

UZBEKISTAN – PAKISTAN BUSINESS FORUM

Pakistan, Uzbekistan pledge to boost ties in all sectors

n the invitation of President of Uzbekistan Mr. Shavkat Mirziyoyev, Prime Minister Imran Khan reached Tashkent for a twoday official visit today. The Prime Minister was received by the Prime Minister of Uzbekistan and high-level officials of the Uzbek government. The Prime Minister is accompanied by a highlevel ministerial delegation including Foreign Minister Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi, Interior Minister Sheikh Rashid Ahmed, Minister for Information and Broadcasting Fawad Chaudhary, Minister for Maritime Affairs Ali Zaidi, Advisor to the Prime Minister on Commerce and Investment Abdul Razak Dawood, National Security Advisor Moeed Yousaf, and Foreign Secretary Sohail Mahmood. After Official reception ceremony, the Prime Minister held a one-on-one meeting with the Uzbek President during which both leaders discussed a wide range of subjects - including the historic and cultural ties between the two countries, the shared commitment to comprehensively upgrade Pakistan-Uzbekistan relations in all dimensions, the resolve to enhance bilateral trade and investment ties, the imperative to promote regional connectivity, and the desire to deepen cultural cooperation. In the regional context, the vital importance of peace and stability in Afghanistan was emphasized.

It was agreed to enhance bilateral consultations as well as coordination at the regional level. Later, the two leaders led their respective sides in delegation-level talks and reviewed the entire gamut of bilateral relations. They also exchanged views on key regional and international issues, including recent developments in Afghanistan. Both sides expressed satisfaction on the status of existing ties and cooperation at regional and international fora. The Prime Minister highlighted Pakistan's commitment to deepen Pakistan's engagement with Central Asia, with focus on strengthening trade, investment, energy, connectivity, defence and security, and people-to-people contacts. The Prime Minister recalled his earlier interactions with President Shavkat Mirziyoyev and noted the recent increase in high-level exchanges creating a strong momentum in the growth of bilateral relations.



The Prime Minister highlighted growing trade and transport links between the two countries and lauded the finalization of the Transit Trade Agreement (AUPTT). It was noted that bilateral trade had recently grown four-fold and had the potential to grow several fold through concerted efforts. The Prime Minister also highlighted that a large delegation of top Pakistani businessmen was visiting Uzbekistan and had held successful interaction with their counterparts. The Prime Minister expressed Pakistan's full commitment and support to Trans-Afghan railway project, which he stressed was of key importance in advancing the connectivity agenda.

The Prime Minister also underlined provision of sea access to Uzbekistan through Pakistani seaports. Speaking on situation in Afghanistan Prime Minister reiterated Pakistan's support to a peaceful and stable Afghanistan as it was important for security, economic benefits and development of Pakistan, neighboring countries and beyond. The Prime Minister highlighted Pakistan's steadfast support for Afghan peace process and efforts to promote a negotiated political settlement. In the cultural realm, the common cultural heritage was highlighted and promotion of Ziyarat tourism between Pakistan and Uzbekistan was endorsed.

It was also agreed to produce a joint film on the life of Mughal Emperor Zaheer-udin-Babar. The delegation level talks were followed by signing a Joint Declaration on establishment of Strategic Partnership and MoUs/ Agreements in wide range of areas. The landmark Transit Trade Agreement was also signed by Mr. Abdul Razak Dawood from the Pakistan side and Deputy Prime Minister for Trade and Investment of Uzbekistan. After the prestigious ceremony, the two leaders jointly addressed the joint media stakeout. On 16 July, the Prime Minister will participate in the opening ceremony of the International Conference "South Asia-Central Asia Regional Connectivity-Challenges and Opportunities". The Conference will see a gathering of leaders from South and Central Asia aimed at discussing ways and means to increase connectivity between the two regions.

Joint declaration

1. On the invitation of H.E. President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Mr. Shavkat Mirziyoyev H.E. Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Mr. Imran Khan, paid an official visit to the Republic of Uzbekistan on July 15-16, 2021. 2. The leaders of the two countries exchanged views on the current status of bilateral relations in all areas of mutual interest and agreed to further strengthen their multifaceted ties in political, trade and economic, energy, communication, science and technology, education and cultural spheres. The two leaders also exchanged views on issues of international and regional significance including the situation related to COVID-19 and agreed to build further cooperation in this regard.

3. Reaffirming their commitment to

strengthening fraternal ties, based on religious, cultural and historical commonalities, the leaders expressed satisfaction at the continued progress in bilateral relations and announced the establishment of a strategic partnership for mutual benefit of the two countries and nations. **4.** Noting that Pakistan was among the first countries to recognize the independence of the Republic of Uzbekistan in 1991, the leaders congratulated each other on approaching the 30th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between the two brotherly countries and agreed to celebrate it in a befitting manner.

5. The leaders agreed to expand multifaceted bilateral cooperation in all areas of mutual interest and stressed the importance of closer coordination based on coinciding positions in the international arena. To this end, the leaders decided to use the existing political and economic mechanisms between the two countries, including consultations between Ministries of Foreign Affairs.

6. The leaders expressed satisfaction with the growing pace of inter-parliamentary cooperation and agreed on the regular exchange of parliamentary delegations to further deepen bilateral ties.

7. The Pakistan side highly appreciated the results of the visit of the parliamentary delegation of the Republic of Uzbekistan to Islamabad in June 2021 to attend the 2nd meeting of ECO Parliamentary Assembly. The Uzbek side confirmed the invitation to the Chairman of the Senate of Pakistan Mr. S. Sanjrani to pay a visit to Uzbekistan.

8. The Prime Minister underlined the importance of structured engagement between Pakistan and Uzbekistan under the five pillars of Pakistan's "Vision Central Asia" policy i.e political, trade and investment, energy and connectivity, security and defence, and peopleto-people contacts.

9. The Prime Minister also outlined his vision of "Naya" Pakistan embedded in values of social justice, education for all, peace, prosperity and economic development of the people.

10. The leaders expressed satisfaction at the level of bilateral cooperation within the framework of international organizations and reaffirmed their commitment to continue supporting each other in the UN, SCO, OIC, ECO and other international and regional forums on issues of mutual interest.

11. As members of the UN Human Rights Council, the Parties expressed their readiness for joint action to suppress violations of human rights and counter Islamophobia, as well as strengthening interfaith harmony.

12. The PM emphasized on the urgent need for peaceful resolution of all outstanding regional disputes and conflicts to fully utilize the enormous potential of connectivity between



Central Asia and South Asia.

13. The two sides noted with satisfaction that over the 20 years of its activity, the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) has taken a significant place in international and regional organizations, and contributed in promoting security, stability and sustainable development of the region.

14. The importance of further strengthening cooperation at the SCO and multifaceted cooperation between the member states were emphasized. In this context, the parties agreed to collaborate and support in promoting the initiatives of the two countries aimed at deepening interaction within the SCO.

15. The leaders discussed the security situation in detail in Afghanistan and the ongoing peace process. The parties stressed the necessity to resolve the conflict through Afghan-led and Afghan-owned political process through peaceful and inclusive negotiations resulting in comprehensive political settlement.

16. President of Uzbekistan highly appreciated the role of Pakistan in promoting the peace

process in Afghanistan and Pakistan's contributions to socio-economic development of Afghanistan. Prime Minister of Pakistan hailed Uzbekistan's efforts for the socio-economic reconstruction of Afghanistan through the implementation of a number of significant projects, the main one of which is the construction of the Termez-Mazar-i-Sharif – Kabul – Peshawar railway.

17. Both leaders expressed their readiness to maintain a regular dialogue and build constructive cooperation in the field of security and defence. Expressing satisfaction with the level of cooperation between the Defence Ministries, the leaders agreed to continue cooperation in conducting joint military exercises and trainings, as well as in the field of vocational training and the exchange of professional expertise between the militaries of the two countries.

18. The parties expressed their readiness to expand cooperation between the law enforcement agencies of the two countries, in particular, in the fight against terrorism and drug trafficking.

19. The leaders agreed that trade and economic cooperation is a key priority for strengthening the partnership between the two countries.

20. Recognizing the enormous economic potential to further build up mutually beneficial relations, the parties agreed to increase the volume of bilateral trade through diversification of trade, expansion of business contacts, exchange of trade delegations and simplification of the visa regime.

21. The parties welcomed the signing of the Agreement on Transit Trade as an important tool for expanding bilateral trade.

22. Both leaders noted the importance of regular meetings of the Joint Uzbek-Pakistan Inter-Governmental Commission on Trade, Economic and Scientific and Technical cooperation.

23. The parties emphasized the role of the Joint Business Council between the two countries and agreed to establish direct business ties between Chambers of Commerce and Industry and the private sector. They also agreed to organize trade exhibitions and business forums on regular basis to promote bilateral trade.

24. The leaders recognized the necessity to create a more conducive environment for investors in the two countries, in particular, to encourage and facilitate joint investments, confirmed the existence of broad opportunities for cooperation in the fields of agriculture, pharmaceuticals, textile, leather and chemical industries, energy, and information technology and agreed to develop mutual cooperation in these sectors.

25. The parties highly appreciated the results of the Uzbekistan-Pakistan Trade, Investment and Connectivity Conference held on 15 July 2021 as instrumental in providing fresh impetus for



further development of trade, economic and investment ties between the two countries.

26. The leaders stressed the importance of regional integration and connectivity as a cornerstone of economic development and progress. In this regard, they welcomed the exchange of high-level visits in the areas of trade, railways, transport and aviation.

27. The two leaders reiterated their support for the Termez-Mazar-i-Sharif – Kabul – Peshawar railway project as an important initiative to create a rail link from Central Asia to the Arabian Sea through Afghanistan and the Pakistani seaports of Karachi, Gwadar and Bin Qasim.
28. The parties also welcomed the proposed expedition of representatives of the relevant ministries and departments of Uzbekistan and Pakistan along the route of the railway line in near future with appropriate security measures for the representatives of both sides.

29. The two leaders also recognized immense potential of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor for the benefit of the entire Central Asian region and beyond entailing greater connectivity and trade linkages through a network of transport, fiber optic cable, energy pipelines, and investment opportunities in its SEZs.

30. The two leaders welcomed the resumption of direct regular flights between Pakistan and Uzbekistan.

31. President Shavkat Mirziyoyev and Prime Minister Imran Khan noted long-standing cultural, historical, religious and spiritual ties between the two countries. The leaders decided to further expand cultural ties and people-to-people contacts and welcomed proposals to develop cooperation between leading universities, research institutes, libraries and museums of the two countries, as well as to conduct joint research on the legacy of the Baburids.

32. The President of Uzbekistan highly appreciated the opening of Centers for the Study of the heritage of Alisher Navoi and Zahiriddin Muhammad Babur at the Punjab and Peshawar Universities of Pakistan and welcomed the establishment of cooperation with the Alisher Navoi and Babur Foundations in Uzbekistan.

33. The leaders reaffirmed to establish

cooperation in the tourism sector, in particular, and recognized spiritual/Ziyarat tourism as a priority area of common interest.

34. Both leaders expressed support for the joint initiatives and collective efforts of the OIC to promote a tolerant and enlightened Islam, welcomed the declaration of March 15th as International Day to combat Islamophobia, and agreed to work towards the designation of this Day by the UN General Assembly.

35. The parties, having highly appreciated the beginning of cooperation in academic and cultural research, agreed to early commencement of the work on the compilation of an Islamic Encyclopedia by Uzbek and Pakistani researchers and experts. They expressed confidence that the publication of this fundamental work will be a great contribution of Uzbekistan and Pakistan to the promotion of modern Islamic civilization and interfaith understanding and harmony.

36. The parties welcomed the signing of a number of important MoUs/Agreements, which will serve to further strengthen the comprehensive cooperation between the two countries in diverse areas.

37. The leaders expressed their conviction that the agreements reached during the visit will contribute to the further deepening of the bilateral strategic partnership and development of cooperation within the framework of multilateral formats. They agreed to continue high-level political dialogue in the future. **38.** President of Uzbekistan Mr. Shavkat Mirziyoyev thanked Prime Minister Imran Khan for participation in the International High-Level Conference "Central and South Asia: Regional Connectivity - Challenges and Opportunities (July 15-16 2021, Tashkent)." **39.** The Prime Minister expressed gratitude to the Uzbek side for the cordial and warm welcome extended to the Pakistan delegation in Uzbekistan and invited the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Mr. Shavkat Mirziyoyev to visit Pakistan at a convenient time. Uzbek side accepted the invitation with appreciation. The dates of the visit will be agreed through diplomatic channels.

40. This declaration was signed on July 15, 2021, in Tashkent in duplicate in Uzbek and English.



President urges Islamic countries to work together to change the perceptions of the world regarding Islamophobia

President Dr Arif Alvi has urged the Islamic countries to work together to change the perceptions of the world with regard to Islamophobia. He stated that Islamic countries were facing the challenges of terrorism and Islamophobia which could be overcome through close cooperation among them.

He made these remarks while talking to the visiting President of the Arab Parliament, Mr Adel bin Abdul Rahman Al-Asoomi, who called on him, at Aiwan-e-Sadr. Chairman Senate, Mr Muhammad Sadiq Sanjrani was also present during the meeting.

Talking to the President of the Arab Parliament, the President informed that the people of Pakistan had a natural affinity with the people of Arab countries, due to our shared bonds of common faith and culture. He said that Pakistan attached great importance to its ties with the Middle Eastern countries and wanted to further strengthen relations with countries of the region in all areas of mutual interest.

He added that Pakistan's policy had shifted from Geo-politics to Geo-economics that focused on regional connectivity; development partnerships and socio-economic uplift, and peace within the region. The President highlighted that Pakistan was making efforts to promote peace in the region, particularly in Afghanistan. He also briefed the visiting dignitary about the measures taken by Pakistan against the COVID-19 pandemic.

The President apprised Mr Adel bin Abdul Rahman Al-Asoomi about the apartheid policies of the Modi-led BJP Government in the Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK), saying that India was involved in the ethnic cleansing of Muslims of IIOJK by changing the demography of Kashmir and reducing the Muslim population through the Citizenship Act.



He reiterated Pakistan's support to the just cause of Palestinians and called for the establishment of a viable, independent and contiguous state of Palestine on the basis of internationally accepted parameters, with pre-1967 borders, and Al-Quds Al-Sharif as its capital.

The President of the Arab Parliament said that Pakistan was an important country for the Arab world which had played a historical role in supporting the cause of Islamic Ummah. He underlined the need to work closely by the Islamic world to meet the challenges being faced by the Islamic countries.

He also emphasized the need for exchanging delegations to further cement ties between Pakistan and the Arab world. He said that the Arab Parliament supported Pakistan's stance on IIOJK. He also thanked the Government of Pakistan for the warm welcome and hospitality extended to him during his stay in Pakistan. The President of the Arab Parliament, Mr. Adel Abdul Rahman Al Asoomi, along with a delegation, called on Foreign Minister Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi. This is the first ever visit of a delegation from the Arab Parliament.

The Foreign Minister extended a warm welcome to the visiting delegation and exchanged views on key issues related to the Muslim Ummah. He added that the shared bonds of faith, culture and common aspirations generated natural affinity between the peoples of Pakistan and the Arab world. The Foreign Minister apprised the delegation about the serious human rights situation in the Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK).

He stressed the importance of peaceful resolution of the Jammu & Kashmir dispute in accordance with the UN Security Council resolutions and the wishes of the Kashmiri people. Foreign Minister Qureshi also reaffirmed Pakistan's principled position on Palestinian issue, stressing the need for a solution as per UN & OIC resolutions. The Foreign Minister further stressed the importance of peace and stability in the Middle East for Pakistan. The President of the Arab Parliament thanked the Foreign Minister for receiving the delegation. Mr. Abdel Abdul Rahman Al Asoomi appreciated the role Pakistan has played for the Muslim causes.

He also stressed the need for establishing more parliamentary linkages for better understanding of the issues. During the meeting, the two sides underscored the need for a collective approach by the Muslim Ummah to help resolve political, social and other issues confronting the Muslim world.

oreign Minister, Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi, met with his Kazakh counterpart Mukhtar Tileuberdi on the margins of the SCO Council of Foreign Ministers meeting in Dushanbe. During the meeting, the two Foreign Ministers reviewd entire gamut of bilateral relations. Foreign Minister Qureshi emphasised regular convening of various institutional mechanisms to tap true potential of bilateral ties. He also highlighted importance of working together on regional connectivity projects which would give a boost to bilateral as well as regional trade. The two Foreign Ministers exchanged views on ways and means to enhance bilateral ties as well as discussed the regional situation. Foreign Minister Qureshi reaffirmed Pakistan's consistent support to a peaceful and united Afghanistan, at peace with itself and with its neighbours.

In view of the withdrawal of international forces from Afghanistan, the Foreign Minister urged the Afghan leaders to achieve a negotiated political settlement at the earliest, adding that such an outcome would bring peace, stability and prosperity in Afghanistan.

Foreign Minister Qureshi remarked that Afghan leaders should seize the historic opportunity and take advantage of international convergence on the final settlement of the Afghan conflict by working together an inclusive, broad-based and comprehensive

PM Imran Khan Talks to Delegation of Pak-Afghan Youth Forum in Islamabad

Prime Minister Imran Khan says Pakistan wanted peace in Afghanistan more than any other country in the world as peace in the region will give Islamabad an access to the central Asian Republics.

The Prime Minister while talking to a delegation of Pak-Afghan youth forum said they have already signed an agreement with Uzbekistan for a railway line from Mazar Sharif to Peshawar, which will reach Pakistan via Afghanistan.

The meeting was aimed at presenting the government's view in response to the questions raised by the members of Pak



Afghan Youth Forum about Pakistan-Afghanistan Relations, Pakistan's efforts for sustainable peace in Afghanistan as well as the overall situation in the region.

The Prime Minister said that all the future economic policies of Pakistan depended on peace in Afghanistan.

He, however, added that recent statements from afghan leaders blaming Pakistan for afghan crisis was unfortunate because it was Pakistan which strived hard to convince Taliban first for talks with the united states and then with afghan government. To another question, the prime minister said unfortunately there was a misconception in Afghanistan, which was based on Indian Propaganda, that Pakistan was controlled by military institutions.

Imran Khan said that his foreign policy was based on his party's 25 years of manifesto, adding, he had a consistent view that there was no military solution of the afghan conflict, which could only be resolved through political means.

In reply to a question, he said India through its unilateral august 5, 2019 action violated the United Nations resolutions and changed the status of Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir.


Frequent high-level visits were a key feature of the relationship that served to further deepen and broaden the relationship in myriad dimensions.

He also expressed appreciation for the role and contribution of the Pakistani expatriate community towards progress and economic development of Bahrain. **Bilateral** Relations





Qatar Affirms Determination to Continue Working as Effective International Partner to Prevent Scourge of Terrorism

The State of Qatar reiterated condemnation of terrorism in all its forms and manifestations, wherever it is committed, and whatever its justifications may be, affirming its determination to continue working as an effective international partner to prevent the heinous scourge of terrorism.

This came in a pre-recorded speech delivered by HE Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al-Thani at the opening session of the Second United Nations High-level Conference of Heads of Counter-Terrorism Agencies of Member States, as part of the United Nations Counter-Terrorism Week.

HE the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs said, "Preventing and countering terrorism are areas that require the highest degree of international coordination and cooperation. In that regard, the United Nations plays a central role in revitalizing multilateral cooperation, as represented by convening this high-level conference. We look forward to this conference contribution in building on and developing the outcome of the First Conference in 2018 and the Virtual Week of last year."

"To ensure the effectiveness of our joint efforts to counter terrorism and violent extremism, we must work on addressing the root causes of terrorism and to support programs and activities in integrated areas such as education, youth employment and countering extremist discourse. Nevertheless, such steps are not enough as the terrorist threat is a complex and evolving threat, and terrorists continue to exploit technological tools and international and emerging conditions, such as the coronavirus pandemic, to further their activities and attacks," he added.

HE Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al-Thani noted, "In this context, the State of Qatar took the initiative and inaugurated in last December the International Hub on Behavioral Insights to Counter Terrorism as a program office of the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT) in Doha, funded by the State of Qatar. We look forward to the International Hub becoming a resource center at the international level and to contribute to the collection and exchange of experiences and research."

HE the Minister of Foreign Affairs added, "I would also like to note the opening this month in Doha of the United Nations Program Office on Parliamentary Engagement in Preventing and Countering Terrorism, which will contribute to the development of legislative models on the rights of victims of right-wing extremism and to activating the role of parliaments in countering terrorism and extremism."

"Work is also being done in the State of Qatar to harness the field of sports to counter terrorism through the International Center for Sport Security," he explained.

HE the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs underlined, "The State of Qatar is committed to the integrated implementation of the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy through its four pillars, as well as the relevant international instruments and Security Council resolutions."

His Excellency pointed out, "The State of Qatar has updated its national legislation and regulations related to counterterrorism, anti-money laundering and countering the financing of terrorism, and prepared a national strategy in this regard. The State of Qatar also actively participates in international mechanisms for coordinating efforts to counter terrorism and its financing, in addition to cooperation between national entities and committees in the State of Qatar and relevant agencies from friendly countries. The State of Qatar also maintains continuous cooperation and communication with many relevant United Nations bodies, especially the Counterterrorism Executive Directorate and the UNOCT."

"In this regard, we commend the central leadership and ongoing diligent efforts by the UN-OCT to strengthen its field presence which ensures impactful and effective implementation of programs," he continued.

HE the Foreign Minister added, "We affirm the State of Qatar's commitment to its partnership with the UNOCT, as a major contributor and a partner in implementing pioneering projects that would achieve tangible results, such as the Global Program on Countering Terrorist Threats against Vulnerable Targets, the Countering Terrorist Travel Program and the First Annual Forum for Beneficiaries of Technical Assistance which will be convened jointly with UNOCT in Doha in October."

HE the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs concluded, "I would like also to express the appreciation of the State of Qatar for the tireless efforts and unremitting endeavours made in preparation for the conference and other activities of the Second United Nations Counter-Terrorism Week. Pakistan and Hungary hold the 5th Round of Bilateral Political Consultations (BPC)

The 5th round of Pakistan-Hungary Bilateral Political Consultations (BPC) was held in Budapest today. The Pakistan side was led by Dr. Muhammad Tariq, Additional Secretary (Europe); while Laszlo Varadi, Deputy Secretary for State Cooperation with South led the Hungarian side. Mr. Muhemmed Aejaz, Ambassador of Pakistan to Hungary, also attended the meeting.

The exchange of views covered the entire spectrum of bilateral relations, including matters relating to political, economic and trade, culture, defence and people-to-people contacts. The two sides also reviewed recent developments in bilateral relations and explored the way forward to enhance cooperation in diverse fields. A review of regional and international issues of mutual interest such as the situation in Afghanistan and IIOJK was part of the parleys.

Both sides expressed satisfaction at the current pace of cooperation after the Hungary-Pakistan Trade and Economic Window (HPTEW) launched in March 2021, and the first Hungary-Pakistan Business Forum inaugurated by the two Foreign Ministers, as well as the subsequent visit of Foreign Minister Peter Szijjártó to Pakistan in April 2021. Both sides expressed the desire to further strengthen cooperation in economic and trade, investment, industry, agriculture, water resource management, information technology, energy, industry, healthcare and pharmaceutical, sports, culture, education and parliamentary exchanges. Dr. Tarig emphasized the importance of regular high-level exchanges in boosting linkages in areas of mutual interest. The Additional Secretary also highlighted the steps taken by the Government of Pakistan to attract international tourism and bring foreign investment into Pakistan.

The Additional Secretary briefed the Hungarian side on Pakistan's positive role in facilitating the peace efforts with the aim of promoting an inclusive, broad-based and comprehensive political settlement in Afghanistan through an Afghan-owned and Afghan-led process. The Additional Secretary also apprised the Hungarian side about the grave human rights violations being committed by India in IIOJK, underlined that India had vitiated the atmosphere by taking the illegal and unilateral step of 5 August 2019, and stressed that the onus was on India to create an enabling environment for engagement and result-oriented dialogue.

5th Round of Bilateral Political Consultations between Pakistan-Belarus

The 5th round of Pakistan - Belarus Bilateral Political Consultations (BPC) was held today at Minsk. The Pakistan side was led by Dr. Muhammad Tariq, Additional Foreign Secretary (Europe) while Mr. Nikolai Boresivich, Deputy Foreign Minister led the Belarus side. Ambassador of Pakistan, Sajjad Haider Khan and Ambassador of Belarus in Islamabad also attended the meeting.

Talks between the two sides were focused on the whole range of bilateral relations as well as regional and international issues of mutual interest. The Additional Secretary thanked the Belarus side for receiving him despite the COVID-19 pandemic. The Additional Secretary stressed the importance of solution of the Jammu and Kashmir issue in accordance with the relevant UN resolutions.

Pakistan and Belarus enjoy cordial relations based on commonality of views on issues of regional and global importance. The two coun-



tries have been closely collaborating at international fora, especially at the UN. Consultations ended with both sides agreeing to hold the next round on mutually convenient dates in Islamabad.

The two sides exchanged views on bilateral strategic, economic and security cooperation, COVID-19 pandemic, peace and reconciliation in Afghanistan and international and regional issues of mutual interest, and reached consensus to collectively take measures to safeguard their common interests and promote peace, prosperity and development in the region.

Both sides recalled that the enduring Pakistan-China friendship has reached the momentous milestone of the 70th anniversary of establishment of diplomatic relations, being enthusiastically marked in the two countries with holding of more than hundred celebratory events throughout this year, demonstrating warmth and deep sentiments of their unshakable fraternal bonds. In further strengthening their All-Weather Strategic Cooperative Partnership and together charting course for the Pakistan-China Community of Shared Future in the New Era, both sides are committed to firmly implementing the consensus reached between their leaders, enhance mutual strategic trust, strengthen all-round cooperation, maintain momentum of high-level exchanges, further advance Belt and Road partnership, promote bilateral relationship to a

higher level, and delivering greater benefits to both countries and the two peoples.

Extending felicitations to the Chinese side on the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Communist Party of China, the Pakistani side recognized CPC's immense contributions for the Chinese people, for China's stellar rise at the world stage, and its unrivalled achievement of lifting 800 million people out of poverty. The Pakistan side wished the Chinese government and people greater success in achieving the goal of socialist modernization in 2035 and building a modern, prosperous, beautiful, democratic, culturally advanced and harmonious socialist country in 2049, under the inspiring and visionary leadership of the CPC, with Comrade Xi Jinping at its core.

Both sides reviewed with satisfaction their close cooperation in successfully controlling the spread of COVID-19, cooperation in protective and medical equipment, vaccine development and ensuring early post-pandemic economic recovery. We hope that the WHO can, together with international community, defend the scientific and serious study of origins of the SARS-CoV-2 and oppose the actions to politicize the issue, and safeguard the favorable atmosphere for global cooperation against the Covid-19 pandemic.

Offering condolences on the loss of precious lives caused by torrential rains and flooding in Henan province, the Pakistan side expressed hope that with strenuous efforts of the Chinese government, normalcy would be restored soon and affected people would return to their homes.

Both sides vehemently condemned the terrorist attack in Dasu which caused loss of precious lives and injuries to the Pakistani and Chinese workers. The Pakistan side conveyed its profound condolences and sympathies to the bereaved families, emphasized that the sacrifices of Chinese nationals would not be in vain, and that China-Pakistan partnership would emerge stronger through this test. The Pakistan side promised to ensure medical treatment, care and comfort of the injured. Both sides expressed their firm resolve to expose the culprits and their reprehensible designs through the ongoing joint investigation, give exemplary punishment to the perpetrators, ensure comprehensive safety and security of the Chinese projects, nationals and institutions, and prevent recurrence of such incidents.

Both sides agreed on continuing their unvielding support on issues concerning each other's core national interests. The Chinese side reiterated its firm support to Pakistan in safeguarding its territorial integrity, sovereignty and independence, independently choosing a development path based on its national conditions, striving for a better external security environment and playing a more constructive role on international and regional affairs. The Pakistan side reiterated its commitment to the "One China Policy" and firm support to China on core issues of its national interest, such as Taiwan, Xinjiang, Tibet, Hong Kong and South China Sea. 


