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

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significant contributions made by Pakistan, Turkey and Azerbaijan for promotion of peace, stability and development in their respective regions and the mutual desire of their peoples to further advance these ideals for shared prosperity and security in the broader region.

In the Trilateral Meeting discussed about challenges and emerging threats confronting their countries including but not limited to threats of foreign sponsored acts of terrorism, cyber-attacks, hybrid forms of warfare, targeted disinformation campaigns, and escalating trends of Islamophobia affecting the peaceful co-existence of Muslim communities in many countries. In the Trilateral Meeting underlined the need to intensify cooperation for food and energy security, environment, sustainable development and climate change and called for greater international cooperation for timely response and achievement of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals.

Pakistan Navy holds the seventh Multinational Maritime Exercise 'Aman 2021' in which naval forces from 45 countries along with their assets and delegations being held under the theme of "Together for Peace."

The aim of organizing the Aman maritime exercise is to maintain peace and sustainability in the region and improve the retaliation capabilities.

Exercise AMAN is planned with focused objectives to project positive image of Pakistan as a country contributing towards regional peace/ stability and to consolidate PN's position in the regional maritime arena. Displaying of united resolve against terrorism and crimes in maritime and to develop coalition building and multi-layered security cooperation to promote a safe & sustainable maritime environment.

Pakistan and Sri Lanka are two important countries of the South Asian region that enjoy very cordial and friendly relations. They have also extended cooperation to each other in different sectors, and are keen on further strengthening their relation through frequent exchange of delegations at varying levels. Pakistani Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi visited Sri Lanka. He met with Sri Lankan President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa and discussed deepening bilateral ties between the two countries. Pakistan has close relations with Sri Lanka and it hopes to widen the scope of cooperation between the two countries to include trade, investment, defense, tourism, and multi-industry capacity building.

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
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CNS INTERVIEW FOR MULTINATIONAL EXERCISE AMAN-21






ow you view the regional maritime environment? What are the key challenges Pakistan is facing in domestic and regional maritime domain?

In my assessment, global geopolitical environment is ambiguous, volatile and is characterized by realignment of interests. Pakistan is in midst of a complex geo-political and geo-economic competition prevailing in the region. The Indo-US strategic partnership, simmering US-Iran stand-off, regional developments in Middle East and the ongoing peace process in Afghanistan presents challenges and opportunities; necessitating careful management of our relations with global as well as regional powers.

Pakistan enjoys a very unique geostrategic location; it faces Indian Ocean and is located close to Gulf of Oman, and Strait of Hormuz which host 30% of all sea borne trade. Pakistan's 90% trade is sea borne and most of our energy requirements are met through sea. Pakistan being a responsible state has always contributed towards Maritime Security in its area of responsibility and beyond.

The most dominant threat to regional security as well as to Pakistan emanates from India's state sponsored Hindutva mindset, continued brutalities in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu & Kashmir (IIOJK) and war mongering bellicose







approach. On our western seaboard, any strategic miscalculation may manifest into a precarious situation for shipping plying on international energy SLOCs. Moreover, the ongoing conflicts in Yemen and Syria are also impinging upon regional maritime security.

In non-traditional domain and in the wider region maritime terrorism, piracy, drug trafficking and human smuggling are main challenges being faced. Pakistan Navy is also committed towards internal security and aid to civil power duties. In





short, key challenges to our maritime security arise from traditional to non-traditional threats with an ominous mix of hybrid ones.

What are your comments on PN participation in multilateral Coalition Maritime Forces (CMF) and conduct of Regional Maritime Security Patrol (RMSP)?

Pakistan is a firm believer of preserving peace and stability in the maritime domain. PN is contributing significantly in maritime security and counter piracy efforts in the Indian Ocean





Region (IOR) nearly since last two decades. In order to fulfil our international obligation to ensure Maritime Security in the region, we joined Combined Task Force 150 (CTF-150) in 2004. Similarly, to counter the increasing acts of piracy in the Gulf of Aden and Horn of Africa PN joined the Combined Task Force-151 (CTF-151) in 2009. PN officers have commanded both these Task Forces for 20 times. So far, PN has been the largest contributor to Combined Maritime Forces (CMF) Operations second only to United States Navy.

While we continue to be part of CMF, commensurate with the changing geostrategic realities in the region, since 2018 PN has instituted Maritime Security initiative of "Regional Maritime Security Patrol" (RSMP) to fulfil international obligations for Maritime Security and protect own national interest in the IOR with strategic autonomy. Pakistan Navy Ships with embarked helicopters are undertaking Regional Maritime Security Patrols (RMSPs) along important maritime areas in Indian Ocean Region. The broad objectives of RMSP include contribution towards maintaining good order at sea. That means not only deterring and curbing the menace of piracy but also confronting maritime terrorism, narco-trade, arms and human smuggling and other illicit activities at sea. Another important aspect of RMSP is to enhance collaboration and interoperability with regional navies.

What are the major strands of Pakistan Navy force development and future procurement program?

Ans. Progressive capability development is an important pillar of my Vision for Pakistan Navy. We have contracted for construction of Destroyers and Corvettes with the support of friendly countries. As warships are the mainstay of any Navy, induction of more ships is in the offing. In addition, we have also contracted for acquisition of Hangor Class Submarines from China. We are also focussing on induction of modern air platforms. In addition, we are modernizing our existing Fleet of warships. In order to absorb new technologies and platforms, we are also focusing on capacity and capability enhancement of our Shipyard, workshops and

skilled manpower for which we are blessed with full support of our Government.

What steps Pakistan Navy has undertaken to enhance vigilance and to combat illicit activities like terrorism, drug trafficking etc in your area of responsibility?

In past, the coastline of Pakistan except at Karachi, Ormara and a few other places was not very well monitored and consequently nefarious elements were able to exploit the same for drug and human trafficking. In order to enhance vigilance and to respond to any emerging threat all along the coast, the establishment of Coastal Security and Harbour Defence Force (CS&HDF) is a giant leap forward to effectively plug exploitable gaps in our coastal monitoring mechanism. CS&HDF comprises number of Security Stations along the entire coast, which are equipped with Radar, Electro Optic Sensors, Automatic Identification Systems and response elements to provide gapless coverage along the coast.

Moreover, Task Force-88 has been established as a component of CS&HDF for security of maritime projects related to CPEC, Gwadar Port and its seaward approaches. This Task Force comprises Ships, Fast Attack Craft, Air Units, UAVs and Maritime Special Warfare Teams providing round the clock security.

We understand that maintenance of conducive maritime environment and security is key to our regional maritime growth. In this regard, PN has established a Joint Maritime Information Coordination Centre (JMICC) in 2012. The Centre aims to maintain maritime security picture in own area of interest by harnessing efforts of relevant national agencies and international stakeholders in order to contribute towards regional maritime security. The centre is growing and developing its linkages; till now has linked itself to 48 national and 7 international organizations for sharing of information related to maritime safety and security.

In addition, PN being cognizant of non-traditional threats prevailing in our region remains vigilant and ready to cooperate with international partners to curb this menace wherever required. I must mention here that

nearly, 7000 Kgs of Hashish and 2 tonnes of Cannabis resin have been confiscated by PN Ships as part of Combined Maritime Forces Security Operations.

What is PN vision behind conducting AMAN Exercise?

Ans. Pakistan is a peace-loving country and has always strived to maintain good relations with all regional and extra-

regional countries. In line with this national policy, Pakistan Navy has been playing its role by actively engaging with the navies of all littoral states in the Indian Ocean Region and beyond. In order to enhance collaboration, interoperability in maritime domain, PN took the initiative of organising multinational exercise AMAN in 2007. The 7th exercise of this series is being held in February 2021 in which more than 42 countries from across the globe are likely to participate. The enhanced number of Navies' participation reflects growing trust in the value of the Exercise and PN's credibility in bringing navies of the East and West under a common platform for good of the global commons.

AMAN exercise is a clear manifestation of Pakistan's commitment towards regional maritime peace and stability embodied in its motto 'Together for Peace'.

What is the importance and relevance of Exercise AMAN for other countries in the region and international partners?

Ans. The purpose of the multinational exercise AMAN is to engage our partners, promote cooperation and interoperability between the regional and extra regional navies operating in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR).







To avail these opportunities, the participation of regional and extra regional navies has been steadily growing since its inception in 2007. All littoral states in the region, and international stakeholders, recognise that maritime environment in the wider region is facing number of challenges like terrorism, piracy, drugs smuggling, arms trafficking and natural calamities. The vastness of oceans, and easy availability of newer technologies has made maritime arena an attractive avenue for these illegal activities. Therefore, a consensus is growing that myriad maritime security challenges of the present era require collaborative approach at regional and international level. This can be achieved by enhancing cooperation, better understanding and interoperability amongst the navies. Exercise AMAN is therefore Pakistan's humble but focussed initiative in this direction and manifestation of PN commitment towards promoting peace and stability in the maritime region.

Besides AMAN, what initiatives are being taken by Pakistan in terms of defence diplomacy with the neighbouring countries and major naval forces?

Pakistan Ans. Navy through naval diplomacy is actively contributing to the nation's foreign policy objectives by showing Pakistan's flag in the countries far and wide; through Key Leadership Engagements; Navy to Navy Expert Level Talks; Overseas Deployments; and participation in bilateral/ multilateral international exercises on regular basis. Last year PN Ships undertook maiden overseas deployment around Africa in line with the

Government's 'Engage Africa Policy'. During the port visits apart from operational and collaborative activities with host navies, PN ships also established medical camps to help the local communities and to generate goodwill. As we speak, one PN Ship is on an overseas deployment cum humanitarian assistance mission to deliver aid to some African countries.

Additionally, Pakistan Navy is participating in all regional and international efforts and initiatives taken for maintaining good order and cooperation at high seas. In the same spirit, we have been participating in multinational exercises, Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) efforts and we have undertaken Non-Combatant Evacuation of stranded Pakistani and foreign nationals from conflict zones.

PN also routinely represents Pakistan's maritime perspective in international fora and is also a member of Indian Ocean Naval symposium (IONS) and an observer in the Western Pacific Naval Symposium (WPNS).



PAKISTAN NAVY INITIATIVE FOR PEACE IN THE

akistan has always been an avid supporter of regional peace and stability. Pakistan's commitment to the principle of 'peaceful coexistence' and desire for greater regional harmony and cooperation is also reflected through Pakistan's armed forces participation in UN Peacekeeping missions, UN mandated Combined Maritime Task Forces 150 & 151, participation in regional and extra-regional joint bilateral and multilateral exercises. To demonstrate Pakistan's commitment to peace, contribute towards regional maritime security and enhance cooperation and interoperability between regional and extra regional navies, Pakistan Navy took an initiative of holding Multinational exercise AMAN in 2007, which is being conducted biennially. Till to date six exercises have been conducted and 7th exercise is planned in February 2021. Since then, this exercise has become a major International Naval event which is evident from growing number of participations. This is also reflective of Pakistan's growing positive image and success of Ex AMAN.

The main objective/ theme of AMAN series of multinational exercises are to promote regional cooperation and stability, greater interoperability and to display a united resolve against terrorism and crimes in maritime domain including piracy. The exercise concept is to develop Responses, Tactics, Techniques and procedures (RTTPs) against non-traditional threats through tactical warfare planning, followed by high-end warfare serials at sea such as Naval Gunfire, VBSS, Anti-piracy, Operations, Combine Anti-Submarine Exercise, Communications, Boarding and Air Defence.

Exercise AMAN is planned with focused objectives to project positive image of Pakistan as a country contributing towards regional peace/ stability and to consolidate PN's position in the regional maritime arena. Displaying of united resolve against terrorism and crimes in maritime and to develop coalition building and multi-layered security cooperation to promote a safe & sustainable maritime environment. Enhance tactical interoperability between regional and extra regional navies thereby acting as a bridge between the regions and to validate

tactical procedures to counter non-traditional threats in maritime domain. Overall, AMAN exercise is a intermingling of multinationals with depiction of their respective cultures.

A brief overview of yesteryears AMAN exercises include first exercise conducted in March 2007. During the exercise, 14 x naval ships from Bangladesh, China, France, Italy, Malaysia, UK and USA navies participated. Special Operations Teams (SOF)/ Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) teams from Bangladesh and Turkey also participated in Special operations associated to the exercise. Overall, 28 countries participated in the exercise with naval assets and 29 observers. The second exercise, AMAN-09 was held in March 2009. During this exercise, 14 warships, 02 aircraft and 9 SOF teams of Australia, Bangladesh, China, France, Japan, Malaysia, UK, Nigeria, Turkey and USA participated. Overall, 24 countries participated in the exercise with the naval platforms and 29 observers. In third Exercise AMAN-11 held in March 2011 28 countries participated with naval assets and observers. Total of 11 ships from Australia, China, France, Indonesia, Italy,

Malaysia, Saudi Arab and USA participated. Three aircrafts from Australia and Japan and 03 SOF/ EOD/ Marines teams from China, Turkey and USA also participated during the exercise. Overall 28 countries participated in the exercise with the said assets and 43 observers.

The fourth Exercise AMAN-13 was held in March 2013. Navies of 29 countries participated in the said exercise with 12 ships, 02 aircraft, 06 SOF/ EOD teams and 36 observers. Fifth Exercise AMAN-17 conducted in North Arabian Sea from 10-14 Feb 2017. 12 ships from Australia, China, Indonesia. Russia, Sri Lanka, Turkey, UK and USA participated. In addition, SOF/ EOD/ Marines teams from China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Maldives, Russia, Sri Lanka, Turkey and UK also participated in the exercise. A total of 34 countries including Pakistan participated in the exercise with the said assets and 67 observers. The 6th Exercise AMAN-19 conducted from 08-12 February 2019. 11 x Ships from Australia, China, Italy, Malaysia, Oman, Sri Lanka, Turkey, UK and USA participated. Whereas, Japan participated with 01 x Ships and 2 x P3Cs as Pre-AMAN participation. Moreover, 15 x SOF/EOD/











Marines teams from China, Indonesia, Italy, Malaysia, Nigeria, Poland, Sri Lanka, Turkey, UK and USA also participated in the exercise. A total of 46 countries participated in the exercise with 113 observers.

The conduct of exercise AMAN is divided into Harbour and Sea Phases. Some of important events include Opening Ceremony on arrival of foreign warships. Wreath laying at martyrs monuments, Table Top Discussions on professional topics friendly sport matches, Maritime Counter Terrorism Demo by Special Services Group (N)/ Pak Marines. Various Calls and visits including inter-ship visits. International Band Display and International Cultural Display and Food Gala. Beside the other Activities, International Maritime Conference (IMC) under aegis of National Institute of Maritime Affairs, Bahria University. The highlight of the event includes presence of eminent speakers and delegates from across the globe. In the sea domain, an International Fleet Review (IFR) is scheduled toward the end of exercise. During IFR, various operational activities are conducted that include Replenishment at Sea, Counter Piracy Demo by PN MSW Team, Rocket Depth







Charge (RDC) firing, Surface Firing on Killer Tomato, Fly Past by Air Units (Pakistan Navy, Pakistan Airforce and Foreign participating Aircraft) and Man and Cheer Ship in honour of the Chief Guest. In addition to IFR, other sea activities including various exercises to practice response against maritime security threats in a multinational environment are also demonstrated. On land, Special Operation Forces (SOF), Explosives Ordnance Disposal (EOD) and Marines teams participate in the exercise. The SOF/ EOD/ Marine personnel have the frontline role against the threat of maritime terrorism and other crimes. Therefore, a number of exercises to develop Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTPs) for combined action by multinational forces against asymmetric threats are also planned. Overall, AMAN series of exercise are is a manifestation of trust and confidence of international community on Pakistan's efforts for ensuring peace & stability in the region and their desire to work/ operate with Pakistan and Pakistan Navy.

















he exquisite World Island is floating in the expanse of serene and resource-rich oceans. Sadly, today, both the landmass and oceans are in perpetual flux. The North or the South, the East or the West - the world is extensively self-sufficient in conflicts. The only dearth is of cooperation, of togetherness - for peace, and collective good. Nationstates of the twentieth century's international state system ought to pursue the charter of peace, security and cohesion unveiled upon formation of the United Nations on October 24, 1945. International and regional cooperation forums - political, economic, socio-cultural or military - are engines to propel the very aim. Naval Exercise Aman (an Urdu language word meaning Peace) conducted by Pakistan on biennial basis is one such step in the same direction, marching along with the world, with an objective to build transnational coalition and multi-layered security cooperation for a safe and sustainable maritime environment.

The maritime environment today is stormy, relatively perilous and uncertain. These are the oceans where the pull-and-push amongst different powers, both established and rising ones, is much more pronounced, as oceans continue to carry politico-military power from one shore to other. It seems strategic maritime theology of Admiral Alfred T. Mahan, a US

maritime strategist, is resurrecting in most of the rising nation-states. And, Mahanian philosophy is being asserted which emphasises, and rightly so, that none but the Navies have emerged to be the foremost protagonists for following vital missions:

- First, a nation-state asserts its politicostrategic influence overseas;
- Second, one projects its military power, as means of deterrence or compellance;
- Third, to defend maritime borders against any aggression, and support forces ashore as per overall military strategy of a country
- Fourth, it's a navy and other para-naval outfits such as coastguard organizations or maritime security agencies a state has its disposal to safeguard its maritime interests, wherever and whatsoever are identified in the national strategic designs;
- Fifth, to protect Sea Lines of Communication (SLOCs) including economic & trade interests, wherein energy need remains foremost of all as it sparks and sustains one's national socio-economic and industrial paraphernalia;
- Sixth, a state may employ a navy in undertaking benign operations such as Humanitarian Assistance & Disaster Relief (HA&DR) Ops; and combating maritime law enforcement functions against non-traditional threats
- Seventh, a state essentially employs its navy to be one of the premier tools of nation's diplomacy.

turbulent maritime security environment, shaped by Traditional and Non-traditional threats. Such choppy security situation and challenges are almost alike in every region including Indian Ocean. Rather, Indian Ocean, the 3rd largest one after the Pacific and Atlantic oceans, has acquired much greater significance. Owing to its pivotal position bridging the Global East and the West, the Indian Ocean carries around 60% of maritime highways' burden plying through it. Energy fan-faring from the Middle East having 56% of oil and 36% of natural gas reserves of the World make this region in general, and Arabian sea in particular, central to global politics in the perspective of geo-economics. Perpetual geo-strategic bouts of the US with China and Iran, and competition for influence have resulted strategic cyclone in the region. In US Containment policy against China vis-à-vis China's growing maritime muscles and presence in the Ocean are adding to the bitter taste of the US and its allies in the Indian Ocean. Importantly, the US-Iran tussle on nuclear issues has its ripples in the Arabian Sea as well. The premeditated pampering of India in the hands of the US vis-à-vis the former's inflating naval (& other combat) acquisitions is causing military imbalances, rising interest of Japan and Australia in the Indian Ocean in the form of Quadrilateral Strategic Dialogue famous (QUAD) have caused a massive military competition in the region. So, saying in few words, Great Powers' competition is back. And, the US has formally recognized this power competition and given much substance to this part of the oceans, even re-baptising the US Pacific Command as Indo-Pacific Command more recently in May 2018, beaming all its attention ranging from South China Sea to the Middle East.



What is the outcome? Great Powers' competition, tug-of-war for politico-strategic influence, extended militarization of the Indian Ocean and the blend of traditional and nontraditional threats causing cracks in maritime security of the region. Consequently, there exists a grave starvation of maritime cooperation and collaboration. All these ongoing developments and happenings in the Indian Ocean have implications for Pakistan. In Pakistan's national security perspective, its strong naval vigilance and collaborative maritime presence in the Indian Ocean is a strategic compulsion, not a choice. A stronger and compatible navy is a core national need, not an option.

Amongst the 38 states of the Indian Ocean, Pakistan remains one of the countries with its politico-strategic weight in the global affairs, and its geographical bearing. For defence of its maritime frontiers, accomplishment of foreign policy goals through naval diplomacy, ensuring forceful maritime security, Pakistan maintains a robust and potent navy in the Indian Ocean region. The Navy, following its national policy of 'peaceful co-existence' continues to advocate greater regional harmony and promote maritime cooperation for regional stability.

Against both traditional and non-traditional threats, Pakistan Navy has demonstrated its commitment for regional harmony and cooperation. Its participation in US-led Combined Maritime Task Forces 150 (Counterterrorism) and 151 (Counter-piracy) are reflective of Pakistan's policy of collaborative and cooperative engagements for global and regional causes of promoting peace through ensuring security. Regional Maritime Security Patrols (RMSP), Task Force-88 for maritime security of the gateway of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, and Pakistan Navy's active participation in other regional and international bilateral and multilateral maritime ventures are all but for one purpose of maintaining collective good order at sea.

Amongst various cooperative initiatives in the region, Naval Exercise AMAN (peace) stands unique. It is a multi-national exercise maiden version of which was held in March 2007 with participation of 28 countries, their naval assets and/or observers. So far, six episodes of the Aman exercise have been conducted successfully; marking Pakistan's international engagement and commitment to regional stability and peace. It is an extraordinary international and naval accomplishment for Pakistan, that AMAN is the largest international naval exercise in the world, earlier being the Rim of the Pacific exercise (RIMPAC) conducted by the United States. The 6th AMAN exercise held in February 2019 witnessed participation of ships, aircraft and Special Forces of more than 45 countries and over 110 international observers.

Being optimistic, February 2021 would embrace the 7th AMAN exercise, amidst another non-traditional threat that continues to engulf the whole world - COVID, with Navy's resolve to stand together for peace. During the exercise, the participating navies share best operational practices and undertake diverse range of maritime security operations - ashore and aboard. Prominent amongst these are enhancing Responses, Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (RTTPS), Anti-piracy operations, Combine Anti-Submarine Exercise, Boarding and Air Defence. All these drills are conducted amongst the global navies to exchange best and novel practices in all maritime operations. Cohesion of the world navies on tactical level enhances interoperability and thus connects the regions. As a result, coalitions are formulated for a multi-layered security cooperation to promote a safe and sustainable maritime environment.

In strategic and multilateral terms, AMAN aided in cementing the trust of the nationstates in the maritime security situation of the region and carved out politico-economic connectivity projects like CPEC and the 21st Century Maritime Silk Road. Interestingly, the two contesting nations, the US and China, the established power and a rising one, participate in this singular exercise under the flag of Pakistan. Thus, Pakistan, through Exercise Aman, bridges international collaboration and provides a cooperative forum for the nations with divergent interests. Not only in the maritime domain, but the Exercise Aman also stands out to be a flag-bearer of effective military diplomacy of Pakistan.

In the words of Ryunosuke Satoro, a Japanese literary legend, "Individually, we are one drop, together we are an ocean." Since today's maritime security challenges are multi-faceted and they harm all the nations of the world alike, nation-states ought to shove off the temptation of being a drop, an illusionism of power. Rather, they all should march along and join hands to nip the maritime threats in the bud, collectively, to pledge and preserve maritime security, for collective good of the Indian Ocean region, and mankind. They should be 'Together for Peace' as Exercise AMAN heralds under the emblem of Pakistan Navy, and the flag of Pakistan.

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AMAN-21 - Fostering Shared Vision for Maritime Security in Indian Ocean

man (peace), a major multinational exercise is a biennial event organised every two years since 2007. This notable effort is organised by Pakistan Navy (PN). It aims to augment inter-navy cooperation. Exercise Aman enhances interoperability potential between regional and other navies. The impressive assembly brings together navies from host of other nations, The cress manning ships from participating nations together with observers from other freely mingle with officers and men of Pakistan Navy. As a transnational platform, Exercise Aman helps to improve professional understanding between navies. The event also serves in raising the image of Pakistan amongst comity of nations. Such events promote Pakistan's cultural values. It provides good understanding of Pakistan to visiting nations. The exercise is a perfect example of maritime diplomacy. Exercise Aman is an enabler to enhance country's standing, promote professional competence of PN personnel and build synergy between participating navies.

Aman-21 is unique in several ways. With its slogan, "Together for Peace", the multinational

exercise comes at a time of some seismic changes taking place globally. These changes are having profound impact on Indian Ocean and its peripheries. For the first time, Russian navy will be participating in this year's naval drills. Other than Russia, Pakistan navy will host 30 countries in Aman-21. The current exercise will be seventh in Aman series. The endeavor is one of the several initiatives Pakistan Navy has relentlessly pursued for past two decades or so. These initiatives validate PN's unfaltering resolve to advance the cause of "freedom of seas" and raise prestige of Pakistan. In holding such exercises PN attempts to eliminate from Indian Ocean illicit activities in all their forms and manifestations. It has largely facilitated smooth and steady flow of commerce on its maritime highways. This is especially true for the western quadrant of Indian Ocean. The exercise also emphasizes developing combined potential for humanitarian assistance in the region.

Never since the end of cold war was the power struggle for global ascendancy been so intense in Indian Ocean as it is today. A new era of multi-polarity is emerging. Unlike the previous instance where Eurasian landmass was the principal battleground, it is the Indian and Pacific Oceans that are now focus of developing rivalry. The power politics is advanced in two oceans via maritime military power. The latest show of power came by way of two phased naval exercise jointly conducted by India, US, Australia and Japanese navies first, in Bay of Bengal and later in Arabian Sea. The exercise is seemingly founded on shared values and commitment to an open, inclusive Indo-Pacific and a rules-based international order. It is however anything but. In reality, it is a patent show of combined naval strength aimed at "containing" China.

The US cold war policy of "containment" is back after all, the United States must invent "threats" every now and then to keep its own military industrial complex, support factories and research and development facilities humming with activities. Under Modi, India too must create Chinese hysteria it serves two purposes. The alarm keeps New Delhi strategic relevance to the United States alive and buoyant. It also distracts attention of domestic audience from an underperforming economy and shelters a government under blistering criticism in world capitals owing to cruelty and blatant HR violations unleashed against minorities in Kashmir and across mainland India.

The Indian Ocean is 'the world's busiest trade corridor'. Two thirds of global oil shipments and a third of bulk cargo transit via this Ocean, roughly 80 per cent of China's. Around 90 per cent of South Korea's and 90 per cent of Japan's oil passes through the Indian Ocean', Aman promotes a shared vision to reinforce maritime security in the Indian Ocean. The exercise is designed to ensure trade continues to ply unhindered in the Indian Ocean region and with safety and security it merits.

As a large naval assemblage, Aman has no political undertones. It does not aim to target any country except ensure peace and stability. It is focused at counteracting against unconventional challenges like piracy, trafficking, terrorism, natural disaster etc. In recent times, the intensity of transnational criminal activities and other crimes has significantly declined in the





maritime region of interest to Pakistan. Thanks in large part to Pakistan Navy; operations in the UNSCR instituted coalition(s), independent patrolling and exercises like Aman that largely contributed towards this decline. The menace nonetheless still lurks.

Exercise Aman begins with a marathon international conference bringing together renowned scholars and professional experts on contemporary maritime security issues this is followed by diverse panel of experts who engage in extensive discussions the conversation and dialogue in these forums examine disparate challenges and their impact on maritime security. The solutions proffered are optimistic and often helpful. The event is followed by combined maneuvers at sea. Large presence is augmented by observers embarked on board various participating units conducting series of previously agreed drills. It leads to developing synergy and better professional understanding of each other's modus operandi.

Last year saw the global landscape and lives of mankind alter as perhaps never before in known history. The year left a dark indelible imprint on minds of humanity More people died in the United States alone on daily basis than in 9/11 attacks. By third week of December 2020, the death toll in America had reached a staggering 315 K while worldwide deaths were recorded at 1.7 million. There were more than 146 K deaths in India up until third week of December last. A new format of human life has already begun on planet. And it continues to unravel.

Vaccine or no vaccine, the novel corona virus is here to stay More pandemics are likely to hit humanity in coming years Climate change, flawed development models and curse of unchecked capitalism will continue to bring more misery on earth, humanity is encroaching on the habitat of wild species. This brings those still uncovered maladies in contact with humans with devastating results Militaries are not immune to pandemics. Covid provided a taste of environment in which future warfare will likely take place. The combat potential and readiness of any force is directly proportional to the morale and physical well-being of its manpower The men who run and operate military machines too, are susceptible to such external influences.

Future military forces will be grappling with changing nature and character of warfare and impact of advance technologies like Al and drone swarming aerial attacks, they will have to prepare to combat pandemics in rank and file The problem aggravates in case of navies which require working in tight spaces and for extended durations. Automation may not necessarily lead to complete replacement of human beings, yet the story is not new. In 430 BC during the much studied Peloponnesian war. The ancient Greece was struck by a devastating



plague Fought between two powerful alliances of their time, Athens and Sparta. The former experienced a serious setback with outbreak of plague. Between one-third and two-third of the Athenian population, including a prominent general perished. The latter too had to abort its invasion of Athenian land (Attica) to avoid

Indian Ocean is arguably the most contested and competitive ocean expanse in the world today. The great power competition in this century is being played out here Last decade saw an enormous upswing in strategic relationship between India and the US. Three key strategic pacts were inked by the two nations in just last 4 years Following LEMOA (2016) came, COMCASA in 2018 and the latest. a result of 2v2 talks is BECA. The Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (BECA) will facilitate interoperability of forces and exchange of sensitive, classified information as well as unhindered access to classified data by each party. This information will be supplemented by US satellites. All this will aid in navigation and precise targeting of military assets. In essence, the military resources of adversaries in the region will now be jointly monitored by India and the US.

The navy to navy collaboration between India and the US has meanwhile expanded in all dimensions. The USN-IN joint exercises are the most significant part in military to military relationship. It is obvious that all such combined moves are aimed against China and Pakistan. The ultimate targets of convergence of strategic interests are Pakistan and China indeed The definitive objective is to disallow China taking foothold in the Indian Ocean and thus preclude functioning of CPEC whose success resides in the port of Gwadar in Balochistan province. This would mean a lasting economic uncertainty for Pakistan and a strategic setback for China's BRI.

The recent dossier containing irrefutable evidence and list of subversive activities composed by RAW inside Pakistan is the ugly face of world's largest democracy. claiming to be fighting international terrorism. Nefarious designs of India by running high profile anti Pakistan international smear campaign was further exposed by European Union when it openly highlighted NGOs/agencies involved. The US and rest of the world will ignore such hideous machinations of Modi's India only at their own peril. Indian Ocean and South Asia are on a dangerous precipice. A small vet robust Pakistan navy continues to uphold "freedom of seas". It yearns for peace together. But this requires a shared collaborative effort. Multinational Maritime Exercise Aman is one small attempt in the direction.

AMAN 2021 – A CONTRIBUTOR TO MARITIME PEACE

bright sun shone on the decks of PNS NASR. It was 10th March, the third day of the sea phase of the multinational maritime exercise AMAN 2007. Since early morning, helicopters landed on her deck carrying VVIPs to witness the International Fleet Review. President of Pakistan was the Chief Guest. Governors of Balochistan and Sindh, the Chief Minister of Sindh and the Defence Minister were onboard. Ambassadors of several countries joined for the Review. Commander US Fifth Fleet arrived in a USN helicopter. The occasion wore a festive look and marked

the culmination of AMAN 2007, the first of AMAN series of multinational maritime exercises two US aircraft carriers USS Dwight D Eisenhower and John C Stennis closed PNS NASR. The Fleet Review started with a flypast by PN, PAF and US Navy aircraft and concluded with the traditional naval salute of Man and Cheer Ship from the 14 ships of Bangladesh, China, France, Italy, Malaysia, UK and USA led by units of PN Fleet. It was a treat to watch the smartly turned-out men in white lined on the decks of the passing ships cheering the President.

Pakistan Navy has been participating in the United Nations-mandated coalition efforts to keep the Indian Ocean peaceful and free from any unlawful activities. The influence and collaboration built up after an endeavour of 3 years (2004-2007) led to these nations joining the Pakistani sponsored international maritime exercise. Pakistan and Pakistan Navy were rightfully proud of their accomplishment on that day. Pakistan Navy initiated AMAN 2007, without any forethought of making it a regular event. The impressive success and appreciation of this maiden effort convinced Pakistan that the

exercise should become a regular biennial event. Since 2007, six AMAN exercises have been organized with wholesome participation of the regional and international navies.

AMAN is a multidimensional exercise. It comprises of harbour, sea, underwater, aerial and special ops activities. It has participants from all over the world. So far, 18 countries have participated in the six editions of AMAN exercise with ships, aircraft and special operation forces. Many other countries send their observers to witness these exercises. Navies from far off countries such as China, Russia, the United Kingdom and the United States come together for these multinational exercises. Forty-six countries participated in AMAN-2019. A similar number is likely to join AMAN-2021.

Organizing these exercises requires tremendous effort in logistics planning, operational finesse and organizational skill. However, it is not only work but some fun as well. AMAN exercises also bring the participants closer culturally through an international food festival and traditional music show. For all the participants these







events turn out to be a memorable part of this maritime exercise. AMAN-2021 in the shadows of COVID-19 will test the acumen of Pakistan Navy and its international partners in these trying environments. The objectives enshrined in the AMAN series of exercises have to be fulfilled even in the time of a pandemic. As an example, PNS Nasr sailed for a humanitarian aid and disaster relief (HADR) mission to the Red Sea African Coast in January 2021.

AMAN exercises have no political agenda or favour any country. Their focus is to develop friendly relationships and cooperation among the participating countries. The focus of the exercise remains to show-case interoperability, camaraderie among naval crews and removing barriers. It features navies and coast guards large and small. We all operate in the same medium; a global common. The large navies come to offer help to smaller nations. The smaller nations participate in the faith that they will earn the respect and collaboration as equal partners. They come together for mutual understanding and vouch to aid each other against nontraditional threats of terrorism, piracy, armed robbery, narco-trade, arms smuggling, human trafficking, illegal fishing and other illicit activities in our neighbouring maritime area.

The Indian Ocean Region is home to 35.4% of the World's population. The GDP of the Indian Ocean Littorals is a minuscule 10% of the World GDP. If you take out the rich nations of the Middle East, the prevalence of poverty in the region is easy to discern. The Indian Ocean is encircled by 29 littoral states and 6 island nations. It is the main artery of the world oceanic trade. About 80% of the World's oil trade passes through the Indian Ocean. Its shores are home to 23 of the World's top 100 container ports. So, the sea lanes in the Indian Ocean are vital for dry, liquid and gaseous cargoes and their worldwide supply-chain. Peace, stability and security of the Indian Ocean is of paramount importance for the World economy and the livelihood of the poor masses living in the Indian Ocean littorals. The Indian Ocean has not seen conflict between two nation-states

in more than 30 years. However, its security has been threatened by piracy and drugtrafficking. Somali Piracy was controlled by a rainbow coalition of maritime forces from around the world. This cooperative effort was unprecedented and historical. Nations far from the Horn of Africa such as Chile and South Korea participated to curb this menace. Drug-trafficking has seen a rise in the Indian Ocean. The international nature of the high seas makes the oceans particularly vulnerable to the illicit drug trade and other crimes. Countering them is not possible for any nation alone.

Multinational maritime exercises such as AMAN aim to meet non-traditional security threats jointly. They improve the interoperability and tactical proficiency between the coalition nations and enhance effectiveness in supporting maritime security objectives. The word AMAN is synonymous with maintaining peace and order. Pakistan Navy has been in the forefront of maintaining security as part of coalition forces CTF 150 and 151 and patrolling even singly far reaches of the Indian Ocean. AMAN 2021 manifests Pakistan Navy's desire in maintaining peace, stability and security in the Arabian Sea and the wider Indian Ocean. It will show the world our collective resolve to maintain 'AMAN' in our maritime domain. So true for the gathering of the mariners, in the words of Shakespeare, "Our navy is addressed, our power collected."

akistan and Turkey have agreed to further solidify and expand bilateral cooperation in the fields of trade and culture. It was agreed at a meeting between President Dr Arif Alvi and the visiting Turkish delegation, led by Turkish Foreign Minister, Mr Mevlut Cavusoglu, which called on him, at Aiwan-e-Sadr. Welcoming the delegation, the President said that Pakistan and Turkey enjoyed excellent relations and both countries needed to further enhance economic and cultural relations for the mutual benefit of the two countries. He informed that Pakistan's ranking of Ease of Doing Business had tremendously improved and Turkish investors needed to capitalize on investment opportunities in Pakistan. He expressed satisfaction over Turkish investment in Pakistan which had grown over USD 1 Billion. The President deeply thanked the Turkish leadership for its principled stance on Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir. He asked the Foreign Minister to convey his gratitude to President Recep Tayyip Erdogan for raising the voice of Kashmiris during his recent speech at UN General Assembly. Expressing concern on the growing phenomenon of Islamophobia, it was agreed to increase collaboration to reflect the true values of Islam and enhance interfaith harmony globally.

An MoU relating to cooperation in the education field (working of Turkish MAARIF Foundation) was signed following the conclusion of delegation-level talks. Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu and Pakistan's Minister of Federal Education and Professional Training Shafqat Mahmood signed the MoU.



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



The distinctive civilization of Sri Lanka, with roots that can be traced back to the 6th century BCE, is characterized by two factors: the preservation of Theravada Buddhism (the orthodox school of Buddhism having its literary traditions in the Pali language) and the development over two millennia of a sophisticated system of irrigation in the drier parts of the country. This civilization was further enriched by the influences of Hinduism and Islam.

administrative purposes, the country has been divided into nine provinces and subdivided into 25 districts.





he Government of Japan has agreed to provide grants approximately worth 1,986 million Japanese Yen (Equivalent to around 19 million USD / around 3,057 million PKR) for installation of weather surveillance radar in Sukkur, Sindh province.

Notes to this effect were signed and exchanged between H.E. he 2nd Trilateral Meeting of the Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Azerbaijan, the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and the Republic of Turkey was held in Islamabad. The meeting concluded with the signing of Islamabad Declaration by the three Foreign Ministers. The text of the Declaration is as follows:

At the invitation of Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, and with the participation of H.E. Mr. Mevlut Cavusoglu, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Turkey and H.E. Mr. Jeyhun Bayramov, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Azerbaijan, the Second round of Trilateral Dialogue of the Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the three countries was held in Islamabad on 13 January 2021.

The Ministers,

Emphasizing the existing cordial ties among the three countries, based on fraternity, historic and cultural bonds, mutual respect and trust;

Desirous of deepening further cooperation built on outcome of the first Trilateral Meeting held in Baku on 30 November 2017, in all areas of mutual interest, including political, strategic, trade, economic, peace and security, science and technology and cultural fields;

Mindful of the significant contributions made by Pakistan, Turkey and Azerbaijan for promotion of peace, stability and development in their





respective regions and the mutual desire of their peoples to further advance these ideals for shared prosperity and security in the broader region;

Conscious of the myriad challenges and emerging threats confronting their countries including but not limited to threats of foreign sponsored acts of terrorism, cyber-attacks, hybrid forms of warfare, targeted disinformation campaigns, and escalating trends of Islamophobia

affecting the peaceful co-existence of Muslim communities in many countries;

Expressing serious concerns on the grave human rights violations and crimes against humanity committed against the Muslim communities in various parts of the world;

Fully aware of the far-reaching implications of the COVID 19 pandemic as well as the vulnerability of the respective regions to

adverse impacts of climate change;

Expressing solidarity with the government and people Azerbaijan in their efforts to rebuild and rehabilitate liberated territories;

And reaffirming commitment towards developing regional consensus for peace development;

Reiterated their and strong unequivocal support for safeguarding and defending the sovereignty, territorial integrity and inviolability of international borders of their respective States;

Agreed to enhance joint efforts combating Islamophobia, discrimination and persecution of Muslim minorities, in particular at the regional and international fora;

Recognized the contribution of the Heart of Asia-Istanbul Process in peace, stability and economic prosperity in Afghanistan and in the region, and appreciated the efforts of the Government of Pakistan in facilitating a political solution to the issues in the region, expressed their support to Afghan-led, Afghanowned peace process;

Renewed their resolve to strengthen cooperation in peace and security in line with various international and regional instruments to combat all forms and manifestations of terrorism, transnational organized crime, trafficking of drugs, narcotics, trafficking in persons, money laundering, crimes against cultural and historical heritage and cybercrimes;

Reaffirmed the most recent OIC resolution 10/47-Pol on the Jammu and Kashmir dispute adopted in Niamey in November 2020 and Communiqués of OIC Contact Group on Jammu and Kashmir and expressed deep concern over the unilateral actions of 5 August 2019, continuing grave human rights violations in and efforts to change the demographic structure of Jammu and Kashmir, and reiterated their principled position for a peaceful settlement of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in accordance with the relevant UN Security Council Resolutions;

Resolved to support a just, sustainable and realistic and mutually accepted settlement of the Cyprus issue, as well as the issues in the Aegean and the Eastern Mediterranean on the basis of international law;

Reiterated their support for putting an end to the Armenia-Azerbaijan conflict and normalization of relations on the basis of sovereignty and territorial integrity and internationally recognized borders of Azerbaijan in accordance with the relevant UN Security Council resolutions;

Committed to promote cooperation in defence and security fields, including through sharing best practices, capacity building, new and emerging technologies and regular exchange of visits;

far-reaching Discussed the implications for economic growth and public health due to COVID 19 pandemic, agreed to exchange information, research, expertise and best practices, and called for enhanced international cooperation and solidarity to effectively and comprehensibly addressing the challenge, keeping in view financial and capacity limitations of developing countries; Decided to intensify and deepen cooperation enhancing for trilateral trade &investment and encouraged the relevant ministries of the three countries to develop a robust Action Plan with concrete recommendations regarding easing of duties, tariff and nontariff barriers, transportation costs, better coordination among the banking sectors and protection of mutual investments, consideration and approval by the leadership; Determined to enhance cooperation on regional connectivity in transport, trade, energy, people-to-people contacts, education, social and cultural tourism, and exchange, including through improving and strengthening air, rail and road links and regional connectivity initiatives at various regional fora; Underlined the need to intensify cooperation for food and energy security, environment, sustainable development and climate change and called for greater international cooperation for timely response and achievement of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals.

n line with Foreign Minister Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi's long-term focus on economic diplomacy, a third virtual envoys meeting on the subject, chaired by the Foreign Minister. Foreign Minister Qureshi stated that, as part of this initiative, Pakistan's outreach and presence in Africa was being significantly enhanced. An Envoys Conference on Africa was held in November 2019, followed by the first ever Pakistan-Africa Trade Development Conference in Nairobi in January 2020. He remarked that the initiative had started paying off, with a 7% growth in Pakistan's trade with Africa, despite the Covid-19 related challenges. The Foreign Minister encouraged Envoys to cultivate and broaden mutually beneficial trade and economic partnerships with African countries, focusing on key goals of trade promotion, financial inflows, investments, remittances, tourism and technology transfer. 
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

Oath taking ceremony of President-elect Joe Biden

resident-elect Joe Biden became President
Biden at noon Eastern time, after he took
the oath of office to become the nation's
46th commander in chief.

Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts conducted the swearing-in ceremony. Biden placed his hand on a family Bible.

There ceremony took place on the West Front of the U.S. Capitol, on the same stage that was stormed by pro-Trump insurrectionists just two weeks ago. Stringent security measures are in place to protect the nation's leaders from any more violence.

Between the security risks and the raging coronavirus pandemic, the in-person audience

has been limited to a small fraction of the typical crowd. Millions of viewers are expected to be watching from home. A solemn event conducted virtually may be the new normal for this pandemic, but it still marks a surreal departure from the traditional inauguration ceremony.

For Biden, the swearing-in marks the end of a decades-long, hard-fought quest for the presidency — and the beginning of a new challenge, as the administration combats simultaneous crises while governing a deeply divided nation.

Curious about what, exactly, Biden is swearing to? The presidential oath of office is laid out in the Constitution:


"I do solemnly swear [or affirm] that I will faithfully execute the Office of President of the United States, and will to the best of my ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States." The option to "affirm," rather than swear, is rarely used, and is provided for those whose religious beliefs do not support swearing. After his swearing-in, Biden will deliver an inaugural address. You can follow live annotations by NPR journalists here.

As is customary, Biden's swearing-in follows the swearing in of the vice president. Kamala Harris was sworn in by Justice Sonia Sotomayor, using two Bibles: one that used to belong to Thurgood Marshall, and one that belonged to Regina Shelton, a close family friend and mother figure to Harris.

hief Justice Roberts, Vice President Harris. Speaker Pelosi, Leaders Schumer, McConnell, Vice President Pence, my distinguished guests and my fellow Americans, this is America's day.

This is democracy's day. A day of history and hope of renewal and resolve through a crucible for the ages. America has been tested anew and America has risen to the challenge. Today, we celebrate the triumph not of a candidate, but of a cause, the cause of democracy. The people, the will of the people, has been heard and the will of the people has been heeded.

We've learned again that democracy is precious. Democracy is fragile. At this hour, my friends, democracy has prevailed1. From now, on this hallowed ground, where just a few days ago, violence sought to shake the Capitol's very foundation, we come together as one nation, under God, indivisible, to carry out the peaceful transfer of power, as we have for more than two centuries.

As we look ahead in our uniquely American way: restless, bold, optimistic, and set our sights on the nation we can be and we must be.

I thank my predecessors of both parties for their presence2 here today. I thank them from the bottom of my heart. And I know, I know the resilience of our Constitution and the strength, the strength of our nation. As does President Carter, who I spoke with last night, who cannot be with us today, but whom we salute for his lifetime of service.

I've just taken the sacred oath each of those patriots have taken. The oath, first sworn by George Washington. But the American story depends not on any one of us, not on some of us, but on all of us, on we the people who seek a more perfect union.

This is a great nation. We are good people. And over the centuries, through storm and strife, in peace and in war, we've come so far. But we still have far to go. We'll press forward with speed and urgency, for we have much to do in this winter of peril and significant possibilities, much to repair, much to restore, much to heal, much to build, and much to gain. Few people in our nation's history have been more challenged or

found a time more challenging or difficult than the time we're in now. A once-in-a-century virus that silently stalks the country. It's taken as many lives in one year as America lost in all of World War II. Millions of jobs have been lost. Hundreds of thousands of businesses closed. A cry for racial justice, some 400 years in the making, moves us. The dream of justice for all will be deferred no longer.

The cry for survival comes from the planet itself, a cry that can't be any more desperate or any more clear. And now a rise of political extremism, white supremacy, domestic terrorism that we must confront and we will defeat. To overcome these challenges, to restore the soul and secure the future of America requires so much more than words. It requires the most elusive of all things in a democracy: Unity. Unity.

In another January, on New Year's Day in 1863, Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation. When he put pen to paper, the president said, and I quote: "If my name ever goes down into history, it'll be for this act. And my whole soul is in it." My whole soul was in it today. On this January day, my whole soul is in this: Bringing America together, uniting our people, uniting our nation. And I ask every American to join me in this cause. Uniting to fight the foes we face: anger, resentment, hatred, extremism, lawlessness, violence, disease, joblessness and hopelessness. With unity, we can do great things, important things. We can right wrongs. We can put people to work in good jobs. We can teach our children in safe schools. We can overcome the deadly virus. We can reward, reward work, and rebuild the middle class and make health care secure for all. We can deliver racial justice and we can make America once again the leading force for good in the world.

I know speaking of unity can sound to some like a foolish fantasy these days. I know the forces that divide us are deep and they are real, but I also know they are not new. Our history has been a constant struggle between the American ideal that we're all created equal and the harsh, ugly reality that racism, nativism, fear, demonization have long torn us apart. The battle is perennial and victory is never assured. Joe Biden and Jill Biden wave as they arrive at the

world war, 9/11, through struggle, sacrifice and setbacks, our better angels have always prevailed. In each of these moments, enough of us have come together to carry all of us forward. And we can do that now. History, faith and reason show the way, the way of unity. We can see each other not as adversaries, but as neighbors. We can treat each other with dignity and respect. We can join forces, stop the shouting and lower the temperature. For without unity, there is no peace — only bitterness and fury. No progress — only exhausting outrage. No nation — only a state of chaos.

This is our historic moment of crisis and challenge. And unity is the path forward. And we must meet this moment as the United States of America. If we do that, I guarantee you we will not fail. We have never, ever, ever, ever failed in America when we've acted together.

And so today at this time in this place, let's start afresh, all of us. Let's begin to listen to one another again. Hear one another, see one another, show respect to one another. Politics doesn't have to be a raging fire, destroying everything in its path. Every disagreement doesn't have to be a cause for total war. And we must reject the culture in which facts themselves are manipulated and even manufactured.

My fellow Americans, we have to be different than this. America has to be better than this. And I believe America is so much better than this. Just look around. Here we stand in the shadow of the Capitol dome, as was mentioned earlier, completed amid the Civil War, when the Union itself was literally hanging in the balance. Yet we endured, we prevailed. Here we stand looking out on the great Mall where Dr. King spoke of his dream. Here we stand, where 108 years ago, at another inaugural, thousands of protesters tried to block brave women marching for the right to vote. And today we marked the swearing-in of the first woman in American history elected to national office: Vice President Kamala Harris. Don't tell me things can't change.

Here we stand across the Potomac from Arlington Cemetery, where heroes who gave the last full measure of devotion rest in eternal peace. And here we stand just days after a Grafithus Wibitell-bugset they could use violence to silence the will of the people, to stop the work

of our democracy, to drive us from this sacred ground. It did not happen. It will never happen. Not today, not tomorrow, not ever. Not ever.

To all those who supported our campaign, I'm humbled by the faith you've placed in us. To all those who did not support us, let me say this: Hear me out as we move forward. Take a measure of me and my heart. If you still disagree, so be it. That's democracy. That's America. The right to dissent, peaceably, the guardrails of our republic, is perhaps this nation's greatest

Yet hear me clearly: Disagreement must not lead to disunion. And I pledge this to you: I will be a president for all Americans. All Americans. And I promise you I will fight as hard for those who did not support me as for those who did.

Many centuries ago, St. Augustine, a saint in my church, wrote to the people was a multitude defined by the common objects of their love. Defined by the common objects of their love. What are the common objects we as Americans love, that define us as Americans? I think we know. Opportunity, security, liberty, dignity, respect, honor and, yes, the truth.

Recent weeks and months have taught us a painful lesson. There is truth and there are lies, lies told for power and for profit. And each of us has a duty and responsibility, as citizens, as Americans, and especially as leaders, leaders who have pledged to honor our Constitution and protect our nation, to defend the truth and defeat the lies. Look — I understand that many of my fellow Americans view the future with fear and trepidation. I understand they worry about their jobs. I understand, like my dad, they lay in bed at night, staring at the ceiling, wondering: Can I keep my health care? Can I pay my mortgage? Thinking about their families, about what comes next. I promise you, I get it.

But the answer is not to turn inward, to retreat into competing factions, distrusting those who don't look like you or worship the way you do, or don't get their news from the same sources you do. We must end this uncivil war 9that pits red against blue, rural vs. urban, conservative vs. liberal. We can do this if we open our souls instead of hardening our hearts. If we show a little tolerance and humility, and if we're willing to stand in the other person's shoes, as my mom would say, just for a moment, stand in their shoes. Because here's the thing about life: There's no accounting for what fate will deal you. Some days when you need a hand. There are other days when we're called to lend a hand. That's how it has to be. That's what we do for one another. And if we are this way, our country will be stronger, more prosperous, more ready for the future. And we can still disagree.

My fellow Americans, in the work ahead of us, we're going to need each other. We need all our strength to persevere through this dark winter. We're entering what may be the toughest and deadliest period of the virus. We must set aside politics and finally face this pandemic as one nation. One nation And I promise you this, as the Bible says: "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning." We will get through this together. Together.



Look, folks. All my colleagues I served with in the House and the Senate up there, we all understand the world is watching, watching all of us today. So here's my message to those beyond our borders: 11America has been tested and we've come out stronger for it. We will repair our alliances and engage with the world once again. Not to meet yesterday's challenges, but today's and tomorrow's challenges. And we'll lead, not merely by the example of our power, but by the power of our example.

We'll be a strong and trusted partner for peace, progress and security. Look - you all know we've been through so much in this nation. And my first act as president, I'd like to ask you to join me in a moment of silent prayer to remember all those who we lost this past year to the pandemic. Those 400,000 fellow Americans. Moms, dads, husbands, wives, sons, daughters, friends, neighbors and co-workers. We will honor them by becoming the people and the nation we know we can and should be. So I ask you, let's say a silent prayer for those who've lost their lives, those left behind, and for our country.

Folks, this is a time of testing. We face an attack on our democracy and on truth, a raging virus, growing inequity, the sting of systemic racism, a climate in crisis, America's role in the world. Any one of these will be enough to challenge us in profound ways. But the fact is, we face them all at once, presenting this nation with one of the gravest responsibilities we've had. Now we're going to be tested. Are we going to step up? All of us? It's time for boldness, for there is so much to do. And this is certain, I promise you: We will be judged, you and I, by how we resolve these cascading crises of our era.

Will we rise to the occasion is the question. Will we master this rare and difficult hour? Will we meet our obligations and pass along a new and better world to our children? I believe we must. I'm sure you do as well. I believe we will. And when we do, we'll write the next great chapter in the history of the United States of America. The American story. A story that might sound something like a song that means a lot to me.

It's called "American Anthem." There's one verse that stands out, at least for me, and it goes like

The work and prayers of a century have brought us to this day.

What shall be our legacy? What will our children

Let me know in my heart when my days are through.

America, America, I gave my best to you.

Let's add. Let us add our own work and prayers to the unfolding story of our great nation. If we do this, then when our days are through, our children and our children's children will say of us: They gave their best, they did their duty, they healed a broken land.

My fellow Americans, I close the day where I began, with a sacred oath before God and all of you. I give you my word, I will always level with you. I will defend the Constitution. I'll defend our democracy. I'll defend America and I will give all, all of you. Keep everything I do in your service, thinking not of power, but of possibilities, not of personal interest, but the public good. And together we shall write an American story of hope, not fear. Of unity, not division. Of light, not darkness. A story of decency and dignity, love and healing, greatness and goodness. May this be the story that guides us. The story that inspires us and the story that tells ages yet to come that we answered the call of history. We met the moment. Democracy and hope, truth and justice did not die on our watch, but thrived. That America secured liberty at home and stood once again as a beacon to the world. That is what we owe our forebears, one another and generations to follow.

Supreme Council during the 36th GCC Summit held in December 2015.

The Supreme Council assigned all ministerial and technical bodies, councils, committees, the Secretariat General, and all other GCC agencies to implement the remaining steps in the vision, by doubling their efforts within a specific timeframe, including the implementation of economic unity, joint defence and security systems within the Cooperation Council. The vision's terms also include developing a unified and effective foreign policy that preserves the Council's interests and benefits, helping it avoid regional and international conflicts, and meet the goals and aspirations of GCC citizens.

The Council instructed the Secretariat General to submit a comprehensive report for the next summit to the Supreme Council, clarifying what has been implemented from the terms of the vision, and to submit proposals that would help alleviate any difficulties facing the implementation of the vision.

Joint Gulf actions

The Supreme Council looked into the outcome of the implementation of its decision made at the 32nd GCC Summit regarding the proposal of King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz, may God have mercy on his soul, which constitutes moving the Gulf states from a place of cooperation to a place of union, instructing the Supreme Council to continue its efforts in achieving this transformation, as well as the Ministerial Council and the head of the specialised body to implement the necessary measures towards this transformation, and to inform the Supreme Council during the next Summit of what has been achieved.

The Supreme Council reviewed the developments made regarding the joint Gulf actions, and stressed the importance of preserving the Council's achievements and accomplishments.

The Council also directed the competent bodies in the member states, Secretariat General and the ministerial and technical committees to redouble their efforts to achieve the noble goals stipulated in the Statute of the Cooperation Council. The Supreme Council praised the efforts of the GCC states to enhance the

mechanisms of integrity, efficiency, governance, transparency and accountability in government agencies, and the fight against corruption. It also called for the strengthening of joint cooperation in its fight against corruption within the framework of the GCC, its agencies and the specialised Gulf organisations.

The Supreme Council emphasised importance of implementation of all decisions and agreements issued and made by the Cooperation Council. It also stressed the importance of implementing the decisions according to the outlined schedule and the commitment to the contents of these decision because of its importance in protecting the security of member states, maintaining their stability, protecting the safety of the states and the interests of their citizens, as well as creating a stable economic and social environment that enhances the wellbeing of GCC citizens.

The Supreme Council approved the establishment of the Gulf Center for Disease Prevention and Control, under the umbrella of Gulf Health Council for Cooperation Council States. The Supreme Council approved the extension of the validity period of the unified guiding regulation for empowering people with disabilities, and unified guiding regulation for volunteer work as a guideline, for a period of two years.

Economic integration

The Supreme Council stressed the importance of focusing on projects with an integrated strategic dimension in economic and developmental areas, most notably the completion of the requirements of the Customs Union, the completion of the common Gulf market and the railway project. The Council stressed the need to work on developing an integrated system to achieve food, water and energy security, and adopting the goals and mechanisms of the Fourth Industrial Revolution in the field of information technology, communication and Artificial Intelligence. The Supreme Council emphasised the importance of continuing to support and encourage small and medium enterprises, believing in their vital role and contributions to the economies of the GCC states.

Only after polishing can a piece of jade be finer. We overcame the impact of the pandemic, and made great achievements in coordinating prevention and control and in economic and social development.

The 13th Five-Year Plan has been accomplished in full. The 14th Five-Year Plan is being comprehensively formulated. We are accelerating the pace to set up a new pattern for development, and are deeply implementing high-quality development. In the future, we should further deepen reform and expand opening-up with greater courage, and create more "Stories of Spring." We are not alone on the Great Way and the whole world is one family. After a year of hardship, we can understand more than ever the significance of a community with a shared future for mankind.

I had many phone calls with friends from the international community, both old and new, and attended many "cloud conferences." What we discussed most was staying united to combat the pandemic. We still have a long way to go in pandemic prevention and control. People from all over the world should join hands and support each other to early dispel the gloom of the pandemic and strive for a better "Earth home." 2021 will see the 100th birthday of the Communist Party of China. Its 100-year journey surges forward with great momentum. Its original aspiration remains even firmer one hundred years later. From Shikumen in Shanghai to the South Lake in Jiaxing City, the small red boat (where the first CPC congress concluded) bore the great trust of the people and the hope of the nation. The boat has sailed through turbulent rivers and treacherous shoals, and has voyaged across violent tidal waves, becoming a great ship that navigates China's stable and long-term development.

The CPC bears its eternal great cause in mind, and the centenary only ushers in the prime of life. China, EU complete investment agreement negotiations

hinese President Xi Jinping and European leaders on Wednesday announced that the two sides have completed investment agreement negotiations as scheduled.

The announcement was made during a meeting between Xi and German Chancellor Angela Merkel, French President Emmanuel Macron, President of the European Council Charles Michel and President of the European Commission Ursula von der Leyen via video link.


Calling the investment agreement between China and the European Union (EU) as "balanced, high-standard and mutually beneficial," Xi said the treaty has shown China's determination and confidence to push high-level opening up.

"The agreement will provide greater market access, higher level of business environment, stronger institutional guarantees and brighter cooperation prospects for mutual investment," Xi said. The treaty will also greatly boost world economic recovery in the post-pandemic era, enhance the international community's confidence in economic globalization and free trade, making significant contributions to the building of an open world economy, the Chinese president said.

Stressing China's commitment to fostering a new development paradigm will provide more market opportunities and cooperation potential for the EU and the world at large, Xi called on the EU to uphold free trade and multilateralism, and provide an open, fair and non-discriminatory business environment for Chinese investors.

Against the background of the COVID-19 pandemic and changes rarely seen in a century, Xi said, China and the EU, through tiding over difficulties and working hand-in-hand, have made fruitful achievements in advancing ties in 2020. In the upcoming year of 2021, China and Europe, as two major global forces, markets and civilizations, should demonstrate a sense of responsibility and take active steps to contribute to global peace and progress, he said.

Xi urged the two sides to enhance dialogue and mutual trust, deepen cooperation, properly manage differences, and work together to nurture new opportunities and open up new prospects.



First, Xi called for coordinated actions of pandemic response to ensure the equal distribution of COVID-19 vaccines as global public goods, especially to make sure the move benefits developing countries. Second, Xi urged joint efforts to promote economic recovery, adding the two sides should step up policy coordination and uphold building an open world economy to bring global industrial and supply chains back on track as soon as possible.

Third, Xi called on the two sides to synergize development strategies, urging intensified efforts in policy coordination, better synergy between the Belt and Road Initiative and the Eurasian interconnection strategy, and discussions about cooperation in the digital sector. Fourth, Xi called for speeding up green development, urging the two sides to give full play to their high-level dialogue mechanism on environment and climate, and give mutual support to each other in hosting international conferences on biodiversity, climate change, and conservation of nature.

Fifth, Xi urged multilateral cooperation, adding China and Europe should enhance coordination and cooperation within frameworks including the United Nations, the Group of Twenty (G20), the World Trade Organization, and the World Health Organization, facilitate political settlement of international and regional hotspot issues, actively implement the G20 debt service suspension initiative, and support pandemic response and development in Africa, to promote world development and prosperity.

The European leaders said that despite the impact of COVID-19, Europe and China had maintained


close high-level communication this year and made important progress on a series of issues including the agreement on geographical indications. They said the completion of the investment agreement negotiations was an important milestone in the development of EU-China relations and will also help promote the recovery and growth of the world economy.

The achievements once again showed to the world that although Europe and China have differences on some issues, both sides have the political will to strengthen dialogue and deepen cooperation on the basis of mutual respect to achieve mutual benefit and win-win results, they said. The investment agreement is a high-level one, they said. The European side appreciates China's further opening up and active moves to promote trade liberalization and investment facilitation. Both sides support multilateralism, and a strong EU-China relationship is conducive to solving global challenges, according to the leaders. The European side appreciates China's major moves in addressing climate change and helping Africa fight the pandemic, and hopes to continue to coordinate and cooperate closely with China on issues such as global anti-pandemic, climate change, biodiversity conservation, sustainable development, and WTO reform.

The Chinese and European leaders exchanged New Year greetings and jointly stated that they will maintain close communication in the upcoming new year, jointly advance the agenda of major exchanges between the two sides, and promote the continuous development of China-EU comprehensive strategic partnership.

In the third phase (2025-2030) also called the period of maturity, the indigenous

mechanism for sustainable economic growth will be in place and CPEC will be ready to play a leadership role in the region.

Ms. Zhao Qiao, Director, Department of Urdu, Asian & African Center, China Media Group said that the media of both countries fought misinformation regarding Pakistani students in Wuhan during COVID-19 by interviewing them

He said that COVID-19 cooperation between Pakistan and China has been exemplary. He also appreciated the Chinese Communist Party for extending full support to Pakistan during the pandemic. Amir Ghauri, Editor of The News talked about the ways to respond to CPEC challenges and said that the coverage of this grand project has seen a significant increase since its launch. They were of the opinion that enhanced economic cooperation would give impetus to the existing bilateral relations through parliamentary and economic cooperation. The Speaker Asad Qaiser was talking to Li Zhanshu in a Virtual meeting held today. Both the Presiding Officers directed their respective Secretariats to take necessary steps for constitution of Joint a parliamentary Committee.

During the meeting Speaker Asad Qaiser was accompanied by Deputy Speaker Qasim Khan Suri, Chairman CPEC committee Sher Ali Arbab, Chairman Foreign Affairs Committee Ehsan ullah Tiwana, Convener Pak-China Friendship Group Noor Alam Khan and other members of the National Assembly whereas Chairman NPC was accompanied by Deputy Speaker NPC and Chairmen of the Committees on Foreign Affairs and Law. This virtual meeting is first high level contact between the two presiding officers after the breakout of COVID-19 pandemic.

The Speaker said that Pakistan considers China its closest friend, staunchest partner and an iron brother. He said that consistent progression in the relations exemplifies a unique model of brotherhood. He congratulated his Chinese counterpart on 71st anniversary of Sino-Pak diplomatic relations and Chinese New Year.

Speaker Asad Qaiser said that Pakistan strongly believes in territorial integrity of

China and fully supports One China policy. He said that Pakistan values Chinese support on international and regional forums.

He said that Kashmir being the bleeding wound on the map of the world needed international attention for mitigation of miseries of Kashmiri people and fulfilment of international commitment. He said that China's equivocal support on Kashmir issue is valued by people and government of Pakistan.

Chairman National People's Congress Li Zhanshu said that China also considers Pakistan one of its brother and a closest strategic ally. He said that China would always stand by Pakistan for its defence and maintaining territorial integrity. He said

that Covid-19 was devastating for the China as well as the world, however support of Pakistan specially the parliament had boosted the Chinese moral to fight that disease. He assured the Speaker that provision of covid-19 vaccine was on the top most priority of the Chinese Government.

Speaking about the CPEC, Chairman NPC said that CPEC was of utmost importance for the economies of both the countries. Referring to the instances of terrorism in the region, underlined the need for security of CPEC to keep it moving on right track. Paying special gratitude to the Speaker Asad Qaiser, he said that his support for establishment of special economic zones under CPEC earlier as Speaker KPK Assembly and later as Speaker National Assembly had been exemplary. He said that Gawadar port and other projects under CPEC would play an important role in economic development in Pakistan.

Speaker Asad Qaiser said that CPEC was undoubtedly lifeline for economic development of Pakistan and mechanism had been devised for ensuring security of the CPEC projects. He said that any attempt to disrupt activity under CPEC would not be tolerated. He said that activity under CPEC had gained momentum and the Rasakai Special Economic Zone would be functional soon which would generate economic activity besides providing employment particularly in the KPK province and the country in general. The Speaker proposed a joint Parliament Committee comprising members from Parliament of Pakistan and National People's Congress for effective oversight of the CPEC projects.



CPEC Joint Working Group on International Cooperation Holds the Second Meeting

n December 25, 2020, the Joint Working Group on International Cooperation and Coordination (JWG-ICC) under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) held the second meeting in Urumqi, Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region. The meeting was cochaired by Vice Foreign Minister Luo Zhaohui and Foreign Secretary of Pakistan Sohail Mahmood.

After looking back at the work progress achieved since the inaugural meeting of JWG-ICC on April 9, 2019, the two sides agreed that the two countries' close cooperation and mutual support amid the COVID-19 outbreak has laid the foundation for economic recovery in the post-pandemic era and injected new

momentum into the construction of the CPEC. The two sides reiterated that they will implement the consensus of the two leaders and promote the CPEC to focus more upon industry, agriculture, science and technology, and people's livelihood fields and to reach into less developed areas, so as to make the CPEC a model project for the high-quality development of the Belt and Road cooperation. The two sides reaffirmed that the CPEC is an open and inclusive initiative, and its construction will be launched with third parties following the principles of extensive consultation, joint contribution and shared benefits and on the basis of consensus between China and Pakistan through negotiations and full demonstration.

The two sides agreed to continue to publicize the positive role of the CPEC in improving local livelihoods and to clarify inaccurate reports about the CPEC in a timely manner. They encourage the media, film and television, and publishing sectors of the two countries to strengthen cooperation on the CPEC-related topics, and welcome think tanks, experts and scholars of the two countries to conduct bilateral and multilateral exchanges on the CPEC construction, in a bid to jointly expand the CPEC's influence and spur the high-quality development of the Belt and Road cooperation.

The two sides signed the minutes of the meeting, reflecting the consensus reached at the meeting.

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
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


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
