





iot police patrolled the streets of India's capital and the city's leader called for a curfew following battles between Hindus and Muslims that claimed at least 20 lives. The two days of unrest which has seen clashes between mobs armed with swords and guns - is the worst sectarian violence seen in Delhi in decades. The clashes come amid worsening religious tensions following a citizenship law that critics say is part of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Hindu nationalist agenda. Delhi's chief minister, Arvind Kejriwal, called for the army to be deployed and for a curfew to be imposed over flashpoint northeastern districts. "Police, despite all its efforts, (are) unable to control situation and instil confidence," Kejriwal tweeted. "Army (should) be called in and curfew imposed." The clashes began between people supporting and opposing the citizenship law, and then descended into pitched battles between the mobs. Twenty people died and nearly 200 others were wounded in the first two days of violence, the director of the hospital where people were taken told. Security personnel patrol on street following clashes in New Delhi. Sixty people had suffered gunshot wounds, according to the director, Sunil Kumar. Media reported people cleaning out the blackened and trashed interior of a mosque in the Ashok Nagar area burned out during the violence. A video circulated on social media verified showed men ripping off the muezzin's loudspeaker on top of the mosque's minaret and placing a Hindu religious flag and an Indian flag. The new citizenship law has raised worries abroad that Modi wants to remould secular India into a Hindu nation while marginalizing the country's 200 million Muslims. The law expedites the citizenship applications for persecuted minorities from India's three Muslim-majority neighboring countries, but not if they are Muslim. The flare-up in violence occurred as US President Donald Trump visited India and held talks with Modi in Delhi .














President Dr. Arif Alvi and Turkish President H.E. Recep Tayyip **Erdogan reaffirm historic Pakistan-Turkey relationship**

resident of Turkey, H.E. Recep Tayyip Erdogan, met with President of Pakistan Dr. Arif Alvi at the Presidency. President Erdogan is visiting Pakistan for the 6th Session of High Level Strategic Cooperation Council (HLSCC). The President of Pakistan, extending a warm welcome to President Erdogan, expressed gratification over the level of enhanced and multifaceted engagement between the two countries. He added that the 6th Session of High Level Strategic Cooperation .Council will further strengthen and broaden the fraternal relations between Pakistan and Turkey. Both leaders underlined the special significance of the historic bilateral relationship between the two countries in diverse areas including political, economic, cultural, defence and people-to-people contacts.


President Alvi apprised President Erdogan of the worsening human rights situation in the Indian Occupied Jammu & Kashmir and took the opportunity to thank the President Erdogan for his principled stand on Kashmir. The two leaders also exchanged views on regional and international issues. President Alvi highlighted Pakistan's efforts for peace and reconciliation in Afghanistan and stressed that the world community should extend its help in Afghanistan's post-conflict reconstruction.

The two Presidents also agreed that Pakistan and Turkey must continue to work closely to counter challenges facing the Ummah, including Islamophobia. The two leaders affirmed that both countries would continue to extend mutual support on issues of each other's core national interest.

They also underscored the importance of fully realizing the immense potential of relationship between Pakistan and Turkey and transforming it into a strong and dynamic trade and economic partnership. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan addresses the Parliament of Pakistan

urkish President Recep Erdogan promised to proceed with his courageous help for Islamabad's position on Kashmir, contrasting it with Turkey's own noteworthy 1915 Gallipoli campaign and going the extent that expression that the predicament of the individuals of the Indian-occupied region implied as a lot to his nation as it did to Pakistan as the two nations marked a series of settlements to reinforce ties in different fields.

Tending to a joint session of the Pakistani parliament for a record fourth time, the Turkish head of state likewise promised to assist Islamabad with remaining off the boycott of the worldwide budgetary guard dog, the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), at its gathering in Paris one week from now.

How might we overlook those [Pakistanis] who pray to God for Turkey? Our companionship depends on adoration and not personal stakes. Like previously, we will keep on supporting Pakistan later on, Erdogan said.

"Pakistan and Turkey's relations are outstanding for other people. The muchbegrudged Turkey-Pakistan fellowship today, is a genuine fraternity, fortified by history and strengthened by authentic occasions," he included."Transient interests, every day retributions can't frustrate our everlasting and endless fellowship." He reviewed that Pakistan had constantly bolstered Turkey during troublesome occasions. "We can always remember this."

He brought up how the Muslims of the Subcontinent had supported Turkey during the Gallipoli crusade, otherwise called the Battle of Canakkale, in 1915 during World War I, bringing up a meeting held in Lahore drove by Allama Igbal.

Today, Kashmir for Turkey is Similar as it is for Pakistan

Citing a sonnet by Iqbal, which he said the incredible writer had recited so anyone can hear at the Lahore rally, The Turkish president stated: Like the artist of Lahore [Igbal], the individuals [at the rally] were suffocating in these feelings. The individuals of Pakistan have consistently stood side by side with the individuals of Turkey," he noted.

Expounding on the episode, Erdogan said while Turkish warriors were shielding the Dardanelles Strait with a heavenly opposition in 1915, an assembly occurred in Lahore 6,000 kilometers from the front and

it was "recorded on the exceptional pages of history".

"The subject of this verifiable assembly in Lahore Square was Canakkale. On that day, Lahore Square was jam-stuffed with Muslims as we were attempting to endure and our siblings and sisters here [Subcontinent] were likewise under tension of the colonialists. Notwithstanding difficulties and dangers, they raised a gigantic foundation for Canakkale through the displays in the square."The Turkish president further said the occasions that occurred in Canakkale a hundred years back were being rehashed in Indian Occupied Kashmir and Turkey would keep on raising its voice against New Delhi's abuse.

"We can always remember the help of the Muslims of the Subcontinent during those occasions," he included. The Turkish president saw that the Kashmir issue couldn't be settled through clash yet through equity and reasonableness. "Such an answer will be in light of a legitimate concern for all gatherings. Turkey will keep on remaining by equity, harmony and discourse," he said.

"Our Kashmiri siblings and sisters have languished over decades and the offenses have gotten graver. We by and by showed our nation's affectability right now safeguarding Kashmir at the 74th United Nations General Assembly." Erdogan additionally expressed gratitude toward Pakistan for the benefit of the Turkish individuals for the help it had

broadened when there were seismic tremors in his nation. Talking on reinforcing exchange ties with Pakistan, the Turkish president said the 'Vital Economic Framework' and 'Activity Plan' reports that Ankara was marking with Islamabad would cover a wide scope of businesses from exchange to foundation and from venture to the travel industry.

"[They] will comprise a guide for the two nations," he included.

"I have accompanied a designation of Turkish businesspeople. After supplications, they will have business conversations with Pakistani partners." The Turkish president noticed that Islamabad was confronting political weight from its faultfinders at the up and coming FATF meeting. "I likewise need to underscore that we will offer help to Pakistan [at the FATF meeting," he included."Pakistan is headed to harmony and strength; harmony and solidness don't arrive in a couple of days, it requires work."

He complimented Pakistan's battle against psychological warfare, saying that the nation had been influenced by strict obsession. "The nation has made colossal penances."Swearing his proceeded with help to Pakistan on counter-fear based oppression, the Turkish head of state said the two nations were the most influenced by psychological oppression "because of their geographic areas".

"Nobody can break the obligation of the Muslim fraternity in any capacity. Everybody should remain with each other."

"I express gratitude toward God for giving

me this chance. I am grateful to every one of you separately for permitting me to address this joint session of parliament. I might want to pass on the welcome of 83 million siblings and sisters in Turkey," Erdogan said toward the beginning of his location. The Turkish president said thanks to the individuals of Pakistan for the warm invite he had gotten on his appearance.

"Here, in Pakistan, we never view ourselves as outsiders. We feel comfortable, in one of the most significant gathering focuses in Asia, in the rich geology of the Islamic world," he included.

Alluding to other clash zones, the Turkish president said it was their duty to give help to Muslims, regardless of where they were. "Turkey has assumed the main job in Libya, Yemen, Syria, and Palestine. We have been on the bleeding edges of the fight to free blameless Muslims over the area."

"With this understanding, Turkey attempts to wipe out the contrasts between the Ummah, to discover an answer for the debates and to guarantee our honest motivations, particularly Palestine, Cyprus and Kashmir."

"We have been effectively occupied with all issues concerning the Muslim Ummah particularly during our administration of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation."

"We took a respectable and decided position against the assaults of Israel on our first Qibla, Al-Quds Al-Sharif. We proclaimed to the entire world that we would not leave Haram Al-Sharif helpless before the involving Israeli organization by saying," Erdogan explained.

The Turkish president finished his discourse by discussing a couple of refrains of the Pakistani national hymn and supplications for the two nations and the Muslim world.

The session began with a presentation from the Holy Quran followed by an initial location by Speaker Asad Qaiser, who paid a tribute to the Turkish president and invited the pioneer to the Parliament."It is a respect for me to have the option to respect the Turkish president, a companion to Pakistan, and one of the most powerful Muslim pioneers on the planet.

Pakistan and Turkey have solid authentic and passionate ties," said the speaker. Prior to his appearance in the parliament, the Turkish president was gotten by Prime Minister Imran Khan, National Assembly Speaker Asad Qaiser and Senate Chairman Sadiq Sanjrani.

Director Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee General Nadeem Raza, Naval Chief Admiral Zafar Mahmood Abbasi and Air Chief Marshal Mujahid Anwar Khan were likewise present at the Parliament House.

rime Minister Imran Khan and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan tended to a joint question and answer session in Islamabad after the two nations marked various updates of comprehension (MoUs) for collaboration in different areas of bilateral relation.

In his discourse, Prime Minister Imran said individuals had significantly preferred President Erdogan's discourse before today during a joint session of the parliament. He repeated that if the Turkish head fought election from Pakistan, he would do a "decisive

victory".

He expressed gratitude toward Erdogan, who was on a two-day visit to Pakistan, on the nation's benefit for opposing Indian abominations in occupied Kashmir. He noticed that at any rate 8,000,000 Kashmiris have been under Indian siege for more than a half year, while Kashmiri pioneers have been placed in prison. "They have no rights ... they are living in dread," he included.

The head emphasized that Kashmir is a contested domain as indicated by United Nations goals.

He said the Pakistan-Turkey exchange relationship will see another time with the present marking of MoUs for vital financial

participation. Through timetables, the collaboration being completed among Pakistan and Turkey will profit both the nations, he included.

Head administrator Imran said Pakistan backs Turkey in regards to its issues with fear based oppression radiating from the Syria outskirt. He noticed that other than Kashmir, Turkey had upheld Pakistan on the issue of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) also, including that the two nations "stand together" with regards to vital worldwide issues.

"Our participation separated from legislative issues and economy [...] is vital in light of the fact that they (Turkey) have a propelled film industry. We need to create content with them to address Islamophobia so we can stand firm

He said holding another gathering of the High-Level Strategic Cooperation Council, which was set up in 2009, was one of the most significant images of the Pak-Turk companionship.

"The simple certainty that we have consented to 13 arrangements between the two nations is the most significant pointer of how significant relations between [the two countries] are," Erdogan said.

"In the last gathering in Ankara, we had consented to bring the degree of our outside exchange volume to \$5 billion by 2023.The vital monetary structure and its next activity plan is practically prepared [...] It is the guide for how we can develop our economic relations," he included.

Erdogan said Turkey was prepared to give all the help that it can in the fields of transportation, vitality, the travel industry, human services, instruction, and law requirement - zones which he noted will help in the social and financial improvement of Pakistan.

"I am additionally sure that the leader won't

extra any endeavors so as to improve the business atmosphere in Pakistan," he stated, including that Turkey is remaining alongside Pakistan today, as it did previously and will do later on.

He said the help messages and sympathies passed on by Pakistanis, from the president to the common individuals in the road, in the repercussions of the seismic tremor in Elazig city of Turkey is "a model that shows the friendship between the individuals of the two nations".

He said Turkey has gotten "solid help" from the Pakistani state and individuals with respect to its military tasks that it directed in October in northern Syria.

"Our collaborations inside the field of military and safeguard are the most unique fields of our two-sided relations. I might want everybody to realize that we are prepared to contribute in any capacity so as to improve relations with Pakistan and Afghanistan which are both selfless countries to us," the president focused.

Erdogan said Turkey remains in "profound solidarity" with the individuals of involved Kashmir, who he said have languished persecution and awful outcomes over quite a while. "We are extremely heartbroken and upset to see that the circumstance right now falling apart due to one-sided steps taken by one gathering," he included.

"Turkey is agreeable to finding a tranquil answer for the Kashmir issue through exchange among Pakistan and India, under the premise [of] UN choices and thinking about the desires for our Kashmiri siblings and sisters," he told the presser. He emphasized that Turkey extraordinarily values Pakistan's battle against psychological warfare and its endeavors towards setting up provincial dependability.

Reacting to his discourse, Prime Minister Imran expressed gratitude toward Erdogan, saying the Pakistani individuals were cheerful at his visit since Turkey has had an uncommon association with Pakistan and the area since the Khilafat Movement.He said the two nations' relations have additionally reinforced since Erdogan turned into Turkey's CEO and Pakistan currently needs to gain from the improvement did in Turkey under Erdogan's supervision.

"The territories wherein Pakistan will explicitly profit [from the cooperation] are the travel industry and [...] development," the chief stated, including that Turkey has just chipped away at making moderate lodging which the PTI government needs to imitate. "The manner by which he elevated the economy ... the nation had roundabout obligation and had taken IMF advances. It is significant for us to gain from this," he commented. Executive Imran said the most significant assignment for Pakistan is to give work to its young populace which will occur through industrialisation.

Prior, Prime Minister Imran and President Erdogan saw the marking of 13 MoUs by authorities speaking to both the nations. The function came after the finish of the entire session of the sixth round of Pakistan-Turkey High Level Strategic Cooperation Council in Islamabad.As indicated by state telecaster PTV, the MoUs marked between the two nations concern collaboration in the fields of the travel industry and culture, nourishment security, postal administrations, railroads, military preparing, exchange, transport and foundation, data innovation, and so on.

An understanding was additionally marked for participation between the state-possessed Turkish Radio and Television company (TRT) and PTV and Radio Pakistan. President Erdogan and Prime Minister Imran then marked two reports — the revelation of vital monetary system and the joint declaration.

The joint question and answer session was trailed by a supper facilitated by Prime Minister Imran out of appreciation for the Turkish president. Prior in the day, President Erdogan and Prime Minister Imran had held a one-on-one gathering at Prime Minister House during which respective relations were talked about.

He further said that establishment of Pakistan Navy Research & Development Centre will promote industrial growth in general and defense production in particular.



The Secretary General is visiting to attend the International Conference on 40 years of hosting Afghan refugees in Pakistan. The Prime Minister highlighted Pakistan's generosity in hosting millions of Afghan refugees for the last four decades. He also noted that the people of Pakistan drew inspiration to host refugees from the teachings of the Holy Prophet (S.A.W.). The Prime Minister underscored that there was no military solution to the





Afghan conflict. He reaffirmed Pakistan's steadfast support for efforts for peace and reconciliation in Afghanistan. He stressed that the establishment of sustainable peace in Afghanistan and creation of conducive environment and "pull factors" which would facilitate the return of Afghan refugees to their homeland in dignity and honour. The Prime Minister highlighted the dire human rights and humanitarian situation in Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir, as a result of India's illegal and unilateral actions of 5 August 2019. He added that India's belligerent rhetoric, intensified ceasefire violations on the LoC, and other aggressive actions were imperiling peace and security in the region. The Prime Minister also highlighted the possibility of false flag operation by India to divert global attention from its unacceptable actions in IOJ&K. gradual, time-bound, well-resourced and mutually-agreed road map for the return of the Afghan refugees, which must be vital component of peace and reconciliation process in Afghanistan. The Foreign Minister reaffirmed Pakistan's continued support for an Afghan-led and Afghan owned peace and reconciliation process. The Foreign Minister and Secretary General exchanged views on the serious human rights situation in Indian Occupied Jammu & Kashmir (IOJ&K). Foreign Minister Qureshi conveyed Pakistan's deep concern over continuing lockdown and communications blockade in Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir since India's illegal and unilateral actions of 5 August 2019. India's belligerent posture and ceasefire violations along the Line of Control threaten both regional and the international peace and security. He referred to the possibility of false flag operation by India to divert global attention from the situation in Indian occupied Jammu and Kashmir. The Secretary General reiterated that the position of the United Nations on Jammu

and Kashmir was governed by the Charter of the United Nations, including provisions on the peaceful settlement of disputes, and applicable Security Council resolutions. While reiterating that Jammu & Kashmir is one of the oldest disputes that remain on the agenda of the UN Security Council, the Foreign Minister urged the Secretary General to use his good offices to mediate and enable the Kashmiris to realize their right to self-determination, as enshrined in numerous UN Security Council resolutions and the UN Charter. The Foreign Minister underscored the importance of UNMOGIP to monitor the situation along the Line of Control and impressed upon the Secretary General to strengthen it.

Highlighting Pakistan's contributions, the Foreign Minister lauded the role of Pakistani valiant men and women peacekeepers, as one of the largest troops contributing countries to the UN Peacekeeping Missions around the world. He paid tribute to the sacrifices made by 157 peacekeepers in the line of duty.



Recognizing the threat posed by climate change, the Foreign Minister stressed the importance of collective action by the international community to counter this threat and underscored Pakistan's readiness to work with him and support his efforts. Secretary General Guterres also planted a tree at the Foreign Office to commemorate Prime Minister Imran Khan's 10 Billion Tree Tsunami Initiative. 

oreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi highlighted the pivotal role played by Pakistan in hammering out a peace deal between the United States and the Afghan Taliban scheduled to be signed on Feb 29.

"We constructed a roadmap to peace," he said a day after 18 months of gruelling talks between the American and Taliban negotiators finally paid off and the two sides confirmed they would be signing the historic agreement later this month. In a statement issued by the Foreign Office, Qureshi noted that the "historic breakthrough" could not have been achieved without Islamabad's efforts and the deal would be signed in the presence of Pakistani representatives.

"It was not easy to bring the Taliban to the table for negotiations, which is why the entire world, including the US, is appreciating Pakistan's role in the Afghan peace process," he added.

"The world knows that the two sides have been fighting for over 19 years. After US President Donald Trump cancelled the peace process in a single tweet following a death [of a US soldier], it was Pakistan who convinced the US to restart negotiations."

Qureshi pointed out that when Secretary of State Mike Pompeo had arrived in Islamabad for his maiden visit last year, ties between the two countries were at their lowest ebb.

"Pompeo told me that the pathway to fixing relations between Pakistan and the US came through Kabul, Now, I would like to remind him that we have fulfilled all our promises. Not only did we build a peace team but we also played our role in ensuring that the negotiations were successful."

"I also told Khalilzad that the US and its allies around the region must remain wary of certain elements who benefit from continued fighting [in Afghanistan]. I warned him that these elements are bent on destroying the progress of our peace efforts."

The minister also said that US Special Representative for Afghanistan Reconciliation Zalmay Khalilzad had held a meeting with Prime Minister Imran Khan and himself on the peace process during his recent visit to Islamabad.

Qureshi reiterated that the Afghan peace process was a complex one and that there was no military solution to the conflict. "The world must understand that the solution to the Afghan conflict will only come through

a political settlement based on diplomatic negotiations."The minister advised the Afghan government to think about the future of its country and double its efforts to restore peace, besides shunning partisan domestic politics to ensure lasting peace.

"After February, we will try to build a delegation to promote intra-Afghan peace process and we have also decided when and how those talks will take place. Pakistan has played its role in the peace process with wholeheartedness and honesty and it is now incumbent upon the Afghan government to do the same."

Qureshi said peace in Afghanistan would benefit the entire region, including Pakistan, and promote bilateral trade between the two countries. Pakistan's role in the Afghan peace process was lauded by UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres during his recent trip to Islamabad. China, Russia, Japan and several other countries have also appreciated Pakistan's efforts to restore peace in its war-torn neighbouring country.

Meanwhile, the Afghans woke up to a week-long partial truce on Saturday after the Taliban, the US and local forces all agreed to a lull that could be a major turning point in the long conflict. If the so-called "reduction in violence" holds, it will be a major step towards withdrawing US troops after more than 18 years.

Afghanistan presidential election: Ashraf Ghani re-elected

fghanistan's President Ashraf Ghani has been declared the winner of last September's election following delays due to allegations of vote-rigging. Mr Ghani was re-elected with 50.64% of the vote, officials said.But his main rival Abdullah Abdullah, who came second with 39.52%, contested the result, declared victory, and vowed to form his own parallel government.

Opponents of Mr Ghani said the 28 September vote was marred by massive fraud and technical problems. Only a small proportion of the country voted in the election. Election commission chief Hawa Alam Nuristani announced the result during a press conference in Kabul. She said 137,000 votes classed as suspicious and 12,012 votes cast outside polling hours had been found to be valid during a special audit.

She said: "May God help him in serving the people of Afghanistan... I also pray that peace comes to our country." Mr Abdullah, however. rejected the results and proclaimed victory.

"Our team, based on clean and biometric votes, is the victor and we declare our victory. The fraudsters are the shame of history and we announce our inclusive government," he told a press conference in Kabul. Turnout was

also the lowest since the Taliban were ousted in 2001, with just 1.82m votes counted. Nearly one million votes were discarded due to irregularities.

Afghanistan's total population stands at about 37 million, with 9.6 million registered voters. The low turnout was in part attributed to widespread safety concerns as the Taliban had threatened to attack polling stations and targeted election rallies before polling day.But there was also a perceived lack of enthusiasm ahead of the vote - not helped by the fact the same two men who had fought for months over the top job in 2014 were the front-runners once again. Both have been accused of corruption while in office.The announcement comes as the US seeks to sign a deal with the Taliban who refuse to negotiate directly with the Afghan government, saying it



is illegitimate. They say they will only talk to Afghan authorities after a deal with the US is agreed.

Mr Ghani, 70, has insisted on taking part in any future negotiations with the Taliban. He has vowed to fight them "for generations" if such talks fail.

HE results of the 2019 Afghan presidential elections have further complicated the prospects for achieving intra-Afghan political reconciliation. They have pushed down the hope that the newly elected regime would be able to form an inclusive team to talk to the Afghan Taliban. While the election authorities have declared the incumbent president Ashraf Ghani as the winner, runner-up Dr Abdullah Abdullah has not only rejected the results but also announced he will form his own parallel government.

The persisting political turmoil in Kabul has increased just a week before the announcement of a deal is expected between the US negotiation team and the Taliban. Many anticipate that the much-awaited deal will bring to the fore the crucial process of nation-building in a war-torn country, where all Afghan stakeholders will not only have to build consensus on a permanent, comprehensive ceasefire, but also reconstruct a new social contract for their country. However, the deepening political crisis in Afghanistan can slacken the peace process, causing a delay in the announcement of the deal. It will increase frustration among the external stakeholders and facilitators (mainly the US) who want to end the decades-old conflict, which is consuming their financial resources and political capital.

The Afghan Taliban deputy and Haqqani Network chief Sirajuddin Haqqani hinted at the Taliban's internal difference over the peace process in an opinion piece published in The New York Times. However, their differences are not as severe as the trust deficit among their opponents including Afghan and international stakeholders. Political chaos in Kabul is an advantage for the Taliban, which they will use to bolster their bargaining position while dealing with the US and fellow Afghan stakeholders. It is not yet certain how Washington will respond to the simmering controversy over election results.

For Pakistan, this is a delicate situation as it has played a critical role in facilitating US-Taliban talks, hoping that the process would help reduce pressure from its western border. Facilitating the peace process was also essential for Pakistan to put its economy back on the road including through earning the confidence of Washington and European capitals. However,

protracted political turmoil in Afghanistan could shatter many of Pakistan's hopes.

In the current environment, what are the options left for Pakistan?

Even if US intervention resolves electionrelated controversies, building consensus for a broad-based negotiation team will be an uphill task. The formation phase of the negotiation team may take longer than expected, as it is also not clear whether or not it will be conditioned on the US troops' withdrawal. However, a prolonged process could increase internal pressure on the Taliban leadership to adopt an alternative approach and declare their parallel government, or emirate, which is already functioning in the peripheries and rural areas of the country. In such a situation, much of the pressure will be put on Pakistan both by the international community and the factionalised political Afghan elite.

A couple of years earlier, a scenario-building exercise was carried out to get a picture of Pak-Afghan bilateral ties in 2030. One scenario was that if foreign troops left Afghanistan without accomplishing their mission, the Afghan power elites and Taliban would not be able to bring stability to the country. In that case, Afghanistan's immediate neighbours would have little leverage over Afghan stakeholders to force them to build consensus.

Bilateral relations between Afghanistan and Pakistan would further deteriorate, thus increasing the animosity between the two nations to India's advantage. It would be a nightmare for Pakistan as it would increase border tensions and insecurity, and negatively impact trade and people-to-people contact between the two nations. The nightmare for the international community mainly the US, China and Russia would be that the Taliban's power would grow and international terrorist groups become influential. In such a scenario, China and Russia would prefer to put their weight behind the most definite contender(s) of power.

That was a pessimistic scenario and indicated that the political compulsions had become so strong that imagining a scenario where the Afghans as a state and society could overcome their differences was difficult.

In the current environment, what are the options left for Pakistan? Complete detachment from the emerging situation in Afghanistan is one option. This can be interpreted as maintaining a neutral position before and during the complicated process of intra-Afghan talks. This would be an ideal but awkward position because of complications that could emerge during the withdrawal of foreign forces and the dialogue process. The US would have to rely on Pakistan to use its influence over the Taliban and a few other political actors in Afghanistan.

Secondly, there is no guarantee that Russia, Iran, and particularly India, would maintain a neutral position. India and Iran have their proxies and favourites in Afghanistan, whom they will not abandon. Pakistan will be an easy target of such 'favourites' if the dialogue is deadlocked. Pakistan will have to maintain and further diversify its relations with Afghan stakeholders other than the Taliban.

If the exit process is caught in complications, the US can review its approach. But for the global community, the most critical aspect would be long-term economic assistance pledges to help Afghan power elites develop viable economic growth structures. This factor will also dominate the intra-Afghan dialogue. It remains to be seen how Afghan stakeholders, who have divergent interests, will deal with this challenge. It is expected they will build pressure on Pakistan regarding the transit trade agreement and could demand easy access to ports. If Pakistan-India relations remain tense, it would not be easy for Pakistan to make any concession.

The processes of withdrawal and dialogue will be lengthy with all their complexities, but their completion will see the real test for Pak-Afghan ties. Pakistan should have a blueprint for the future and prepare the ground for a long-term strategic and economic cooperation treaty with Afghanistan. This is important in order for both countries to emerge from the Indiancentric strategic hangover and develop their independent bilateral relationship.

he State of Qatar, represented by the Shura Council, signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the United Nations, represented by the Office of Counter-Terrorism, aiming at providing a framework for cooperation to enhance the role of parliaments in countering terrorism and the conditions related to this phenomenon, and to facilitate cooperation between the two sides in areas of mutual interest. The MoU states that the Shura Council and the UN enter into direct arrangements to establish the Office of the UN Counter-Terrorism Program, which will be concerned with the parliamentary participation in preventing and combating terrorism. The office's headquarters will be in the State of Qatar and its activities will cover the parliaments of world countries.

The MoU was signed by Speaker of the Shura Council HE Ahmed bin Abdullah bin Zaid Al Mahmoud and

Under-Secretary-General of the UN Office of Counter-Terrorism Vladimir Voronkov.

Speaker of the Shura Council HE Ahmed bin Abdullah bin Zaid Al Mahmoud underlined the role of the State of Qatar in countering terrorism, noting that the establishment of the UN office in Doha affirms the confidence of the international community in the efforts exerted by the State of Qatar under the leadership of Amir HH Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani to counter terrorism and address its roots and causes, highlighting the essential role of parliaments in preventing and combating terrorism in light of their basic functions in enacting legislation, setting policies, allocating budgets, monitoring government actions, and ensuring the implementation of international pledges

related to terrorism.

The Doha-based Office of the UN Counter-Terrorism Program will provide technical assistance and training to world parliaments in order to build capacity of parliamentarians to better understand and respond to terrorism-related issues.
