section of London transport network ahead of India's Republic Day today, which is observed as "Black Day" by Kashmiris and Sikhs all over the world.

Chairman of Kashmir Campaign Global who hails from Indian-occupied Kashmir (IoK) but lives permanently in London in exile, told this scribe that a series of campaigns will be launched across UK and other parts of the world throughout the year to create awareness about the Kashmir issue.

At least seven vans were seen driving around the British Parliament carrying signboards titled "Free Kashmir" in reference to the occupation of a large part of Kashmir valley by Indian forces. India occupied this part at the time of partition and has so far killed over a 100,000 Kashmiris for demanding their right to freedom.

The digital vans went across dozens of important central London locations and then made their way to the Indian High Commission where Sikhs and Kashmiris came together for a large and noisy protest against the Indian regime.

Vans with banners in favour of an independent homeland for Sikhs carried slogans "Khalistan Zindabad!" and "Raj Karega Khalsa", sponsored by the Council of Khalistan, were also seen in London.

"It has been 70 years since India, Pakistan, and international world promised a free and impartial referendum in occupied Jammu & Kashmir. During the last 30 years alone, India has been ruling and subjugating the rightful aspirations of the people, as promised by the international community through 17 UNSC resolutions, by using the draconian laws such as AFSPA (Armed Forces Special Powers Act) and PSA (Public Safety Act)."

These black laws have given immunity to Indian security forces and agencies since 1990 and as a result, over 95,000 people have been killed, 10,000 are missing and thousands of unidentified graves are littering across the border of occupied Jammu & Kashmir.

The "bleeding paradise" campaign will help raise awareness of the mass human rights violations taking place in Indian-Held Kashmir and ensure the masses are educated about their role in creating a peaceful world. He said that Indian government has already shut down social media platforms linked to his own organisation.

The vans carrying pictures of Kashmiri children and women called on Indian occupation forces to leave Kashmir and let the Kashmiris decide their fate. The campaign against Indian brutalities has been supported by a group called "British Friends of Kashmir.

The vans were seen passing from outside 10 Downing Street, Trafalgar Square, Westminster Abbey and Waterloo Bridge. A source told Geo News that the vans will run in London's various parts for a month and then the campaign will be initiated in Birmingham, Bradford, Glasgow and Manchester.

The United Kingdom says any allegations of human rights violations in Occupied Kashmir since India revoked the special status of the territory must be thoroughly, promptly and transparently investigated.

The British Foreign Secretary, Dominic Raab, addressing in the House of Commons, the lower house of the Parliament, said all and any allegations of human rights violations are deeply concerning.

Dominic Raab told Members of Parliament in the House of Commons in the first parliamentary session that he raised the concerns with the Indian External Affairs Minister, S Jaishankar, during a conversation on August 7 and that the UK will carefully monitor the situation in Kashmir.


The British Foreign Secretary stressed that the human rights concerns made Kashmir an international issue. "The issue of human rights is not just a bilateral issue for India or Pakistan or a domestic issue. He said it is an international issue we expect internationally recognized human rights to be complied with and respected.

MPs from different sides of the Commons raised a series of questions over the Kashmir issue, including demanding an end to the blockade in occupied Kashmir as well as independent observers to be deployed to the territory.

The Narendra Modi-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government announced major changes in Article 370 of the Indian Constitution that granted "special status" to the state of Jammu & Kashmir (J&K), including the Ladakh region. Revoking this special status to fully integrate J&K into India has been a longstanding politico-ideological demand of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)–the BJP's 2019 Lok Sabha Election manifesto clearly mentions the party's historical position on the "abrogation" of Article 370 and the annulment of Article 35A, which allowed the J&K legislature to define permanent residents of the state.

The Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act 2019 proposes to bifurcate J&K into two Union territories (UTs): Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh. The decision to immediately propose reorganization after the abrogation of J&K's special status was possibly taken in anticipation of violent civilian unrest in the Kashmir Valley. The change to Union Territory status will likely give New Delhi more control over local administrative and legislative powers in J&K, in addition to direct control over the police and protection and maintenance of public order. However, Indian Home Minister Amit Shah assured the parliament that when the situation returns to normalcy and "the right time comes," the central government will once again grant full "state" status to the union territory of J&K.



There are two possible implications of the ruling BJP's decision to abrogate Article 370: first, the BJP may gain political mileage from the move, both in J&K and the rest of India. Secondly, New Delhi may now be able to further emphasize the Kashmir issue as an "internal" matter of India in response to attempts at third-party mediation.

Even though India may face challenges in

stabilizing the law and order situation in the Kashmir Valley after this revocation decision, the BJP's choice to abrogate Article 370 may possibly give it long-term political mileage across India and a real shot at reshaping the political status quo in J&K. On the contrary, the Indian National Congress (INC) and the Communist parties among others opposed it. After scrapping J&K's special status, the BJP sees an opportunity to form government in the newly-declared Union Territory of J&K. The government intends to undertake delimitation of the J&K legislative assembly constituencies in order to conduct local elections once the law and order situation normalizes in the Kashmir Valley. The proposed delimitation will redraw the scope and size of constituencies and determine the total number of seats to be reserved for the Scheduled Castes, those who belong at the bottom of the Indian caste system, in J&K. The new constituencies map in J&K may give some electoral advantage to the ruling BJP as it is possible that its stronghold Jammu may obtain more seats after the delimitation process is complete. If that happens, the BJP will have a realistic chance to form the new government in J&K and appoint its own chief minister (CM).

It is feared that the decision to revoke Article 370 will give more political mileage to the ruling BJP across India. Popular support from various constituencies will also make it an electoral talking point for upcoming state elections and the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. However, an unsuccessful integration process might have long-term political implications for the BJP since opposition parties may see it as a reason to unite against the ruling party in future state and parliamentary elections.

India's decision to revoke J&K's special status has also regional implications. It has further complicated India-Pakistan bilateral relations. Recent geopolitical developments such as the anticipated withdrawal of U.S. troops from Afghanistan, the possible return of an emboldened Taliban in Kabul, and U.S. President Donald Trump's comments regarding mediation of the Kashmir issue may have spillover implications for India too.

Suggestions

 Kashmir has now become war of media and diplomatic maneuvering which needs a comprehensive plan to project the ongoing human violations in the occupied Kashmir and to gain sustainable diplomatic support from the world. In this connection, there should be series of programs in electronic and print media. Social media has become effective tool for disseminating the message which should also be utilized to show the dark side of so called shining India.

- Azerbaijan's model of media may also be thoroughly studied and implemented in which any single border violation, killing, firing and defiance of human rights from Armenia gets immediate reporting.
- Role of Kashmiris diaspora can play a vital role. Let-Speak Kashmir, the bleeding paradise mass media campaigns would bring decisive support from the world especially from the EU wherein a substantial population of Kashmiris exists.
- There should be a genuine group of international experts of international law, marketing and media to counter the ongoing Indian propaganda at any forum.
- The foreign ministry should contact to International Red Crescent for massive human right violations and request for intervene.
- The government of Pakistan should reach out the world for gaining more and more support.



Nagorno-Karabakh & Kashmir

The Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir are the human tragedies of modern times. Both are looming threats to South Caucasus and South East Asia and beyond. Successive leaders and people of brotherly countries have been striving hard to resolve Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir conflicts with Armenia and India but still a substantial resolution is a far cry. Rise of complicated regional proxies and dirty global power politics has worsened human survival in both the illegally occupied areas. Azerbaijan and Pakistan has had been trying their best to resolve the Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir conflicts within the true spirits of international law, resolutions of the UN, rule of sovereignty, respect of human rights and the last but not the least, mutual respect, showing their strong political commitments to do something meaningful for the suffering people of occupied areas under Armenia and Indian illegal occupation for so many years.

Right from the beginning, the governments of Azerbaijan and Pakistan took principle stances that "Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir are integral part of them. Khojaly genocide was the byproduct/strategic extension of Armenia's aggression, brutality and state sponsored terrorism against innocent and helpless people of Azerbaijan. On February 26, 1992, Armenia committed a war crime, killing more than 613 peaceful residents of Khojaly, among them 106 women and 63 children.

Most recently, India's government scarping of article 370 & 35(A) has completely changed status of occupied Kashmir. Daily lives of people have been ruined because of continued curfew for the last 45 days. Access to information, internet and other world has been denied in the valley of beauty. Even schools, colleges, universities and hospitals have been shut down for the last 45 days. People have been living a cage. Amnesty Watch (2019) has issued warning of an imminent "human genocide" in occupied Kashmir. Latest debate in European Parliament has shared that more than 100,000 people have been killed by Indian forces for the last 70 years.

The Khojaly massacre is one of the most heinous and bloodiest events of the 20th century. It is still a black spot on the collective human conscious of the region and the globe as well. It is an act of barbarism and discrimination. The town of Khojaly came under intensive fire from the town of Khankendi and Askeran already occupied by Armenian armed forces February 25, 1992. According to an official report, 613 civilians were killed, including 106 women, 70 elderly and 83 children, and a total of 1,000 civilians were disabled. Moreover, 1,275 innocent people were taken hostage. In case of occupied Kashmir sever ethnic cleansing is going on and so called civilized world is still docile and dormant.

Right of Azerbaijan on Nagorno-Karabakh territories is even recognized by the United Nations Security Council which adopted four resolutions 822, 853, 874 and 884 condemning the use of force against Azerbaijan and the occupation of its territories in 1993. It reaffirmed respect for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Azerbaijan, reconfirmed that the Nagorno-Karabakh region is an integral part of Azerbaijan and demanded the immediate, full and unconditional withdrawal of the occupying forces from all the occupied territories.

On the other hand various resolutions of the UN stand for bilateral negotiations and amicable resolutions between India and Pakistan but Indian recent unilateral act has bulldozed basic essence of international law. UN Resolution No. 47 of 1948 provided that the "United Nations would conduct a free and impartial plebiscite" in the disputed territory. Most recent India's action in altering the status quo of Jammu & Kashmir has implications which go beyond the illegal brutality of the act itself. It is a unilateral abrogation of the Shimla Agreement of 1972 and the Lahore Declaration of 1999.

The government of Azerbaijan demands withdrawal of the occupying forces from the occupied territories of Azerbaijan has still not been implemented, and the mediation efforts conducted for the last 20 years within the framework of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) have also yet not yield results. The OIC recognizes Nagorno-Karabakh as integral part of Azerbaijan. NAM respects Azerbaijan's non-violence persuasion to liberate Nagorno-Karabakh. OSCE confirms Azerbaijan's principal stance on Nagorno-Karabakh. National Assembly as well as Senate of Pakistan unanimously condemns Armenia policy of occupation.

The government of Pakistan has been raising the issue on several international platforms. Prime Minister Imran Khan has been very vocal about the situation in Kashmir. He briefed many world leaders and showcased the real face of the RSS and termed it a potential danger to South Asia. RSS inspired from the fascist regime of German Nazis which should be taken seriously by the world powers, he added. He feared that RSS doctrine may start a potential nuclear war in the region.

Armenia violates not only the principles of territorial integrity of another state, but also a number of conventions and resolutions, which prohibit the destruction of movable and immovable property of the occupied lands. Since the beginning of the Armenia's occupational policy against Azerbaijan, 20% of the territory of Azerbaijan, including the territory of Nagorno-Karabakh and seven surrounding regions, are under the control of the Armenian armed forces.

The richest minerals of Azerbaijan, including five gold deposits, remained in the occupied territories. For example, in the Kelbajar region of Azerbaijan, there is an exploited gold deposit, which is currently used by Armenians as a source of profit. There is an illegal looting of minerals, deposits of precious stones, which are then transferred to Armenia.

In recent years, environmental indicators in the occupied areas and in the front-line villages have significantly worsened, if not exacerbated. Constant shelling of nearby villages, arson of the fields and blockage of water supply from the Sarsang water reservoir located on the Terter River in the north part of the Nagorno-Karabakh region of Azerbaijan, provoked an ecological catastrophe, the scale of which only increases day by day. Life has become a dragon in the near-by villages on the Line of Control in

Kashmir because of heavy shelling of the Indian troops.

Governments of Armenia and India have been holding so called elections or referendum in the occupied areas of Karabakh and Kashmir in the past but majority of the people have strongly rejected it. Most recently, Armenian government for the first time allocated funds to foreign NGOs to monitor the elections in unrecognized Karabakh. According to their results, the entire international community invariably declares its principled position regarding support for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Azerbaijan, nonrecognition of the illegal regime, as well as any "elections" held by it.

Kashmir the paradise on earth has been changed into hell by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) led government by scarping article 370 and 35 (A). Now special status of Kashmir has been bulldozed through a presidential act endorsed by both the houses of Indian parliament.

According to original 370 & 35 (A) any change in its utility, nature, composition, definition and execution, the Union Government of India (UGI) will have to consult with state government which has now been violated and BJP government has now put RSS stamp even in Kashmir. The article allowed the state a certain amount of autonomy i.e. its own constitution, a separate flag and freedom to make laws. Foreign affairs, defence and communications will be remained the preserve of the central government.

Furthermore, Jammu and Kashmir could now make its own rules relating to permanent residency, ownership of property and fundamental rights. Kashmir will no longer have a separate constitution but will have to abide by the Indian constitution much like any other state. All Indian laws will be automatically applicable to Kashmiris, and people from outside the state will be able to buy property there.

Abrogation of the article 370 & 35(A) has opened the gates of hell to indigenous Kashmiris in terms of ownership, geography, demography, political, economic, civil and last but not the least, social association. On its part Armenia has been trying to settle migrated Armenian from Syria and other parts into illegally occupied territories of Nagorno-Karabakh which is against true spirits of international law.

Azerbaijan and Pakistan are brotherly countries which are now knotted even with grief, anger and purpose of recognition. Both countries should initiate joint efforts to liberate illegally occupied territories in the days to come.

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
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
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
